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### INTERVIEW: WHAT'S NEXT FOR CHINA'S LUXURY WATCH MARKET

As the Chinese government's anti-corruption crackdown shows no signs of relenting, Swiss watch exports to China have taken a major hit since it began. That doesn't mean the China market is any less important to watchmakers than it was before, however. That's why this October, Beijing will be one of the tour stops of the famous Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève luxury watch competition. From October 8 to 10, Chinese watch enthusiasts will be able to check out an exhibit in the Chinese capital city featuring the contest's entries, which include pieces by top global watchmakers such as Chopard, Blancpain, and Jaquet Droz. Winners will be announced on October 31.

In order to learn more about the importance of the China market to the watch brands in the competition, we talked to jury member and the editorial director for watches at *Hong Kong Tatler* Sean Li. An avid watch collector, Li is also the chief editor of the quarterly Hong Kong-based *Revolution*, which is considered by some to be the best watch magazine in the world. In the interview below, Li shares his thoughts on what he's looking for in the competition, the top China watch trends, and how watch companies can make it through the current China sales slump.

#### What are you looking for in a winning watch at this competition?

I look first of all whether the watch is entered in the correct category, whether it fits well within the specific criteria, and if it stands out amongst the other watches that are competing. For me, it doesn't have to necessarily be ground-breaking, but rather a watch that's well executed, a watch that's sets a benchmark as a complete timepiece. It has to be a watch that's aspirational, that can be cited as a prime example of a specific kind of timepiece.

#### What kinds of watch characteristics are popular with Chinese buyers?

Classicism, history, and value. Chinese buyers are not necessarily in search of the highly complicated watches, and some functions are not at all appreciated, for example chronographs, although the very classical tourbillon is well appreciated. My impression is that they want something genuinely Swiss, and are not in search of watches that were "designed for China." Authenticity is very important.

#### Which watch brands are the most popular in China right now? Are certain brands more popular in Hong Kong than on the mainland?

Without citing specific brands, I'd say that it's the ones that have been established in China for a long time, those that entered the market well before China became such a focal point for the watch industry. The brand preferences between Hong Kong and the mainland are defined by the customer; you must bear in mind that a lot of people who are buying in Hong Kong are from the mainland, and the fact that they're in Hong Kong doesn't change their preferences. Local Hong Kong buyers are more open to younger brands, and to more unusual designs and materials.

#### The Chinese government's anti-corruption campaign has caused luxury watch sales to slow in China. What can brands do to win consumers and keep growth rates up?

Beyond the Chinese policies at the moment, I don't think that the recent growth rates were sustainable over the medium to long term. China's watch market has matured considerably, and the local buyers are much more knowledgeable than just four to five years ago, not only in terms of the watches themselves, but also in regards to their personal preferences. What has happened though, and not just in China, is that the brands have focused more on the mid to low range in prices in their new collections. Keeping growth going will be a question of expanding the market base, and getting the attention from more potential customers, rather than trying to sell more complicated and expensive pieces to existing clients.

#### Do you think Chinese watch brands will ever catch up to Swiss watches in terms of popularity?

Chinese brands need to establish their own niche outside of their country before we can analyze what their long-term prospects are. There is a very particular mindset that's required to design and produce watches, amplified as you approach high-end/luxury watchmaking, which is not easy, if not impossible to export. You have to bear in mind that it's an industry that makes the Swiss watches, and that brands cannot stand on their own, as they rely on several suppliers. Some may rely in international suppliers too, but the mindset and knowledge is very much centered on Switzerland.

**2014日内瓦高级钟表大赏之“最佳万年历腕表”奖项首轮入围表款(Calendar Cathegory)**



### 真力时指挥官系列温莎年历腕表售价：65,400RMB

指挥官系列温莎年历腕表搭载制表复杂功能，该款腕表可以显示星期、日期和月份，一年只需调校一次即可。3点钟位置设星期和月份窗口，而日期显示窗口设置在了6点钟位置。年历由三个同心圆盘显示，以获得最佳的读取效果。外圈圆盘显示日期，中间圆盘显示月份，内圈圆盘则显示星期。该机械装置既简单又复杂：在天数为31天的月份时，日期盘推动月份盘前进；在天数为30天的月份时，月份盘则直接跳过数字31。只有在二月和三月交会之际才需要手动调校。该款腕表搭载ElPrimero星速4054自动机芯，饰以日内瓦波纹和珍珠打磨饰纹，透过蓝宝石水晶表底，机芯内部一览无遗。

### 2014日内瓦高级钟表大赏之“最佳计时码表”奖项首轮入围表款(Chronograph Cathegory)



真力时旗舰系列410腕表售价：66,100 RMB

真力时旗舰系列410腕表搭载了品牌在1969年首批诞生的El Primero星速全日历计时码机芯，在重现经典风情的同时，还装备了罕见的复杂功能。它不仅具备全世界最精准的自动计时码表计时功能，还独树一帜地添加了全日历及月相显示。该款机芯由390个零件组成，配备31颗宝石，具有36000VPH高振频。这款于今年推出的限量腕表搭配银色的表盘，高度还原历史表款的功能布局设计，每个细节都洋溢着浓厚的七十年代风情，42毫米精钢表壳呈流畅的圆弧形，抛光与磨砂细节设计则完美结合则彰显前卫特色，纯蓝色秒针尾部还点缀一颗真力时之星，是品牌尊贵品质和精密计时工艺



真力时旗舰系列超轻量腕表售价：122,500 RMB

真力时结合革新科技和大胆创意，致力于打造前所未见的轻量腕表。该款腕表以钛金属打造机芯主要组件，硅质制作计时腕表双齿轮。增大至45毫米的表壳却可在手腕上展现无与伦比的轻盈度。真力时选择以碳作为表壳材质，其美丽黑色光芒和方格设计让人想起赛车，此一新颖材质不但符合品牌在重量上的要求，也赋予表款高科技外观和运动精神。表壳的内在结构则大胆使用陶瓷铝，这个尖端科技材质不仅重量轻盈，还具有傲视群伦的强度和硬度。真力时作为Spindrift racing船队官方时计，特别推出此枚腕表Spindrift racing特别版，背面镌刻“Spindrift Racing”字样，限量发行250枚。

**2014日内瓦高级钟表大赏之“小指针”奖项首轮入围表款(Petite Aiguille Category)**




真力时旗舰系列动悉腕表售价：44,500RMB

真力时旗舰系列动悉腕表凝聚了品牌的的核心精华，搭载的El Primero星速4613型自动上链机芯，每小时可达到36000次的高振频，机芯严丝密合、造型精致、精准可靠：每个夹板、结构和零件的位置都经过了仔细研究，以优化其性能。形似祥云的开心设计将El Primero星速机芯的硅质擒纵叉和擒纵齿轮的相互作用尽览眼下，更绝妙的是擒纵棘轮上采用了代表真力时标志的星形设计。表壳直径40毫米，采用玫瑰金或精钢材质，银色表盘上的开心设计能以与众不同的方式，亲眼观察到El Primero星速4613型自动上链机芯擒纵机构的独特律动。这款腕表不仅有着与众不同的造型外观，它坚固可靠的表壳还搭载旋入式表冠，拥有100米的防水深度。表带完美嵌入表壳之中，更加符合人体工学。

[腕表之家 品牌新闻] 2014年10月10日，一年一度素有钟表界“奥斯卡大奖”之美誉的日内瓦高级钟表大赏（GPHG，Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève）在北京举行，GPHG一年一度的大奖角逐面对所有品牌开放，涉及本年度推出的数百款钟表，为获奖者颁发钟表界认可度最高的荣誉。

首先是日内瓦高级钟表大赏（GPHG）的新闻发布会，GPHG主席、瑞士驻华大使以


及集团贵宾、品牌贵宾和收藏家一同出席此次研讨会。

紧接着，展览开始了。不同奖项的腕表被陈列在造型独特的橱窗之中，每个橱窗侧面有类别标注，包括女士腕表、陀飞轮腕表、计时码表、日历腕表等等。参观者饶有趣味地拍摄，并相互交流。



Blancpain宝珀入围的三款腕表，首先是宝珀的陀飞轮腕表，这款表具有温文尔雅的外型，白色的珐琅盘柔和而高贵，古罗马数字刻度具有复古感。虽然腕表低调但内部却动力十足，它拥有12日的长动力储备，配备单发条盒。



第二款女表在橱窗中格外引人瞩目。表盘上方为偏心的时分计时，与三十秒逆跳交相辉映。最值得一提，是这璀璨炫目的钻石镶嵌，不规则大小钻石镶嵌闪烁着耀眼的光芒，像一条水波一样荡漾，令无数女士倾心。



宝珀五十噚系列深潜器飞返计时表，具有陶瓷表壳，外型极具运动感，深度酷爱运动的男士喜爱。腕表搭载自动机芯，具有飞返计时和日期显示功能，防水深度300米。





最后，参观的进一步进行，晚上的鸡尾酒会开始了，品牌为大家精心准备了香槟、果汁和各种糕点，让大家尽情享受这场钟表的盛宴。



## 精美绝伦！2014日内瓦高级钟表大赏获奖腕表

素有“钟表界奥斯卡”之称，且最具公信力的日内瓦高级钟表大赏（GPHG，Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève）于10月31日在日内瓦大剧院举办第14届颁奖典礼。评审团由24位来自全球的钟表专家、新闻记者、零售商、收藏家等人士所组成，其中这次的评审团主席为佳士得钟表部前国际总监奥瑞尔·巴克斯（Aurel Bacs）。

今年的日内瓦高级钟表大赏共有12大奖项与评审团特别奖，初选时由评审团在各类别先筛选出6只腕表进入决选，舵手君精选版得奖名单如下：

最佳女装腕表  
宝珀-WOMEN OFF-CENTRED HOUR腕表



宝珀WOMEN OFF-CENTRED HOUR腕表以将优雅与功能相结合而闻名。这款女士腕表以玫瑰金为材质的表圈上镶嵌着总重约1克拉的108颗钻石，珍珠母贝打造的表盘上心表盘配置的比例、数字时标的尺寸变化、划分两表盘的弧线，给人以视觉平衡的感觉，并将弧线的流畅之美体现的淋漓尽致。

表壳材质：玫瑰金；表带材质：真皮；表扣：搭扣；防水深度：30米；表径：ø36.8毫米；表壳厚度：10.3毫米；机芯类型：自动机械动力储备：72小时；振幅：28800次/小时；编号：3650A-3754-58B；上市时间：2014；所属系列：Women；报价：30800瑞郎。

Margot是christophe claret创作的首款女士复杂腕表。它的特点在于通过一个巧妙的机制，来帮助‘预测’，或者至少可以说是尝试回答大自然中最被关切的问题之一：“他爱我吗？”简单地按下2点钟位置的按钮，便给腕表注入了生命。每按一次，一片花瓣，有

时不可预见地是一对花瓣，就会在流畅的节奏下巧妙地消失在表盘上，完美地示出花瓣退去的细腻。接下来，期盼已久的答案会在表盘上4点钟的位置以法文的书写体形式随机地出现：Un peu（一点点），beaucoup（很多），passionnément（热情地），à la folie（疯狂地），pas du tout（完全不）？：每次按下按钮之后，腕表会发出独特而清亮的音簧共鸣，这种听觉上带来的信号引导着游戏的节奏。

Voutilainen 28 Hisui腕表内部的机芯因为马赛克艺术的装饰而看起来更加惊艳。它的魅力在每一处的细节之中，如果有什么东西值得我花费超过100万人民币去购买的话，这款表绝对属于其中之一。它的内部机芯Voutilainen Cal.28-80是一款手动上链机芯，采用品牌Voutilainen独特的双擒纵轮系统，平衡摆轮的振频达到18,000转/小时。该机芯虽然比较简单，但它确实是一件钟表艺术作品，是品牌Voutilainen的代表之作。



奖项：「Aiguille d'Or」年度大奖

获奖时计：Breguet 宝玑「Classique Chronométrie 7727」，高振频是 Breguet 近年来投入最大的技术挑战之一，这枚7727振频达 10Hz，具有出色的精准度，动力存储长达 60小时。1点位置特别设置一枚以1/10秒步进的硅质小表针，在放大镜下可以观察到 Breguet 高振频的惊人机械造诣。



### 奖项：「Ladies」女士腕表

获奖时计：Blancpain 宝珀「Women Off-Centred Hour」，偏心对称的弧形设计温婉动人，珍珠母贝+钻石点缀，充满女人味。



### 奖项：「Ladies' High Mech」高级复杂女士腕表

获奖时计：Christophe Claret 「Margot」，这是 Christophe Claret 第一枚女表，却设计得如同 Van Cleef & Arpels 一般明媚。表盘中心的复杂结构「He Loves Me」采用雏菊花（Daisy Flower）图案，模仿女子摘一朵雏菊花，通过数花瓣的方式来猜意中人的心思。黄色宝石为黄水晶，时标则为3枚梨型切割钻石。在珍珠母贝的表盘上，隐约刻着法文「il m'aime/il ne m'aime」（爱我/不爱我）。



奖项：「Men's」男士腕表

获奖时计：Urban Jürgensen & Sonner 「Central Second」，采用 UJS-P8 荚爪擒纵结构，设计古典优雅的一枚男表。



奖项：「Chronograph」计时码表

获奖时计：De Bethune 「DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon」，这是一枚单按钮的复杂计

时码表，首先表盘布局就是独特亮点——计时码表的秒、60分、24小时盘位于表盘外缘和内刻度，与时分盘融为一体。翻开表底盖可以欣赏到与计时码表结构与陀飞轮结构，这枚腕表的计时码表结构采用了3个独立的导轮柱，在计时时也不会影响到陀飞轮运转。



奖项：「Turbillon」陀飞轮表

获奖时计：Grönefeld Parallax Tourbillon，我们刚刚介绍过这枚陀飞轮，最大技术突破无疑是陀飞轮具有 Hack（停秒）功能。



### 奖项：「Calendar」日历表

获奖时计：A. Lange & Söhne 「Richard Lange Perpetual Calendar "Terraluna"」，整时器布局，万年历，天体轨道月相图，这是朗格今年最复杂的一枚，表背才是精妙之处。



### 奖项：「Striking」最佳报时表

获奖时计：Hublot 宇舶「Classic Fusion Cathedral Tourbillon Minute Repeater」，Hublot 第二枚三问陀飞轮，透过蓝宝石表镜可以欣赏到陀飞轮运行和三问音锤等结构，三问滑杆在表盘左侧9点，向上拉动开启。我们在 Baselworld 嘈杂的现场都可以

非常清晰听到响亮动听的报时声。45mm直径，表壳可选王金或钛金属，HUB8001 手动上链机芯，长达5日动力存储也是三问表少见的规格。



**奖项：「Mechanical Exception」机械创新奖**

获奖时计：Urwerk 「EMC」，这枚全称为“Electro Mechanical Control”的腕表提出了一个全新的理念：让使用者拥有控制计时机械精确度的能力。设计者增加了一个光

学感应和处理器，通过这一装置监测机械机芯的运转状况，并在表盘左上角位置指示当前的走时准确度，范围在每天±20秒。



### 奖项：「Petit Aiguille」小表针奖

获奖时计：Seiko Grand 「Seiko Hi-Beat 36000 GMT」，第一次在9S86高频机芯上增加了GMT两地时，并且配搭钢带。两地时适合跨时区出差，钢带更适合外出佩戴，所以这枚是GS近年来最具有实用性的款式。

表盘采用模仿山脊轮廓的放射状饰纹，增加24小时刻度，通过一根独立GMT时针来呈现第二时区。



### 奖项：「Sports」最佳运动表

获奖时计：Zenith 「El Primero Lightweight」，这是 El Primero 系列第一枚采用碳纤

维表壳的版本。表壳外的碳纤维方形图案为这枚计时码表增加了更强烈的运动感，表壳内部结构则是由轻而坚固的陶瓷铝制造。整只表的重量只有40g。

功能方面依然延续 El Primero 系列最大的特色——计时码表精度可以达到十分之一秒，红色计时针每6秒转动一圈。



奖项：「Jewellery」最佳珠宝表

获奖时计：Bulgari 「Diva High Jewellery Emeralds」，祖母绿由于晶体较脆，是镶嵌难度最高的名贵宝石，很少用于大面积的铺镶设计，这枚 Diva 高级珠宝表无疑是今年最让珠宝迷青睐的一枚。



#### 奖项：「Artistic Crafts」艺术工艺奖

获奖时计：Voutilainen 「Hisui」，由日本漆艺大师 Kitamura Tatsuo 为 Kari Voutilainen 特别完成表盘和机芯的翡翠、金箔镶嵌装饰，每一枚均需要耗时超过数千

小时。



#### 奖项：「Revival」最佳复兴奖

获奖时计：Omega 「Speedmaster Dark Side of the Moon」，这是今年最让人心动的一枚黑色腕表。除了向人类登月历史致敬，最核心的还是 Omega 已完全成熟的同轴机芯技术，Cal. 9300机芯直接嵌入陶瓷表壳内，透过蓝宝石水晶表镜可以欣赏到计时码表的完整运作。



#### 奖项：「Public Prize」公众选择奖

获奖时计：Breguet 宝玑「Classique Dame 9068」，表圈镶嵌99颗明亮切割钻石，大三针布局，搭载具有硅质擒纵的 Cal.591A 机芯，无论设计还是制表工艺上都是最平衡的一枚女表。

鐘錶界年度最重要盛事——日內瓦高級鐘錶大賞（The Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève - GPHG）結果揭曉。朗格先生Walter Lange獲頒「評審團大獎」，表彰他成功復興品牌的成就，以及對鐘錶的貢獻。

頒獎典禮的日內瓦高級鐘錶大賞，由Edipresse集團，瑞士日內瓦市於2001年創辦，三個單位包括位於舊城的International Museum of Horology (IMH)以及Geneva Laboratory of Horology and Micro engineering等官方與半官方機構，被譽為瑞士鐘錶業最高盛名、最具權威性和影響力的表徵最高榮譽。有鐘錶界「奧斯卡」美稱。

今年所舉辦的第14屆日內瓦高級鐘錶大賞，由掛士得鐘錶行政總裁馬理算·巴克斯（Aurel Bacs）擔任評審團主席，選出15大獎項與「評審團特別獎」，並開放網上投票選出「人氣腕錶獎」。多年來參賽的Swatch集團，今年再度參與角逐，實境有四只腕入圍正式競賽。最後以Breguet Classique Chronométrie腕錶拿下最大獎「金頂針獎」。

BREGUET CLASSIQUE DAME女錶也拿下最佳「人氣腕錶獎」。Swatch集團內另一百年老牌寶珀，也以Blancpain Women Off-centred Hour領



在去年，朗格與Breguet Classique Chronometrie腕錶，連續分別獲得GPHG最佳「人氣腕錶獎」。這兩款腕錶都採用「追針」設計，即計時碼錶所使用的複雜功能，可以同時顯示分鐘和小時。這款腕錶由A. Lange & Söhne的製表師親手打造，平均動力儲存為50小時，具備三地時間（UTC+/-1小時）與世界時間（WGT）功能，並可顯示月相與太陽位置。此款腕錶搭載L093.1自動上鍊機芯，內置一個陀螺儀，並利用陀螺儀的慣性原理來校正時間，以避免萬象引力，因此能確保時間「追針」的準確度。在表面方面，外圈刻有數字和分鐘標記，以銀色漆面漆佈。

與「金頂針獎」齊名的「最佳男裝腕錶」獎，則由GPHG評委朗格先生Walter Lange，所製的這枚腕錶的奪得，並受到評審團的青睞。



這枚腕錶，由名為RICHARD LANGE Tercentenary的腕錶製成，彰顯了朗格以慶祝科爾貝特的三位數年華為題材，推出的一系列腕錶。此款腕錶採用陀螺儀，並通過內部強大的機械結構——陀螺儀和齒輪，以正確地顯示時間。這款腕錶的圓錐形表殼，並標有獨立的標記，並附帶黑色皮質錶帶。此款腕錶採用L093.1自動上鍊機芯，並具125小時動力儲存。此款腕錶的表盤上印有「TERCENTENARY」和「LANGE」。

此款腕錶的表殼，由18K白金或紅金製成，並採用PVD鍍層。A. Lange & Söhne的這款腕錶，已經在該年份分得頭獎。這款腕錶，2013年10月13日在發售，價格約為15萬歐元。這款腕錶的圓錐形表殼，並標有獨立的標記，並附帶黑色皮質錶帶。此款腕錶採用L093.1自動上鍊機芯，並具125小時動力儲存。

Blancpain celebrates its win of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève in the Ladies' category WORDS KAREN PONG

**C**reated in 2000, the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) annually honours the best timepiece creators for the year. This year, 72 watches were pre-selected for consideration comprising of the major watch groups and independents to compete across 12 categories. Blancpain's new *Woman Heure Décamètre Seconde Retrograde* took the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, thereby honouring the timepiece's technical and aesthetic characteristics in a design developed solely for women.

The piece is both a tribute to femininity and to the traditions of fine watchmaking. Encased in a 36.8mm diameter red gold

case, it features 152 diamonds with 108 of them on the case totalling one carat. The setting is of two interwoven rows of diamonds in various sizes and subtly echoes the double-scapard case design of the brand.

Within, the watch features Blancpain's new 226-part mechanical self-winding movement Calibre 22635R. The *Calibre de Genève* can be seen through the sapphire crystal case-back as can the oscillating weight shaped like a five petal flower, another creation by the brand.

Blancpain has always been devoted to creating unique timepieces for women and has pioneered the horological development. ☀

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

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

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

## Who's the grandest of them all?

The Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, the Oscars of the watchmaking world, will be held in Switzerland this October. But even if you haven't scored an invitation, you're still in luck. Many of the competing watches will be on display this month in Delhi, says Varun Godinho

Come October 31, the majestic Grand Théâtre de Genève will host the 14th edition of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève. By the end of the evening, 14 watches will have been awarded top prizes in categories including the best Chronograph, Tourbillon, Calendar and Artistic Craft, among others.

But don't expect the usual suspects – the high-profile Swiss haute horlogers with opulent showings at BaselWorld and SIHH –

to be sure-shot winners. In fact, last year, little-known watchmakers like Habring<sup>2</sup> and Reissence won top honours. Habring<sup>2</sup> is a husband-wife duo who run their own Austrian watchmaking unit, while Reissence is just six years old. "The GPHG is one of the best ways for watch collectors to understand up-and-coming brands."

This bacchanal watch from the six-year-old independent Swiss brand is definitely more than Batman. Part of the T-1000 collection – all its watches have a power reserve of 1,000 hours – it's built like a tank.



**Konstantin Chaykin Carpe Diem**

This Russian haute horloger uses zero Swiss-made parts in his watches. On the dial sits Kratos, the mythological Greek titan. The minutes are recorded in the lower half of the hourglass, which rolls over at the end of each hour.

Consider the fact that FP Journe, MB&F and Laurent Ferrier were all early winners of the GPHG. It's a fantastic way to add some weight behind the youngest and most creative minds in watches that might not get the credit they deserve on a commercial level," says Benjamin Clymer, founder of popular watch blog Hodinkee.com and a two-time jurist.

At the GPHG, pedigree doesn't count for much and neither does the tag of being "made in Switzerland" – Finnish, German and Russian watchmakers, among others, will be participating this year. Over 250 watches from more than 40 brands will be evaluated and judged by a 24-member panel of watch enthusiasts, independent of marketing budgets and starry brand ambassadors.

The multi-national jury is a motley crew, with the majority from outside the watchmaking industry. "We've appointed a deliberate mix, including designers, architects, historians, collectors and bloggers, all of whom come from diverse backgrounds. The aim is to judge a watch not only in terms of its technicality but also to look at it as an end product, like a consumer would," explains Aurel Bacs, President of the jury appointed by the Fondation Du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie De Genève, the committee that organizes the awards.

But before we get to that big night in October, you can get in on the action in India. A travelling exhibition of some of the participating watches will stop in Delhi at the Hotel Imperial on September 27. "We've flown down 72 timepieces, six from each of the 12 categories," said Anu Saboo, Head of Marketing at Ethos Watches, which has partnered with the Foundation to bring the exhibition to India.

To whet your appetite, we've rounded up some of the star attractions at this year's GPHG. ☐



**BENJAMIN CLYMER**

On his role as a GPHG jurist

I think it's our duty as jurors to treat each watch as if there were no name on the dial – basing our decisions purely on product design, concept and execution and not on what a brand may have done in the past. We care little about brands, and all about individual products. We simply call out the best, irrespective of advertising budgets or ambassadors. I started Hodinkee to make high-end watchmaking accessible to real people as the 45-year-old millionaire collector and the watch industry. We use the same model to generate interest in the GPHG.

### **Just in time**

TIME IS money, time is art. Whoever doesn't agree with the latter may please check out the 72 craftily-made timepieces selected by Grand Prix D'horlogerie De Geneve (GPHG), also regarded as the Oscars of the watch industry, for this year's awards nominations.

On display were a varied collection, ranging from jewellery to sport watches and chronographs to tourbillons. 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

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**Budget small print may hold key to REITs opportunity**



Sometime in the last week of October, 25 men from different parts of the world were flown down to Geneva. They were locked in a room from outside and any communication with the outside world was forbidden. They were sworn to secrecy and even made to take an oath.

*Angels and Demons anyone?*

Well, much like it, except that this was not the Sistine Chapel, these 25 men were no cardinals, and there was no pope to be elected.

These 25 men spent that day with watches, 72 of them, examining every little detail, giving all the watches between 1 and 6 points in a secret ballot. At the end of the ballot, a public notary collected the votes, put them in a sealed box and took them away to his office, far from the watch of the press or any other participating entity. The votes were counted and will be revealed later on Friday, in a ceremony at the Grand Théâtre de Genève where the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG), the Oscars of the watchmaking world, will be held. By the end of the evening, 12 watches will win the top honours in categories such as the best chronograph, calendar, tourbillon, mechanical exception, jewellery, artistic crafts among others. There will be several other categories such as best innovation, best horological revelation, best revival, special jury award, public prize and the Aiguille d'Or, or the supreme distinction.

### GPHG

The grand prix, in its 14th year, debuted in India with an exhibition of the so-called pre-selected 72 watches in September in New Delhi. GPHG is the biggest recognition in the world of haute horology. For the past 13 years, GPHG has rewarded excellent watchmaking and changed the lives of some of the young, independent brands.


The main reason behind the success of GPHG and its revered status in the industry is its credibility. The credibility, in turn, is a result of multiple factors, the first of which is the fact that it has become a foundation, said Carlo Lamprecht, president of the GPHG foundation in an interview last month.

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


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Because it is a foundation now, "it is absolutely independent. It doesn't take orders from anyone and there is no commercial activity. There is no ambition to make money from this foundation," clarified Lamprecht. Though the GPHG was created in 2001, the foundation of the GPHG, recognized as an organization in public interest, was created only in 2011.

"The second reason for the success of the grand prix is the quality, professionalism and neutrality of the jury," said Lamprecht. "The jury is subject to very strict rules. They have to solemnly swear that they obey the rules. That they will not vote for or against a brand for any personal reasons. That they will not leak any information."

### The Jury

The jury is chosen by the foundation and every year many of the members are changed in order to give it some freshness and maintain credibility. The 25 members of this year's jury come from 15 countries. These men are certified watch nerds; they know everything, or at least close to everything, that is to be known about fine watchmaking.

"In order to have the most credible jury, the foundation looks at diversity in terms of culture, geography, age, etc.," said Aurel Bacs, president of the jury. Bacs is a former director of watch auction division at Christies and Sotheby's. "We have members in the age group of 25 years and 80 years from 15 different countries and all they need to be is qualified watch specialists. In their professional lives, one is a rockstar, others are journalists, historians, watch makers, designers, architects, authors of books on watches, watch collectors and so on. We look for the fact that they are independent. We can't appoint a specialist who is on the payroll of a brand. And every year, a substantial percentage to the jury is changed."

But why so much theatrics in the selection process?

### The selection

According to Bacs, it shows how seriously they all take this entire process.

"It is a very serious kind of a set up," said Bacs. "It is also anonymous. You go to a quiet little corner and fill in the ballot. The public notary then takes the sealed box with ballots to his office, and only in the evening of the ceremony, the votes are disclosed and the winner named."

"And even the jury doesn't know the final results till the final ceremony," added Lamprecht.

The voting happens in two rounds. In the first round, all members of the jury are asked to choose their favourites from the 230-odd watches in the 12 categories. In each of the categories, six watches are chosen as finalists. And then in the second round of votes, the jury can only choose from these six watches per category. For this second round of voting, all the jury members have to come to Geneva.

The GPHG trophy, a hand, was created by graphic designer Roger Pfund who also designed the Swiss passport. And if you thought that the second-round voting to choose the winners was the only parallel between GPHG and the Catholic Church, listen to this. Pfund drew inspiration for the trophy from the fresco on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel, painted by Michelangelo, in which God touches Adam's extended hand to give him life.

### Boost for the younger brands

Nothing in Switzerland ignores the "Made in Switzerland" tag like the grand prix. It doesn't matter if the brand has two hundred years of history behind it or is a young start-up; if it has 5,000 employees in multiple geographical locations or whether it operates from the basement of an apartment in Austria that is owned and staffed by only two people. There are, in fact, a lot of young independent brands that have got a lot of leverage by winning a prize like this. Grubel Forsee, MB&F, FP Journe and Laurent Ferrier, etc., have all been early recipients of the awards.

"I think for a brand with 5,000 employees, 200 years of history and a billion dollars in turnover, it may not have that kind of effect," said Bacs. "It's like 'you know, it is nice to have but it doesn't change our lives'. But to a young independent watchmaker with 10 employees, I think it means a lot. They will be allowed to use the mention of the grand prix for all their marketing material or one year. There will be, of course, many mentions in the press. So it definitely has an impact."

#### India debut

In between the two rounds of voting, the so-called pre-selected watches are taken to international exhibitions. This starts two months before the final ceremony in Geneva. This year's venues were New Delhi (in September) and Beijing (October).

And Yashovardhan Saboo of Ethos Watches was instrumental in bringing this exhibition to India.

"It was a dream to host an event like that," said Saboo. "Doing a show like this of watches across brands is something quite difficult to put together. Where else do you see them? Basel(World), SIHH, where else? When the talks first happened about something like this happening in India, I said, let's try it. We kept pursuing and here we are." According to Lamprecht, Mumbai was also in consideration for hosting the exhibition.

The winning watches will be further taken to multiple exhibitions in London in November.

Whether India can take advantage of the increased global acknowledgement it has got with the event, only time will tell, but one thing we can be sure of, as Saboo puts it, "India's time has come."

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## Editor's picks



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*Mint Indulge* spoke with Carlo Lamprecht (CL), president of the GPHG Foundation, and Aurel Bacs (AB), the president of the jury on the sidelines of the GPHG conference in New Delhi about the watch industry's increasing focus on India. Edited excerpts:

### Why do we need watches at all?

**AB:** We don't need high-end watches like we need air and water. But then we do not need haute couture or French wine either. We don't need art. But I believe it is part of human culture and if we abandon this culture, then we are possibly going close to animals. At this level, it is not about "what time is it?" It is about expressing who you are, individually and as a society.

### Why was India chosen for the GPHG conference?

**CL:** When the grand prix started, the watches would mainly go to the established markets such as China or the US. But in recent years, we are taking them to younger markets, to various parts of Asia, the Middle East.

### Is it because a lot of watchmakers are focusing on the East, Far-East these days?

**CL:** We certainly don't go to markets that have no interest in high-end watchmaking. I don't think it is interesting to go to highly saturated market as well. And we don't go to the same place every time. So the most important markets for us to display the finalists of the grand prix are markets where the economy is sustaining or creating interest.

Then the question is also about finding the right partner. This time, we were fortunate to partner with Ethos and the Swiss Embassy. You can't just travel 10,000 miles with watches over \$25 million without any serious local interest. Next year, the plans are to go to Japan, Korea or maybe Thailand.

### You are both in India for the first time. How do you find it from the industry's point of view?

**CL:** India is important already but it will play a much more important part in the years to come. Blessed with a solid economic growth and paired with the culture and curiosity for well made hand crafted high quality objects and with a huge appetite for high-end goods.

### GPHG 2014 - PERFECTING THE 12TH ART

*GPHG's maiden foray to India was an opportunity for Indians to appreciate the year's best watches.*



Familiar with names such as Longio, Asmara-King Of Forest, Seahorse, Golden Bridge Dragon, Sirius Artist, or Coromandel Twin Volute Enchantée? What unites broken glass, pop art, pearl diamonds, complex minute watch hands, and even an ode to the sun god? One look at the list of winners and short listed watches for Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) would make it clear that this was a show as much for watch lovers as for lovers of art.

The coveted GPHG, amongst the most prestigious awards in horology, made its first ever stop in India. It was a historic opportunity for Indians to catch up with arguably the most elite shortlist in global horology.

The Grand Prix, which makes a tour of about three cities annually with the shortlisted watches for the year, is seen in global luxury capitals before the award ceremony in Geneva in November. On hand to explain the stopover in Delhi recently were Carlo Lamprecht, President, GPHG foundation, and Aurel Bacs, President of the Jury – GPHG and former director of watch auction division at Christie's and Sotheby's.

"We need to be coherent with our main objectives, while at the same time focus on markets that are key for the brands we represent," says Mr Lamprecht, explaining the choice of India as a venue for displaying the shortlisted watches. "Indian consumers have developed an extraordinary ability to appreciate fine watchmaking, and have thus become more critical with regards to creativity, innovation and craftsmanship," he adds.

As horology moves to being a fine art rather than a functional service, global watchmakers - both mega brands as well independent fine watch ateliers - are increasingly focusing in bringing out the best in their craft. "Horology is art in miniature," points out Mr Yashovardhan Saboo, Chairman – Ethos, a leading watch studio in India with 45 outlets, and believes India will reach its tipping point in watch sales soon. India is currently the

24th largest watch market globally by export volume. The high end watch market in India is estimated to be about INR 600 crore.

At the exhibition held in the Swiss Embassy in Delhi, watch lovers and collectors admired 72 timepieces from participating luxury brands including Breguet, Blancpain, A. Lange & Söhne, Van Cleef & Arpels, Jaquet Droz, Harry Winston, Omega, Bulgari, Chanel, Louis Vuitton, Chopard, Breguet, Mont Blanc, Hublot, Hermes and Tag Heuer. Less familiar to Indians, though internationally acclaimed luxury watch brands such as Urwerk, Frederic Journe, Grönefeld Parallax, Delaneau among others, were a far rarer treat.

GPHG is a public interest organization, established in 2011 by The Republic and Canton of Geneva, The City of Geneva and Geneva Laboratory of Horology and Microengineering (Timelab) among others. It aims to contribute to promoting Swiss watchmaking and its values around the world.

The Foundation annually organises the GPHG, which is intended to salute the excellence of worldwide horological production and reward the finest creations and luminaries of the watchmaking sector. The award ceremony is held at Grand Théâtre de Genève and draws the crème de la crème of the watchmaking profession, who vie with each other for the coveted honours. The winning watches then participate in a travelling exhibition that enables an international audience to admire the finest timepieces of the year.

The awards were announced in Geneva on October 31. The international jury handed out 16 prizes this year. The 'Aiguille d'Or' distinction - regarded to be the top prize - was awarded to Breguet for the Classic Chronométrie model. The ceremony was attended by around 1,500 guests including influential figures from the world of watchmaking, finance and politics, who congregated in Geneva for this annual celebration.

The other day I was talking to a friend who has been involved in the watch industry for over 20 years. He said, "I have never seen such a vibrant market like India's. It's growing at a rate of 15 per cent every year." I think he is right.

My personal association with watches began when I started working at a watch store in Mumbai. I used to buy my parents' watches and sell them to my customers. I then became interested in the craftsmanship behind the watches. Thus, while I was back from Germany to India, I was asked by my father if I wanted to start a business here. I said, "I would if it was PATEK PHILIPPE". Unfortunately, my interest in watches and passion for engineering was ignited. Years later, I got the opportunity to work with a leading watch brand, Audemars Piguet, starting the first high quality watch factory in India, in 1998. This love affair with watches has continued and the rest is history. Right now, the future of the business (on the one hand, the success of luxury watches depends on heritage, tradition and history; on the other hand, it) continues to

improve itself with innovation and the passion and commitment to a craftsmanship that is unmatched by any other brand in the world. We are also the official distributor for the watch industry in India, which is something that we are very proud of.

**What is your vision for the future?**

When we started in 2002 with a com-

pany of 10 people with offices in Mumbai, we just grew as a chain of boutiques, struggled to expand, and nothing was ever meant to last. Our vision is that only an official distributor could be professionally available, efficient, and effective. Our strategy was to increase craftsmanship and good service. That

means the bottom line today, because giving a watch its importance and a wide range of watches.

**What are your concerns about the market?**

Silver has given us an average annual rate of about 15 per cent over the last few years. This might lead to market growth, estimated between 10-15 per cent. The market is growing, but the problem is that, as we have become India's largest watch retailer for premium and luxury brands.

While we do intend to expand the number of stores, our main priority will still

be to maintain the Apple Watch with a challenge to make it larger. In fact, the industry is much larger than we have ever seen in the last 10 years.

**What are your ambitions for the market?**

Whether you want the watch to fully serve a specific purpose, for example, to tell the time, or to be a fashion statement, the characteristics of the watch may be chosen accordingly. It is also crucial to understand the list of the different brands as there are many more brands in the market. We will go into marketing and building awareness about Ethos and our partner brands. Above all, we will continue to let India know on the global stage what we can offer.

**How do you measure your business success?**

We have two main metrics: sales and market share. The market for watches is a slow but very difficult transition. **Do you see any challenges in the market?**

I also like the traditional craftsmanship, which is not easily replicable. I am also a fan of the modern designs, which are very clean, perhaps minimalist. Finally, I believe that collecting watches, like collecting art, is an art in itself.

department at Christie's. The only question he had permission to ask today is whether he can sell them. There has certainly more action needed in the market to make it more interesting for collectors because the auction or the store collections today doesn't do enough to support the market.

**EXCERPTS**

**What does time and space determine about investment watch?**

Through my lecture, along many collector meetings, I've realized that there is no better way to understand what a watch is than to measure it. It's a bit like a hobby while investing about understanding, eventually it becomes my profession.

**What does investment mean and choose of investment in time and space investment?**

I always never expect to invest just for a specific strategy. My approach uses all ways to consider my client's needs. My example defines as being located in a specific country and specific culture, the client's needs are different. In this case, I would like to make sure that the watch is available in the client's place, and his own circumstances, etc., and the client can decide the quality in service.

**What does investment investment means in Christies, how much investment does it cost?**

After the auction price, the investment every week is very often to become. I consider buying luxury art from friends.

The televised occasion opened with the Breguet Classique Dame winning the Public Prize. These exceptional results signal Breguet's outstanding comeback at the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG).

Nominated for the GPHG's grand finale along with 71 other timepieces, the Breguet Classique Chronométrie competed in the Men's category. Its recent distinction pays tribute to the dedication of President & CEO Mr. Marc A. Hayek's teams and rewards the brand's continual investments in the research and development of new technologies and materials to improve the precision of mechanical watches.

Breguet's mastery of silicon enabled the Classique Chronométrie, fitted with calibre 574DR, to reach a high frequency of 10 Hz and thus to deliver impressive rating results. However, the major innovation of this 7727 model is without doubt the use of magnetic pivots. With this invention, Breguet not only controls the negative effects of magnetism in a watch, but also uses magnetic force to improve the pivoting, rotation and stability of the balance staff. The result of these developments protected by no fewer than six patents is an average rate of -1/+3 seconds a day, well within the COSC chronometer standard (-4/+6 seconds a day).

Watch Classique Dame, one of the six total Breguet pieces nominated to the GPHG's shortlist, competed in the Women's category. It received the most popular votes during the international exhibitions preceding the GPHG's ceremony and on the Internet.

The Classique Dame, a particularly slim watch, shows the hours, minutes and seconds as well as the dates in an aperture. Once again, the heart of this watch is a mechanical movement with a silicon balance spring. This is Breguet's way of demonstrating that it gives women the benefit of the latest innovations in their watches. Taste and charm come naturally into play on an uncluttered, engine-turned dial, while the bezel and lugs are set with brilliant-cut diamonds. With its open-tipped Breguet hands in blued steel, fine fluting on the caseband and secret signature, this model is unmistakably a Breguet classic.

Watches Classique Chronométrie and Classique Dame will be displayed at SalonQP in London from November 6 to 8, 2014. This ceremony is the finale of the 2014 edition of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG).

The Edmond de Rothschild group is one of the main partners of the awards, and has regularly rewarded the best young student at the Geneva Watchmaking School by awarding a scholarship.

The competition is not limited to Swiss watches, and an exhibition of each year's competitors travels the world as a roadshow before the winners are announced.

This year's roadshow took New Delhi (India), Beijing (China) and Geneva, and will now be headed to the Salon QP watch exhibition in London, which will be held from November 6 to 8.

The winners are chosen by a 25-member jury that consists of auction veterans, working watchmakers, journalists, designers, watch collectors, and retailers.

The public prize was decided after tallying up votes cast over the internet and at the exhibitions.

Now in its 14<sup>th</sup> edition, the GPHG registered a record participation with representation from all the major watchmaking groups as well as a number of independent companies.

Simultaneously translated into English for fans worldwide, the ceremony was broadcast live on Euronews.com, Worldtempus.com, Hodinkee.com and on the GPHG website, Gphg.org.

# The Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Geneve – exclusively at SalonQP

**B**efore the attention turns to SalonQP, watch brands will have their eyes firmly set on the "Aiguille d'Or," the most prestigious award from the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève. The event, dubbed the Oscars of the watch industry, will also award more than a dozen prizes to the industry's brightest, before they travel to London to display their winning creations at SalonQP.

Last year, **Girard-Perregaux** took home the main prize, meaning it will be ineligible for the competition in 2014. Instead, the brand's Product Development Director, Stefano Macaluso, will sit on a jury that includes journalists, collectors, and industry experts.

Although brands have deemed the risk of coming second-best not worth participating in past editions, a record number have submitted entries this year according to the GPHG. All the major watch groups will be represented this year, a first for the Grand Prix, while a number of independents such as **Urwerk**, **Gronewald** and **Kari Voutilainen** have once again been nominated for their achievements.

"We are keeping fingers crossed," said an optimistic Yacine Sar, head of Urwerk's communication team.

Stephen Forsey, of **Greubel Forsey**, and Willard Wigan will represent Britain's only hope of winning an award this year. The two men collaborated on the Art Piece 1, a timepiece which houses a set of nano-sculptures created by Wigan, and that is nominated in the Artistic Craft category, alongside Voutilainen's Hisui.

Forsey revealed he was somewhat surprised by the nomination, but could not wait to see how the jury rates it. The brand, already known for its highly complicated watches, will have "the chance to show that we have many skills," said Forsey. "It will be very, very interesting."

The GPHG will display the pre-selected watches in New Delhi, and in Beijing, before they are returned to Geneva for the prize-giving ceremony on October 31st at the Grand Théâtre de Genève. The winning watches will then travel to SalonQP in London where visitors will get an exclusive look at the best timepieces of the year.

### Breguet Classique Chronométrie Wins Top Watch Prize



This evening the **Breguet Classique Chronométrie** was awarded the Aiguille d'Or, the top prize at the **Grand Prix d'Horlogerie d'Genève** (GPHG), watchmaking's highest awards. If right now you're thinking "Oh, like the Oscars of watchmaking?" -- stop! But yes, sort of. There are prizes for everything from diamond-studded ladies watches to no-nonsense sport watches to high complications, but the Aiguille d'Or (or "Golden Hand," in case you weren't paying attention that day in French class) is reserved for the most impressive watch across all categories.

The GPHG was established in 2001 as a way to promote watchmaking worldwide. While it is based in Geneva, Switzerland, and in fact the City of Geneva and the Canton of Geneva are both founding members of the supporting foundation, the competition is not limited to Swiss watches, and an exhibition of each year's competitors travels the world as a touring exhibition before the winners are announced. These winners are chosen by a **diverse 25-person jury** that consists of auction veterans, working watchmakers, journalists, designers, watch collectors, retailers, and even the odd watch-loving celebrity like John Mayer.

The Classique Chronométrique looks every bit the part of a classic Breguet watch. It has the fluted caseband, the guilloché dial, and the open-tipped hands that are even named for the French watchmaker. But under the hood is where things get really interesting: A magnetic pivot system replaces the typical bearings for the balance, creating a nearly frictionless environment. To make this possible, the double balance spring and escape wheel must be made from silicon, a non-magnetic material. That this whole thing beats at 10 Hz — more than twice the speed of most watches — is absolutely insane.

Truly answering the question "What's the best watch?" is impossible. But no one could fault you for answering, "the Breguet Classique Chronométrique."

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GPHG 2014: highlights in the Jewellery Watch category for the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève

The nominees for the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) - the equivalent of the Oscars for watches - will be putting on their best faces for the 14<sup>th</sup> edition of this decisive horological competition coming up this autumn.

Depending on their profile, contestants are divided into 12 finely tuned categories, ranging from highly complicated men's watches to a surprising new category for watches that retail for under CHF 8,000 CHF. None of the watches we will be admiring today are competing in either of the aforementioned categories. In fact, a full three-quarter of the watches in the Jewellery category are equipped with quartz movements and prices range from 49,900 CHF to 668,379 CHF for Chopard's latest creation.

The Jewellery Watch category is reserved exclusively for watches "demonstrating exceptional mastery of the art of jewellery"

and gem-setting, and also distinguished by the choice of stones\*. Last year, Chopard's L'Heure du Diamant watch took home the Jewellery prize. Before things start to heat up in October, we take a quick peek at some of the contestants vying for the 2014 Jewellery prize.

When it comes to diamonds, Harry Winston is still king of the gem. This year, the brand shows off its diamond heritage with Ultimate Emerald Signature, a secret watch with a delicate vintage aesthetic that doubles up as a pendant, brooch and wristwatch.

The white gold case, shaped like an emerald-cut diamond, is covered with a cornucopia of remarkable marquise, brilliant and baguette-cut diamonds including a 1.00 carat emerald-cut diamond at the centre. Boucheron is competing with its Beller Pompon jewellery watch. This high jewellery interpretation of the elegant, rectangular Reflet watch, first launched in 1947, is covered with round and baguette-cut diamonds on the case and bracelet and a delicate snow setting on the dial. For an extra touch of whimsy, and in keeping with the maison's motifs, a detachable diamond pompon dangles from the clasp.

Chanel's wonderful Lam Mosaic jewellery watch recreates the technique of Byzantine mosaics. The only difference is that this mosaic is carpeted with diamonds representing a proud lion's head, which stands guard over the timepiece and blends into the profusion of diamonds on the bracelet.

In a more contemporary take on the jewellery watch, Delacour's Grace Pear Diamonds features a wide cabochon-set bracelet framed by 351 magnificent pear-shaped diamonds that lead to the watch dial, which is set with 168 diamonds. For a splash of refreshing green, de Grisogono's Grappoli watch is as resto as they come, with a whirling composition of emeralds that emanate from the centre of the watch, growing in size and spilling over the bezel in clusters of mouth-watering grapes. Bulgari also adds accents of emerald green to its Diva watch, which twirls with pleated fans on the elaborate bezel and bracelet.

The delicate pastel palette of Chauvet's Hortensia Secret jewellery watch earmarks this piece as the most feminine contender in the category. Hidden by a bouquet of powder pink flowers sculpted in precious gemstones and set alight with diamonds and pink sapphires, the hours and minutes slip by on a mother-of-pearl dial.

GaF turns up the volume with its candidate: the Multi-Coloured Butterfly watch. Set against a white diamond background, each butterfly on the dial and bracelet is composed of four pearl-shape gemstones sculpted from violet, pink or blue sapphires.

Before the GPHG in October, the watches will go on a road show to India and China. And following the grand finale on 1<sup>er</sup> October 2014, the winning watches will be on show at SalonQP in London - an event no serious watch enthusiast can afford to miss.

The Oscars of the watch world were held on Friday in Switzerland with the grand Aiguille d'Or (Golden Hand) prize going to Breguet's Classic Chronometrie.



Around 1,500 guests attended the 14th

Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) to see 17 prizes awarded to the most accomplished watches of the last 12 months. The event this year registered a record number of participants.

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While an expert panel decided 16 category winners, Breguet was also honoured in taking the Public Prize, voted for by visitors to the GPHG website and a series of pre-show public exhibitions, for its Classique Dame. Urwerk's self-calibrating EMC watch was honoured with two awards; the Mechanical Exception and Innovation prizes.

#### GPHG 2014: artistry of the highest order from the métiers d'art watch finalists

The nominees in the category Artistic Crafts: watches vying for the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) 2014 - the equivalent of the Oscar for watches - will be putting on their best faces for the 14th edition of this decisive horological competition, which will be celebrated on 31 October at the Grand Théâtre de Genève.

To qualify for this particular category, the GPHG rules that only "watches demonstrating exceptional mastery of one or several artistic techniques such as enamelling, lacquering, engraving, guilloche (engraved enamelling), skeleton-working, etc.", will be admitted.

Last year, Chanel watches stole the show with its Mademoiselle Privé Camélia Brodé timepiece. With a silk embroidered dial featuring a camellia, the famous French embroiderer La Maison Lèvage was in charge of the "needlework painting". And this year, Chanel watches returns with yet another exquisite creation called the Coromandel Twin Volute Enchante, part of the Mademoiselle Privé collection, which showcases some of the intricate objects that furnished Gabrielle Chanel's \$1 million apartment in Paris.

In this case, the exquisite Chanel watch echoes details of the Coromandel lacquer screens that decorated her home: antique Chinese folding screens, coated in dark lacquer; that are carved before being painted and inlaid with mother-of-pearl, ivory and other materials. Two dials of the "Coromandel Twins" have been created to represent the Asian philosophy of duality;

ein and yang, man and woman, light and shadow and black and white. The darker dial is made with Grand Feu enamel and portrays a Chinese pipe player suspended on a cloud. The lighter dial is sculpted in mother-of-pearl. The 37mm white gold case and crown are adorned with snow-set diamonds framing the magnificent Oriental scenes. Under the dial, a self-winding mechanical movement gives life to the hours and minutes.

Chaumet watches compete with the Attaque-moi... si tu m'aimes (Catch me... if you love me) in pink gold, with a dial decorated with six butterflies set against a precious myrtle bud wood background. If you look closely, you will see that the butterfly wings are made from inlaid red camaïeu, white wood and blackened gold, delicately poised on a diamond-set rose gold stem. The bezel of the 38mm rose gold Chaumet watch is enhanced with a double row of diamonds, while underneath the case a self-winding mechanical movement features a whimsical butterfly-shaped rotor.

Of the six finalists in the Artistic Crafts category, there is one watch set aside for men. Art Piece 1 by Greubel Forsey is first and foremost a complex mechanical machine, very in keeping with the founders' philosophy of inventiveness and impossibly difficult horological pieces. The artistic touch here is the incorporation of a nano-sculpture representing a gold caravan ship with three masts measuring a minuscule 0.51 x 0.95 x 1.22mm by British sculptor Willard Wigan. In order to view the sculpture, a microscope lens has been incorporated on the lateral crown. If you can't find the hour and minute functions on the dial, it's because they're hidden and can be activated on demand.

The Hermès Arceau Millefiori watch, with its stamp-inspired lugs, has been decorated with thousands of miniature pink glass flowers crafted by Les Cristalleries de Saint-Louis in France, the same company that has been blowing life into glass paperweights and other objets-d'art since 1898. Presented in a 34mm grey gold case with a diamond-set bezel, this pretty Hermès watch is equipped with a mechanical self-winding movement.

beautifully depicted, two black fliers across the dial of the Jaquet Droz Petit Heure Minute Relief Saisons watch with black lacquer detail. Set against a hand-engraved mother-of-pearl dial, the birds are sculpted and engraved in gold before being applied to the dial and then painted by hand. Containing the miniature trompe-l'œil, the domed sapphire glass highlights

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## A behind-the-scenes look at the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève



**Big night: guests arrive at the Grand Théâtre**

About this time of year, the watchmaking industry rolls up at Geneva's 19th-century Grand Théâtre to gossip, network and pat itself on the back at the annual Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève.

Inevitably, the prize is known as the Oscars of watchmaking, except there is not much red-carpet celebrity action. It does, however, have an eclectic dress code, ranging from long gowns and diamonds to jeans and open necked shirts.

But while it may lack the slickness of the film industry's shindig, the prize is taken increasingly seriously by the fine watch industry.

The awards started in 2001 on a more modest scale, with seven prizes awarded. Between 2007 and 2011 the event was privately owned by Edipresse, a publisher of *GMT*, a watch magazine, among other titles.

During this period the awards' profile rose significantly. And in 2011, the organisation

behind the prize became an independent foundation. The intention was to strengthen the independence, solvency and regulation of the awards and ensure the transparency of voting procedures.

Just how significant the GPHG has become was made clear to me in 2012, when I was invited to join the jury by Aurel Bacs, the former head of Christie's watch department. His appointment signalled not only a willingness by GPHG to canvas opinion from a broad constituency, it was also regarded as a coup in that Mr Bacs is known and respected in horological circles.

During a two-hour ceremony on October 31, 18 prizes were awarded. It was the culmination of a selection process that began in the early summer, when the list of entrants – who pay a fee of SFr500 (\$519) to put a watch into competition and a further SFr5,000 if the watch makes it on to the shortlist – was announced.

Jury members cast their first round of ballots in July to produce a shortlist of six entries in each of a dozen categories.

The shortlisted watches then hit the road, to be exhibited in India and China before returning to Geneva in October when the jury met to vote for the victors.

The big prize was picked up by Breguet, a Swatch Group brand. The biggest Swiss watch conglomerate's marques had featured regularly among the winners until 2006, and their return lent further validation to the awards this year.

The winners' list was intriguing because of the number of non-Swiss marques featured: Bulgari, the French-owned Rome-based brand; A Lange & Söhne, the German brand; Grönefeld of the Netherlands; and perhaps most intriguingly, Japan's Seiko, which entered a watch in the category that rewards reasonably priced watchmaking.

In the 1980s, Seiko symbolised the wave of Asian quartz watches that threatened the future of mechanical watchmaking in Switzerland.

But the number of overseas brands honoured this year indicates that the awards are

relevant to watchmaking around the world

For those of us on the judging panel, service is unpaid, but I accepted because of Mr Bacs's powers of persuasion.

I imagine he also persuaded a number of others to accept, among them horological historians, leading collectors and watchmakers.

The result is a range of opinion, and in an effort to make sure the competition is fair and transparent, a notary sits in the corner of the room in which the jury makes its deliberations.

For those lucky enough to attend, this year's GPHG was certainly entertaining and I hope very much that Mr Bacs will invite me back next year.

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## DIAMONDS AND DAISIES WIN AT THE GPHG

There were no frights in sight in Geneva on Friday night (October 31), just beautiful watches all vying to take home a trophy this year's Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève

And the watches in the three categories catering to women's watches – ladies watch, ladies high mechanical and jewellery – certainly were some of the most stunning. In these categories, Blancpain, Christophe Claret and Bulgari all took home the trophies and, interestingly, the Public Prize, which is voted for by the public attendees of international exhibitions, was also awarded to a women's watch – Breguet's Classique Dame.

The jury awarded Blancpain's Off-Centred Hour the Ladies Watch prize, beating the likes of De Grisogono and Harry Winston, while Christophe Claret, quite rightly, was given the Ladies High Mechanical trophy for his Margot. This is Claret's first ladies' watch complication and features a mechanism that aims to mimic the "he loves me, he loves me not" game played on daisies. A pusher at 2 o'clock causes petals to randomly disappear on the back of the case, while on the front, the result is spelled out in French – un peu (a little) – beaucoup (a lot) – passionnément (passionately) – à la folie (madly) – pas du tout (not at all).

The flower can be reset by a pusher at 4 o'clock making all petals reappear around the pistil and causing the 'sentiment' display at 4 o'clock to an ellipsis (...). It is a beautiful, whimsical complication that only Christophe Claret could have produced.

No less spectacular but for different reasons, is Bulgari's Diva High Jewellery Emeralds, which won the Jewellery Watch category, despite some stiff competition from brands such as Chanel, Chopard and Graff. This impressive diamond-and-emerald piece really showcases Bulgari's stone-setting prowess, something that the brand has been proud of since it started.

The other winners across the more male-dominated categories were Urban Jürgensen's Central Second for the Men's Watch prize; De Bethune's DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon for the Chronograph category; Grönefeld took home the Tourbillon Watch Prize for his Parallax, while the Calendar Watch Prize was worn by A. Lange & Söhne's Richard Lange Perpetual Calendar "Terraluna". Hublot won the Striking Watch prize for its Classic Fusion Cathedral Tourbillon Minute Repeater, while, unsurprisingly, Urwerk's EMC was deemed worthy of the Mechanical Exception Watch Prize. The "Petite Aiguille" Prize went to Seiko for its Grand Seiko Hi-Beat 36000 GMT; Zenith triumphed in the Sports Watch category, thanks to its El Primero Lightweight. Omega's Speedmaster "Dark Side of the Moon" won the "Revival" Watch Prize; Voutilainen won the Artistic Crafts watch prize and the "Aiguille d'Or" Grand Prix was given to Breguet for its Classique Chronométrie.

You may be thinking “what’s this got to do with me? I’ll never get to see these watches”. However, luckily for you they will all be appearing at SalonQP and [you can win tickets to attend](#).

Worth it just to see Christophe Claret's Margot alone.

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

Le Grand Prix d'horlogerie de Genève, c'est l'un des événements les plus importants dans le monde de l'horlogerie mondiale. Compétition aux multiples prix, le GPHG permet aux manufactures et marques de montres de s'affronter en présentant divers modèles dans différentes catégories avec chacune son prix. Partons donc découvrir cette manifestation importante pour le monde des trotteuses et autres aiguilles...

## Histoire et objectif

Ce prix, plutôt récent au vu de l'histoire de l'horlogerie, a été fondé en 2001 et récompense depuis chaque année plusieurs garde-temps d'exception. L'objectif de cette compétition fut dès le début de promouvoir l'horlogerie suisse grâce à un label bien connu et qui pourrait être utilisé par les marques dans leurs publicités.

En seulement quelques années, l'objectif a largement été atteint et aujourd'hui le **GPHG** est un événement marketing très important pour l'industrie de ce secteur. Il y a donc, pour l'année 2014, **12 catégories de montres différentes** qui vont chacune recevoir son prix, en plus de 7 autres prix. C'est d'ailleurs peut-être cela le problème, être avant tout un événement de promotion de l'horlogerie suisse, plutôt qu'une récompense en terme technique. En effet, pourquoi avoir autant de titres différents, si ce n'est pour essayer de plaire au plus grand nombre ?



## Le fonctionnement du GPHG

Comment peut bien fonctionner ce grand prix ? Depuis 2011, le Grand-Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève est sous la responsabilité de la **Fondation du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève**, dont les membres sont :

- la République et Canton de Genève
- La Ville de Genève
- Le Musée International de l'Horlogerie de la Chaux-de-Fonds (MIH)
- Le Laboratoire d'Horlogerie et de Microtechnique de Genève (Timelab)
- Le groupe Edipresse

Cette fondation va donc organiser annuellement le GPHG, qui a pour but de récompenser les meilleures productions horlogères de l'année. Les titres sont remis entre fin octobre et début novembre au Grand Théâtre de Genève.

Mais avant d'arriver à la récompense suprême que peut être un titre du GPHG, les différentes montres inscrites pour participer au concours doivent être sélectionnées par un jury composé de 24 membres. Chaque année, ce dernier est légèrement changé et pour 2014, un tiers du jury est renouvelé. Dedans, on trouve des détaillants, journalistes spécialisés, experts horlogers, collectionneurs qui viennent de tous les continents et ils sont présidés cette année par Aurel Bacs.

## La Sélection des montres

Comment sont sélectionnées les montres qui font partie du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie 2014 ? En fait, les marques vont inscrire elles-mêmes leurs propres modèles. Pour cette année 2014, elles devaient envoyer leurs données d'inscription pour le 23 juin 2014.

Chaque marque peut inscrire d'une à six montres différentes, dans différentes catégories (12 au total). Par contre, chaque garde-temps ne peut concourir que dans une seule catégorie.

Le jury a ensuite présélectionné les montres qui seront en compétition, car il y avait à l'origine plus de 240 montres pour cette édition 2014 (un record !). Au total, les jurys vont voter à bulletin secret pour présélectionner six montres par catégorie.

Après cette première étape essentielle pour le déroulement du GPHG, va pouvoir commencer le tour du monde des montres sélectionnées. Plusieurs petites expositions vont se passer dans différentes grandes villes du monde pour finir ensuite à Genève. Pour l'édition 2014, le GPHG va se balader à **New Delhi** en Inde (26 et 27 septembre 2014), puis à **Pékin** (du 9 au 11 octobre 2014). Après un voyage à Genève du 22 octobre au 02 novembre, l'exposition va se rendre à Londres du 06 au 08 novembre.



## Les différentes récompenses

Revenu dans la cité de Calvin (à partir du 22 octobre), le jury va sélectionner les gagnants des 19 prix différents, dont la très prisée Aiguille d'or le 29 octobre. Voici les différents prix :

- **Grand Prix de l'Aiguille d'Or** : Graal pour tous les horlogers, le Grand-Prix de l'Aiguille d'Or récompense la meilleure montre toutes catégories confondues.
- **Prix de la Montre Dame** : tous les garde-temps pour femme sans complication sauf deux indications suivantes : date, réserve de marche, phase de lune classique, second fuseau horaire, et pouvant bénéficier au maximum d'un sertissage total de cinq carats.
- **Prix de la Haute Mécanique pour Dame** : toutes les montres pour femme qui présentent de superbes et créatives complications mécaniques.
- **Prix de la Montre Homme** : tous les garde-temps masculins sans complication sauf pour deux indications dans la liste suivante : date, réserve de marche, phase de lune classique, second fuseau horaire, et pouvant bénéficier au maximum d'un sertissage total de cinq carats.
- **Prix de la Montre Chronographe** : le modèle doit au moins présenter la complication chronographe.
- **Prix du Tourbillon** : le modèle doit au moins présenter la complication du tourbillon mécanique.

- **Prix de la Montre Calendrier** : le modèle doit au minimum présenter une complication de type calendaire ou astronomique (Quantième annuel, quantième perpétuel, équation du temps, affichage complexe des phases de lune, etc.)
- **Prix de la Montre à Sonnerie** : le modèle présenté doit avoir une complication acoustique comme les fonctions répétitions, sonnerie, réveil, musique, etc.
- **Prix de l'Exception mécanique** : le modèle présente un mécanisme spécial, tel qu'un affichage innovant ou sophistiqué, un automate, un mouvement à courroie ou tout autre concept horloger original et/ou exceptionnel.
- **Prix de la Petite Aiguille** : cette récompense peut être donnée pour toutes les montres de moins de 8000 CHF.
- **Prix de la Montre Sport** : le modèle doit être lié au monde du sport ou avec un design sportif.
- **Prix de la Montre Joaillerie** : le modèle doit présenter une très belle maîtrise de la joaillerie et du sertissage.
- **Prix de la Montre Métiers d'Art** : le modèle doit présenter une maîtrise exceptionnelle d'une ou plusieurs techniques d'art horlogères comme le guillochage, l'émaillage, le laquage, la gravure, le squelettage.
- **Prix de l'Innovation** : la montre doit avoir une innovation tant du côté mécanique que du design.
- **Prix Révélation Horlogère** : le modèle récompensé doit être une montre créée par une jeune marque de moins de 5 ans. Ce prix est facultatif et le jury n'est pas obligé de le donner. Il peut aussi choisir de récompenser un jeune talent horloger.
- **Prix « Revival »** : ce type de modèle de montre doit être une réédition ou réinterprétation d'un modèle emblématique.
- **Prix Spécial du Jury** : ce prix ne récompense pas une montre ou une marque, mais une personnalité ou une institution, ou bien une initiative ayant joué un rôle fondamental pour la promotion de l'horlogerie.
- **Prix du Public** : ce prix provient du choix du public qui a pu voir les montres lors des différentes expositions ou sur internet ([www.gphg.org](http://www.gphg.org) ou sites partenaires).
- **Prix du Meilleur jeune élève de l'Ecole d'Horlogerie de Genève** : le prix est décerné au meilleur élève de la première année de l'Ecole d'Horlogerie de Genève. Le lauréat va recevoir une bourse d'études de la Banque Edmond de Rothschild.

Le jury de l'édition 2014 du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève a préselectionné pas moins de 72 montres pour les 12 catégories, soit 6 par catégories. Mais qu'elle sera le modèle vainqueur, celui qui aura la chance d'obtenir la fameuse Aiguille d'Or.

### **Appel d'air**

Le Grand Prix d'horlogerie de Genève ressemble à tous les autres : critiqué, remis en cause, désavoué..., mais toujours aussi plébiscité. Malgré les épisodiques frondes qui l'entourent, le GPHG poursuit donc son ascension et s'impose comme un concours international incontournable. Les montres en compétition pour l'édition 2014, par leur nature comme par leur nombre, promettent une édition haute en couleur.

L'édition 2013 fut particulièrement favorable aux horlogers indépendants. L'effet ne s'est pas fait attendre sur l'édition 2014 : le nombre de pièces engagées (225) atteint des records (+ 22 % par rapport à 2013), de nouvelles catégories ont vu le jour. Ainsi, le 31 octobre à Genève, on découvrira les nouvelles reines de la "Haute Mécanique pour dames", de l'"Exception mécanique" ou de la "Sonnerie" ! Certes, on pourrait largement glosser sur ces intitulés pour le moins imprécis. Comme ne cessent de le souligner les puristes du genre, la "Haute Horlogerie" n'existe pas, ou bien il faudrait alors laisser une place à la "Basse Horlogerie" !

De même, pourquoi une "Haute Mécanique pour dames", au lieu d'une simple "Horlogerie féminine" ? Sans parler de l'étrange "Exception mécanique", laquelle devra se détacher par un "concept horloger original" : voilà une exigence bien floue. Enfin, on se demande toujours pourquoi la joaillerie ne fait pas partie des métiers d'art, mais cela semble peine perdue depuis tant d'années.

### **Des invitées-surprises**

Une fois ces critiques de surface passées, on reste surpris par le nombre de prétendantes. Certes, plusieurs manufactures n'hésitent pas à faire concourir des garde-temps dans plusieurs catégories. Louis Moinet s'aligne sur cinq catégories à la fois, derrière un TAG Heuer qui tente le tout pour le tout avec sept entrées parallèles, loin derrière Graff, avec neuf pièces en course ! Le Swatch Group n'est pas en reste, avec six Breguet aux côtés de six Blancpain et de six Jaquet Droz. 666, un chiffre porte-bonheur ?



En marge de ces incontournables, le GPHG offre toujours le plaisir de belles découvertes que l'on aimerait voir consacrer. Chez les dames, l'audace de la Lady 8 de Jacquet Droz mérite les honneurs, avec un véritable parti pris esthétique que l'on ne rencontre plus souvent. La Liens de Chaumet, si discrète, n'en marque pas moins - enfin - le retour de la marque sur l'horlogerie féminine parfaitement dessinée, abordable et raffinée.



Chez les hommes, malgré les évidentes qualités des concurrentes, l'oeil averti ne saurait passer outre la CIGA Design, venue tout droit de... Shenzhen, Chine. A priori, cette petite mono-aiguille ne franchira pas le cap face aux exceptionnelles Bovet, Breguet ou Harry Winston, et c'est heureux, mais l'audace est à saluer.

### **Chronos et tourbillons : pour nous, les hommes**

La catégorie des chronographes est symptomatique. Déjà, parce qu'elle ne s'intitule pas "Chronomètres". De facto, peuvent y concourir tous les chronos, et pas seulement les pièces certifiées COSC, seules habilitées à se revendiquer "chronomètres". Ensuite, parce que cette catégorie permet à de nouveaux arrivants de se montrer, après le règne sans partage de TAG Heuer (primée trois fois de suite en 2010, 2011 et 2012).



Malheureusement, cette catégorie très ouverte engage des pièces fort hétérogènes. On retrouve donc des concurrentes aux mouvements standards (Tudor, Snyper, Mouawad Genève) aux côtés de remarquables développements ultra-techniques avec lesquels aucune comparaison n'est possible : Christophe Claret, Montblanc, De Bethune, pour ne citer qu'elles. On ne pourra que regretter cette juxtaposition du tout-venant avec une élite horlogère de haut vol.



Les tourbillons semblent être une catégorie plus homogène, bien que très embouteillée (26 pièces en lice, la deuxième catégorie la plus courue du GPHG). Breguet, Harry Winston, Montblanc, Bovet, Blancpain, sont attendus au tournant. Le virage risque toutefois d'être plus compliqué que prévu puisque de nombreux outsiders, tout aussi légitimes, sont en embuscade : H. Moser & Cie, mais également plusieurs indépendants, comme Hysek, Moritz Grossmann (Glashütte), Speake-Marin ou Roshan Martin, dont c'est ici la première montre. Et pour la gloire : Luxius, une smart watch à tourbillon ! Qui ne tente rien...

Ce ne sont pas moins de vingt-quatre personnalités reconnues pour leur contribution



Le Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève – GPHG – a été créé en 2001 par deux journalistes indépendants, à savoir Gabriel Tortella et Jean-Claude Pittard. Plus tard il fut racheté par le Groupe Edipresse. En 2010, le groupe Edipresse m'a mandaté pour créer une Fondation afin de donner au GPHG l'indépendance nécessaire pour lui garantir une plus grande neutralité et assurer sa pérennité. C'est ainsi que j'ai pu fédérer l'Etat de Genève, la Ville de Genève, le Musée International de l'Horlogerie de La Chaux-de-Fonds, Time Lab détenteur du fameux poinçon de Genève et le Groupe Edipresse comme membres fondateurs et porter sur les fonts baptismaux en 2011 la nouvelle Fondation du GPHG.

Le GPHG est destiné à saluer l'excellence des productions horlogères, il est ainsi un instrument de promotion de la branche horlogère dans le monde et du savoir-faire de la Suisse dans ce domaine; conçu dans un esprit fédérateur, il est aussi une compétition qui stimule la concurrence et qui favorise ainsi la créativité et l'innovation.

### Toutes les marques suisses de renom participent-elles au GPHG ? Doit-on proposer sa candidature pour participer au GPHG ?

La participation au GPHG se fait sur inscriptions. Les inscriptions sont ouvertes chaque année début mai et les conditions de participation sont disponibles sur le site officiel du GPHG, [www.gphg.org](http://www.gphg.org), sur lequel figure également le règlement du concours, les listes des différentes catégories et prix, la composition du Jury et d'autres informations. Toutes les marques, suisses et étrangères, peuvent s' inscrire au GPHG. Il y a des marques qui y adhèrent chaque année, d'autres seulement lors de la sortie d'une nouvelle création, certaines s'abstiennent tout simplement. Tous les grands groupes horlogers sont présents, ainsi que de nombreuses marques indépendantes.

### Quel est le fonctionnement du GPHG ?

Nous avons enregistré cette année 86 marques pour un total de 234 montres inscrites. La présélection est effectuée par notre Jury international composé de 25 membres de 15 pays différents. L'inscription au GPHG est de 500 CHF par montre participante. Les montres présélectionnées lors du premier tour de vote participent à notre exposition itinérante. Des frais de participation de 5'000 CHF sont demandés pour chaque montre retenue. Le jury se réunit à Genève quelques jours avant la cérémonie pour procéder au deuxième tour de vote et désigne sur bulletins secrets et en présence du notaire les lauréats des différents prix, qui sont de sa compétence.

**Un jury d'expert est donc chargé de sélectionner les montres en compétition ? Sur quels critères est basé leur choix et comment ce jury est-il composé et définit ?**

Le Jury est composé d'une vingtaine d'experts en horlogerie, concepteurs, horlogers, journalistes, collectionneurs ou encore détaillants, auxquels s'ajoutent quelques personnalités du monde des arts et du design, qui viennent élargir les compétences des experts et apporter une vision différente. Le jury est renouvelé d'un tiers ou d'un quart chaque année.

**Le public aussi peut participer au GPHG en votant sur le site internet : [www.gphg.org](http://www.gphg.org) ?**

En effet, le public est invité à désigner sa montre favorite parmi les soixante-dix montres présélectionnées. En participant au vote pour le Prix du Public, qui a lieu sur notre site internet, [www.gphg.org](http://www.gphg.org) et dans les divers lieux d'exposition, les votants prennent part automatiquement à un tirage au sort pour gagner une montre.

**Est-ce « un vrai plus » pour une maison horlogère de gagner l'un des prix décernés lors de la cérémonie du GPHG ?**

Oui, la conquête d'un prix est largement médiatisée dans la presse spécialisée et constitue une véritable rampe de lancement pour une marque ou un nouveau modèle. Pour les marques déjà bien affirmées elle témoigne de leur capacité d'innovation et de leur durabilité dans le marché des grands.

### **Qui pour présider cette année la cérémonie du GPHG ?**

Jamais deux sans trois. Frédéric Beigbeder tiendra cette année encore le rôle de maître de cérémonie, toujours bien accompagné. Cette 14e cérémonie aura lieu en présence notamment du Monsieur le Conseiller Fédéral Johann Schneider-Ammann, Ministre suisse de l'Economie et de l'Ambassadeur du Japon en Suisse, pays qui sera l'invité d'honneur cette année.

**Est-il possible pour les passionnés d'horlogerie d'assister à la cérémonie de remise des prix ?**

Oui, les personnes qui souhaitent assister à la cérémonie en direct peuvent en faire la demande au secrétariat de la Fondation, la meilleure solution étant cependant de suivre la cérémonie en live sur notre propre site internet, sur Euronews.com, Hodinkee.com ou encore Léman Bleu Genève notre télévision locale, car le Grand Théâtre de Genève ne peut accueillir que 1500 personnes et nous ne pouvons pas satisfaire toutes les demandes.

## **Une montre favorite pour le Grand Prix de l'Aiguille d'Or cette année ?**

Les voies d'un Jury sont impénétrables... et je m'interdis de faire un pronostic. D'ailleurs le Jury lui-même ne connaît pas les gagnants avant la cérémonie, même après avoir délibéré. Après discussions, les jurés votent sur bulletins confidentiels confiés à un huissier, seul dépositaire des résultats avant la cérémonie officielle.

# Dans les coulisses du Grand Prix d'horlogerie de Genève 2014

Le Grand Prix d'horlogerie se tient à Genève ce vendredi. L'un des jurés, Patrick Wehrli, a accepté de nous en dévoiler les coulisses...



Patrick Wehrli est l'un des 25 membres du jury du Grand Prix d'horlogerie de Genève. À la fois horloger et expert indépendant, il est également, depuis deux ans, membre du jury du SIAR, le Salón Internacional Alta Relojería, qui vient de fermer ses portes à Mexico. Pour Belles Montres, il a accepté de livrer quelques secrets de fabrication du Grand Prix de Genève, qui se tient ce vendredi 31 octobre.



Allons droit au but. Connaissez-vous déjà les gagnants de vendredi ?

**Patrick Wehrli :** Même pas ! Nous sommes 25, chaque juré vote de manière anonyme et indépendante, auprès d'un notaire. Nous ne savons pas comment chacun de nous a voté. Nous avons donné des notes à chaque montre sélectionnée, le notaire

est en train de faire les comptes et les gagnants seront ainsi connus dans trois jours.

### **La sélection a-t-elle été compliquée, cette année ?**

**P. W. :** Compliquée, non, mais longue, comme toujours. Au premier tour, les marques nous soumettent plus de 200 pièces, qu'il faut toutes examiner une à une. Étant moi-même horloger et, en même temps, expert, je pose un regard très poussé sur chaque pièce. Le Grand Prix nous communique un catalogue, mais je préfère, autant que possible, voir physiquement les pièces.



### **Vous voulez dire que vous êtes en contact avec les marques pendant les délibérations ?**

**P. W. :** Bien sûr ! Chaque juré est libre d'apprécier les montres selon les moyens qu'il estime les meilleurs. Pour ma part, je vais parfois en boutique voir les pièces. Je m'annonce toujours comme l'un des jurés du Grand Prix, je joue cartes sur table. Certains vendeurs en ont été tétanisés, il m'aurait été plus facile d'arriver armé et de demander la caisse ! Dans d'autres cas, je me rends directement à la manufacture. Cette année, je l'ai fait pour Julien Coudray et Maurice Lacroix, que je connaissais moins bien. Ils ont pu m'expliquer leurs produits.

## **N'y a-t-il pas une tentation de corruption ?**

**P. W.** : Me connaissant, ce serait contre-productif ! Le GPHG est très ouvert, tout est publié. Nous sommes libres d'apprécier les pièces selon nos propres moyens. Les marques ont la même liberté pour nous apporter leurs arguments. Plus nous en savons, mieux c'est. Certaines marques nous appellent spontanément pour nous rencontrer, d'autres ont peur de franchir une ligne rouge.



## **Comment se déroule le vote ?**

**P. W.** : Il y en a deux. Le premier nous permet de faire la présélection des pièces le second, la sélection finale des vainqueurs. Le premier se déroule durant l'été, par correspondance électronique et postale. Les montres présélectionnées sont dévoilées à la rentrée. Là encore, nous apprenons les nominées en même temps que le public. Le second vote, final, a eu lieu ce lundi. Celui-ci est à huis clos et réunit physiquement tout le jury, à Genève.

## **Êtes-vous rémunéré pour ce travail ?**

**P. W. :** Non. C'est du pur bénévolat. Seuls les jurés venant de l'étranger sont remboursés de leurs frais de voyage, mais c'est tout.

### **Y a-t-il eu des surprises cette année ?**

**P. W. :** Pas réellement. L'année dernière, en revanche, on nous a soumis une montre... qui ne fonctionnait pas ! Nous n'en connaissons pas la cause, mais, une fois devant nous, nous n'avons pas pu la voir à l'oeuvre.



### **Qu'avez-vous fait ?**

**P. W. :** À nouveau, chacun est libre de faire comme il l'entend, de voter pour elle ou non. Toutefois, un juré un tant soit peu sérieux ne peut pas attribuer de points à une montre dont le balancier refuse de faire tic-tac...

### **Votre avis sur une pièce peut-il changer lorsque vous la voyez en vrai ?**

**P. W. :** C'est arrivé à quelques reprises, oui. Au premier tour, nous avons, encore une fois, plus de 200 pièces à considérer. Personnellement, je fais une première sélection, mais voir la pièce peut changer la donne. C'était le cas dernièrement d'une pièce que je n'avais pas repérée en visuel, mais qui, une fois en main, s'est révélée être extra-

plate. Là, au regard de cette approche technique très pertinente, elle est remontée dans mon trio de tête.

**Qu'attendez-vous des résultats de cette année ?**

**P. W.** : Je n'ai pas à attendre quoi que ce soit, mais j'ai été très satisfait des résultats de l'année dernière. Beaucoup d'indépendants ont été consacrés : Kari Voutilainen, Philippe Dufour, Vianney Halter. Je découvrirai, comme vous, les résultats 2014 ce vendredi !



Pour cette édition 2014, l'horlogerie classique et traditionnelle suisse sort grand vainqueur de ce grand-prix, car toutes les récompenses, hormis celle reçue par Seiko (japonais) et celle d'Urwerk (montre suisse, mais très moderne) l'ont été pour des

montres qui mettent en avant la très belle tradition horlogère de la confédération.

Le grand gagnant de cette édition est sans conteste le Groupe Swatch, et plus particulièrement sa filiale Breguet qui a remporté deux titres dont la plus prestigieuse d'entre eux : l'**Aiguille d'Or**. Les autres grands gagnants sont A. Lange & Söhne ou encore Urwerk.

### L'aiguille d'Or 2014

Comme dit précédemment, l'Aiguille d'Or 2014 a été attribuée à Breguet pour sa Classique Chronométrie. Ce garde-temps d'exception est particulièrement réussi, tant au niveau du mouvement (qui bat à 72 000 alternances par heure et qui dispose d'une réserve de marche) que du boîtier qui est en or rose avec un cadran couleur argent et les célèbres aiguilles bleuies. Ce chronomètre est donc à la fois esthétique et précis.



### Les autres lauréats

Bien sûr, lors de cet événement, d'autres titres ont été remis à d'autres lauréats. Partons dès maintenant les découvrir...

### Prix de la Montre Dame

Pour la Blancpain Women Heure Décentrée : cette montre magnifique et au design bien particulier est garnie de diamants, et son fond est en nacre.



#### **Prix Haute Mécanique pour Dame**

Pour ce prix, le GPHG a récompensé la jeune marque Christophe Claret, et en particulier son modèle de haute horlogerie, un brin magique, la Margot. La mouvement de la montre va faire disparaître de manière aléatoire des pétales à la manière d'un effeuillage.



#### **Prix de la Montre Homme**

Pour ce prix, le jury a décerné le titre à l'Urban Jürgensen & Sonner Seconde Centrale. C'est une montre à l'allure classique avec de belles aiguilles.



### Prix du Chronographe

C'est un chronographe bien particulier qui est le lauréat de cette année 2014. Cette De Bethune DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon dispose d'un affichage et d'un mécanisme exceptionnels pour une montre de ce type.



### Prix du Tourbillon

Pièce maîtresse d'un garde-temps de haute horlogerie, le tourbillon a donc son propre prix. C'est la Grönefeld Parallax Tourbillon qui l'a remporté avec son design moderne et son calibre G-03.



### Prix du Calendrier

Cette superbe pièce signée A. Lange & Söhne dispose d'une superbe fonction calendrier perpétuel et ce modèle s'appelle Richard Lange Quantième Perpétuel « Terraluna ».



### Prix de la Sonnerie



## GPHG 2014 : Les résultats



L'édition 2014 du **Grand Prix de l'Horlogerie de Genève** s'est conclue ce vendredi. Catégories très ouvertes, présence massive des **Big 3** (**LVMH**, **Richemont**, **Swatch Group**), multiples prix pour multiples complications, nominés de toutes les nations, indépendants et grands groupes : il y avait, statistiquement, de quoi récompenser tout le monde. C'est ce qui s'est produit. Après une audacieuse édition 2013, le **GPHG 2014** s'est montré consensuel et équilibré.



## Boutades et sorties de pistes

Il y eut, comme chaque année au **GPHG**, son lot de boutades et de sorties de pistes. Rien de grave, le **Grand Prix de l'Horlogerie de Genève** est une mécanique parfaitement rodée. C'est peut-être ce qui a permis à **Frédéric Beigbeder**, son animateur pour la troisième édition consécutive, de s'autoriser quelques traits d'humour. L'un, notamment, lors de la présentation de Sean Li, rédacteur en chef de « **Revolution Hong Kong** », fonction qu'il qualifia, sourire en coin, d'être « étonnamment d'actualité ».

On s'amusa quelques instants plus tôt d'un **Aurel Bacs**, brillant **président de jury**, mais qui rappela que les biens de l'usine **A. Lange & Söhne** furent spoliés après la Seconde Guerre Mondiale par « les socialistes », faisant un amalgame malheureux avec le régime communiste totalitaire plutôt concerné. En France, les politiques de gauche présents dans la salle seraient sortis. A Genève, personne n'a bronché.



## Et les grands gagnants sont...

Allons droit au but. **L'Aiguille d'Or**, récompense suprême, revient à **Breguet**. Le **Prix du Public**...à **Breguet** également. La **Montre Homme**, à **Urban Jürgensen & Sonner**, la **montre Dame** à **Blancpain**. Dans ce Top 4 fort convoité, le **Swatch Group** rafle donc trois prix. Le conglomérat horloger ne s'était pas présenté depuis sept ans au Grand Prix, le voilà probablement rassuré sur sa force de frappe.





## Niches indépendantes

Les marques indépendantes, elles, ont su se distinguer dans des niches bien précises. Elles confortent ainsi leur formidable capacité d'innovation sur des segments très spécifiques, nonobstant la présence de poids lourds contre eux. Ainsi **Christophe Claret**, qui rafle à la barbe de **Chaumet**, **Chopard** ou **Breguet** – et haut la main – **le prix de la complication féminines** avec sa **Margot** – sa toute première création pour femmes !

Il en va de même pour **De Bethune**, dont l'audace de la **DB29 MaxiChrono** a été acclamée devant les très conventionnelles **Chopard L.U.C.**, **Tudor** ou **Zenith El Primero**. Et **Urwerk** qui, avec près de 10 ans d'avance sur son temps, a propulsé son **EMC** à la victoire dans deux catégories, le **Prix de l'Innovation** et le **Prix de l'Exception Mécanique**.





## Horlogerie internationale

Cette 14<sup>ème</sup> édition a également été marquée par l'étonnante participation d'horlogers ou marques non suisses. C'est ainsi **Seiko** qui a remporté la **Petite Aiguille** (prix de la montre à moins de 8000 CHF), avec sa **Grand Seiko Hi-Beat 36000 GMT**.

C'est l'horloger d'origine finlandaise **Kari Voutilainen** qui a le mieux interprété, selon le jury, les « **Métiers d'Art** ». Et ce sont les frères néerlandais **Bart et Tim Grönfeld** qui ont emporté la mise très convoitée du **meilleur Tourbillon**.





#### Doutes et questions

Certes, on ne peut s'empêcher de noter quelques étrangetés. Parmi les jurés, deux membres sont des marchands, et donc commercialement intéressés aux résultats du Grand Prix. Un prix attribué à une marque constitue indéniablement un catalyseur de

ventes. Quelle a été la tentation de voter pour les marques que ces jurés distribuent dans leurs boutiques ?

Enfin, la question se pose sur le Prix du Revival, couronnant, selon le règlement, « une réédition ou réinterprétation contemporaine d'un modèle ancien emblématique ». En l'espèce, le prix est revenu à **Omega** pour sa **Speedmaster**, version **Dark Side of the Moon**. **Speedmaster**, comme on le sait, qui n'est jamais véritablement sortie du catalogue et a paisiblement suivi sa route technique et esthétique jusqu'à nos jours. Comment en ce cas parler de faire revivre (« revival ») une montre qui ne s'est jamais éteinte ?

Inutile de faire durer plus que nécessaire le suspense, la grande gagnante de cette édition 2014 du Grand Prix de l'Horlogerie de Genève est sans doute la marque Breguet qui s'est vu décerner la très convoitée Aiguille d'Or avec sa montre Classique Chronométrie, mais également le prix du jury grâce à sa Classique Dame...

La jeune marque horlogère Urwerk s'est elle aussi distinguée en remportant avec sa montre EMC, le prix de l'exception mécanique et le prix de l'innovation, deux prix qui vont certainement très bien aux deux fondateurs de la marque très tournés vers la recherche & le développement.

Pour MagMontres, les pronostics ne se sont pas réalisés extraordinaires puisque nous terminons la soirée avec la note de 4/14, peu brillant donc, mais le GPHG reste un concours de beauté, difficile alors d'élire les plus belles montres, tout reste bien sûr en partie subjectif, mais c'est comme ça, c'est l'art... A vous désormais de voir si vous auriez adopté la même position que le jury 2014 du GPHG...



### **Les "Oscars" des meilleures montres de 2014**

Et de 14 ! Voilà la dernière édition du GPHG bouclée, dans un Grand Théâtre de Genève qui sera bientôt trop petit pour accueillir les nombreux invités. Cette 14e cérémonie de ce que l'on surnomme souvent "les Oscars de la haute horlogerie" aura récompensé une douzaine de montres, classées selon les critères habituels (montre homme, dame, sport, etc.), mais pas seulement. En effet, pas moins de cinq nouvelles catégories ont été créées cette année : tourbillon, chrono, calendrier, sonnerie et la très floue "exception mécanique". En d'autres termes, tout le monde avait sa chance.



Pour la troisième fois consécutive, Frédéric Beigbeder animait la soirée, assisté de Miss Suisse. L'homme a véritablement pris ses marques et donné à la soirée la légèreté qu'il lui fallait. En revanche, grande nouveauté, la participation commune des "Big 3" de l'horlogerie suisse : Swatch Group, Richemont, LVMH. Cela faisait notamment sept ans que le premier n'avait plus participé.

## Émotions horlogères



C'est un homme de plus de 90 ans qui a ouvert la soirée : Walter Lange, couronné d'entrée de jeu par le Prix spécial du jury. Le clin d'oeil était évident aux vingt ans de la remise en route de la manufacture qui porte son nom, A. Lange & Söhne. "Herr Lange", fidèle à lui-même, s'est brièvement exprimé, en allemand, avec la dignité et l'élégance d'un homme qui a redressé

non pas une marque, mais une ville (Glashütte) et le fleuron de l'industrie horlogère germanique.



Trois autres lauréats ont eu la voix tremblante. Kari Voutilainen, finlandais, coiffe au poteau les poids lourds des métiers d'art en remportant le prix du même nom. Sa Hisui a demandé le chiffre astronomique de 1 000 heures de travail sur son cadran (réalisé au Japon) et son mouvement.

Autres indépendants, autre émotion : les frères néerlandais Bart et Tim Grönenfeld. Là encore, leur Parallax Tourbillon a vaincu les poids lourds du secteur, Breguet et Blancpain en tête.



Enfin, Pierre Jacques, CEO de De Bethune, s'est montré très ému. La DB29 MaxiChrono, avec ses 5 aiguilles centrales et son échappement à tourbillon avec silicium et titane a surclassé les autres prétendants qui, trop sages, avaient joué la traditionnelle carte du chrono bi ou tri-compax. "Il nous a fallu sept ans pour développer cette DB29. Nous ne serons jamais les locomotives de la production horlogère, mais, je l'espère, celle de la créativité", concluait brillamment le CEO.

Enfin, les connaisseurs attendaient sans grande surprise la consécration de Christophe Claret pour sa Margot. Là encore, la pièce survolait la catégorie "Haute Mécanique pour dame" avec une réelle aisance poétique comme technique. Il est rare qu'un indépendant, après 25 ans de carrière dans les hautes complications masculines, s'impose dès sa première montre féminine face aux spécialistes du genre, tels Breguet, Chaumet ou Chopard.





indépendante a raflé pas moins de deux prix avec... la même pièce, l'EMC ! Ce sont donc un Martin Frei et un Felix Baumgartner en baskets jaune fluo qui sont venus chercher le prix de l'Exception mécanique ainsi que celui de l'Innovation.

### **Surprises et déconvenues**

Comme tout Grand Prix, celui de Genève aura donc charrié son lot de déçus, voire d'incompris. On s'étonne de voir Hublot remporter la palme de la Sonnerie, essentiellement au titre d'une pièce conçue en titane. Surtout face à la très audacieuse Bvlgari Ammiraglio Del Tiempo ou la Soprano de Claret, avec carillon Westminster, quatre timbres cathédrale brevetés et quatre marteaux !

Enfin, on s'avoue surpris du Prix Revival attribué à Omega pour sa Speedmaster Dark Side of the Moon. Comme le soufflait, en off, un juré : difficile d'attribuer le prix d'une renaissance... à une montre dont la production ne s'est jamais arrêtée ! Les voies du jury sont impénétrables...

Dans la catégorie des bonnes surprises, on retrouve Urwerk. La jeune marque



Et le prix des prix, l'Aiguille d'or, est attribué à... Breguet ! La marque a ainsi fait coup double au GPHG 2014 avec le Prix du public et l'Aiguille d'or, décerné à la Classique Chonométrie. Mariage de tradition et de haute technologie, cette pièce horlogère incarne l'avenir de Breguet, notamment par son balancier à pivot magnétique et son échappement silicium cadencé à 10 Hz. Ces deux éléments, silicium et haute fréquence, résultent d'ailleurs de l'esprit visionnaire de Nicolas Hayek. Lequel aurait largement apprécié ce Grand Prix 2014, où son Swatch Group aura, au final, raflé un prix sur trois (deux Breguet, un Blancpain, un Omega).

#### GRAND PRIX D'HORLOGERIE DE GENEVE 2014 : le règne du classique

02 novembre 2014

A l'exception de l'EMC d'Urwerk, lauréate des catégories Innovation et Exception Mécanique, tous les vainqueurs du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie 2014 rendent hommage aux racines classiques de l'horlogerie suisse. Le Swatch Group sort sans conteste grand vainqueur du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève 2014. Breguet décroche la prestigieuse Aiguille d'Or avec son modèle Classique Chronométrie, ainsi que le Prix du Public avec la Classique Dame. Le nom de ces modèles prouve si besoin est l'ancrage dans le classicisme des récompenses attribuées cette année, avec encore les marques du Swatch Group, Blancpain et Omega, remportant les Prix de la Montre Dame et « Revival ». Esprit classique encore avec les prix décernés à De Bethune et A. Lange & Söhne - avec Walter Lange lui-même honoré par le Prix Spécial du Jury. La «Petite Aiguille», qui récompense une montre dont le prix de vente est inférieur à CHF 8'000.-, a été attribué au modèle Grand Seiko Hi-Beat, affichant lui aussi un design conventionnel. L'unique exception parmi ces montres classiques - qui seront toutes exposées au Salon QP de Londres la semaine prochaine - est l'EMC d'Urwerk. Et pourtant, là aussi, l'objectif premier de l'innovation technologique de ce modèle est de démontrer l'excellente précision d'un mouvement mécanique classique.


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
### BRÉGUET REMPORTE L'AIGUILLE D'OR GPHG 2014



**HUBLOT, ROGER DUBUIS, IWC, AP... TOUS À ART BASEL MIAMI**

Vendredi dernier, il y avait la foule des grands jours au grand théâtre de Genève où s'est tenu le 14<sup>e</sup> Grand Prix de l'horlogerie de Genève (GPHG). Au menu, excellence, innovation et expertise horlogère. Le jury international de cette nouvelle édition a remis 16 prix, dont la récompense suprême, "l'Aiguille d'or", remise à Bréguet (groupe Swatch) pour son modèle Classic chronométrie. Le conseiller fédéral Johann Schneider-Ammann qui a rendu hommage à la vitalité de l'horlogerie suisse, a officiellement remis le prix sur scène. La cérémonie, animée par Mélanie Winiger et Frédéric Beigbeder, a réuni 1500 invités, dont les figures majeures de l'industrie horlogère, des finances et de la politique, tous réunis pour cette célébration annuelle du 12<sup>e</sup> art. Cette édition a battu tous les records de participation, avec une présence de tous les groupes majeurs du secteur, ainsi que d'un grand nombre de sociétés indépendantes.

Art Basel Miami est devenu la plaque tournante incontournable du marché de l'art, mais pas seulement. Les horlogers également ont investi la place ces dernières années. Vacheron-Constantin, Roger Dubuis, Audemars-Piguet, ou encore Hublot. A l'occasion de l'ouverture de la boutique

### L'AIGUILLE D'OR DÉCERNÉE À BREGUET

L'excellence, l'innovation et le savoir-faire horloger ont été récompensés ce vendredi 31 octobre au Grand Théâtre de Genève à l'occasion de la cérémonie de remise des prix du 14e Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG). Le jury international de cette édition 2014 du GPHG a décerné seize prix et attribué l'Aiguille d'Or, distinction suprême, à Breguet pour le modèle Classique Chronométrie. Ce prix a été remis sur scène par le conseiller fédéral Johann Schneider-Ammann, qui a salué la vitalité de l'industrie horlogère suisse.

Présentée en duo par Melanie Winiger et Frédéric Beigbeder, la cérémonie s'est déroulée devant mille cinq cent invités, figures influentes des univers horloger, économique et politique, réunis à Genève pour cette célébration annuelle du 12e art. Cette 14e édition du GPHG a enregistré une participation record avec une représentation de tous les grands groupes horlogers ainsi que de nombreuses marques indépendantes.

Créé en 2001 et destiné à saluer annuellement l'excellence des créations horlogères mondiales, le Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève contribue au rayonnement de cet art et de ses valeurs de par le monde. ### Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève : Breguet triomphe



Alors que vous fêtiez peut-être **Halloween** le 31 octobre dernier, le Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève se tenait chez nos voisins suisses. De tous les participants, c'est **Breguet** qui a tiré son épingle du jeu, ou plutôt son aiguille, car le Français s'est vu récompenser de l'Aiguille d'Or pour son modèle Classique Chronométrie, l'une de **ses plus belles montres**.

L'horloger figure parmi toutes les listes de montres d'exception, aussi bien **les plus compliquées** que **les plus belles montres de poche**. Il n'y a donc rien d'étonnant à ce qu'il ait obtenu la reconnaissance suprême. Par ailleurs, le fabricant a reçu le Prix du Public grâce à sa Classique Dame, qui comme son nom l'indique a conquis les internautes ainsi que le public lors d'expositions internationales. Dans un paysage largement occupé par les maisons suisses, Breguet donne ses lettres de noblesse à l'horlogerie française mais les maisons helvètes dominent toujours les classements. Pour le reste, ce sont 17 récompenses en tout, qui ont été décernées sous

les yeux de Frédéric Beigbeder.

## **La tradition à l'honneur**

C'est la tradition qui l'emporte haut la main pour cette édition 2014 du prestigieux événement. C'est d'autant plus vrai que ce sont les maisons les plus anciennes qui trustent le reste du classement. Le palmarès des marques décorées comprend entre autres **Blancpain**, **Zenith** ou encore **Omega**, respectivement dans les catégories du Prix de la Montre Dame, du Prix de la Montre Sport et du prix "Revival". A l'exception de Zenith, ces marques ont toutes en commun de faire partie de l'écurie Swatch Group. Or le géant était absent du concours depuis près d'une dizaine d'années, ce qui n'a qu'exacerbé l'enthousiasme à l'égard de ses marques.

La prochaine étape pour les amateurs de belles montres se déroulera à Londres, pour le SalonQP, entre le 6 et le 8 novembre. Vous pourrez d'ailleurs y admirer l'ensemble des lauréats du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève exposés à la Saatchi Gallery.

### GPHG : Breguet remporte l'Aiguille d'Or 2014



Hier soir, lors de la 14ème cérémonie du Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève qui s'est tenu au Grand Théâtre de Genève, l'Aiguille d'Or, « la » distinction suprême de l'année pour une marque, a été remise à... 

# Aurel Bacs

## Living the dream

When it comes to living the dream, few people manage to do so as well as Aurel Bacs. It is not just that in 10 years as head of Christie's Watch Department auction figures increased twentyfold. Nor that he was asked to be President of the Jury of the most prestigious horology awards. Nor is it that the consultancy company he and partner Livia Russo created is inundated with work. And, incredibly, it is not even that he placed the winning bid at the auction of most expensive timepiece in history, the Patek Philippe Supercomplication Henry Graves Jr pocket watch, which went for a cool €20 million. No, what makes Aurel Bacs so lucky is that his work fills him with an excitement and enthusiasm akin to that of a child on Christmas morning. And that excitement was very evident when Blush caught up with him for a quick interview.

**Blush: You have now officiated as President of the Jury at two editions of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, arguably the most respected of all watch awards. How did you find the experience?**

**AB:** When I was asked to be president they assured me it was just like being a regular jury member with no other work involved, just a title. Actually, it is a lot of work! There are 25 jurors but the President is who everybody turns to. For instance I was invited to the presentation of the finalists in India in October. It is sort of an ambassador role; I feel as President I am a guarantor of the professional running of the jury. If people trust the president then they trust the event.

**B:** The level of secrecy surrounding the voting process at the GPHG is on a par with the Roman Catholic Church electing a pope. How important is that?

**AB:** To us the jurors and for the foundation directors it is key to the survival of the GPHG that manufacturers and the public knows this is an honest and professional vote, no manipulation is possible. Integrity and professionalism are key. At the GPHG we have the largest and most international horology jury ever united for a single event. More members means more

balanced voting. And having a jury from 13 different countries means members don't meet much during the year so they are not influenced, even unintentionally by others. We deliberate from 9am to 6pm with only the jurors and public notaries in the room. The vote is secret; you write what you want on a piece of paper and no one ever knows how you voted. This ensures the total freedom of every juror and that is why this competition is climbing in popularity exponentially in terms of numbers of people participating.

**Do you find it difficult to decide which watch gets your vote?**

**AB:** It is more difficult every year and more work but that means you have a vast landscape of manufacturers doing completely different things but at a very high level. Out of the six watches in the final it is very easy for me to say which one I like the most and least but we have to give them all points from 1 to 6 and each point counts. So it is just as important which watch you place second and third as first and last. The jury includes watch-makers, historians, designers, craftsmen – the full range. And each makes their own contribution. The historian might say: "Listen, this is a copy of something done 30 years ago." The designer might say: "I don't mind that the screws aren't perfectly paired – it's beautiful." Each different

viewpoint is so interesting. I am cooked at the end of the day but it is absolutely worth it. Watches take years to make from R&D through to manufacture. It wouldn't be fair if we just made a snap judgement.

**B: In your time as head of watches at Christie's Auctioneers, sales rose from US\$8 million to US\$127 million. You were hugely successful there and now your new venture, Bacs & Russo watch consultancy has taken off with partnerships including with Phillip's Auction House. What advice would you give someone seeking similar success?**

**AB:** In any job there are some key elements. You have to have passion. I realise it's a gift to have a job you love. I could never be so driven if I didn't love it. Do what you do with integrity and professionalism. Also, in today's world where everything is so immediately known through the media, don't cut corners. If you do, the world will know and you are done. The third element is the customer. There are no big or small customers; every customer is important. Four and five are talent and luck - you need them too. For example, I have a great passion for singing but no talent so passion alone is not enough!

**B: Watches are evidently a huge part of your life. How do you explain their fascination and**

**why people are willing to put the price of a luxury car or a home on their wrist?**

**AB:** I think it is absolutely reasonable [to spend so much on a watch]. What is value? Is €500 on a bottle of wine value? What about a painting? The [Patek Philippe Henry Graves Jr] watch that sold for €20 million took six years to design and build. It is the most complicated watch ever made without computers. It is historically the most important watch ever. Some people spend €30 million on a Ferrari, others €50 million on a Jeff Koons so why not on a watch? Do we need it? No. But then why pay for oil on canvas – you could just stick a poster on the wall.

**B: What watch are you wearing? Is it part of a big collection?**

**AB:** Tonight I am going to an elegant dinner so I have chosen a Patek Philippe 1953. I do have more watches than the average but like any collection, it evolves. Collecting is a dynamic process. I always have something on my wishlist and something I'm having second thoughts about. Some collectors have more than 1,000 watches but since they don't take up as much room as shoes they are the ideal collectable!

## **What is the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève for Aurel Bacs?**

It would be obvious to state that it is the most extraordinary event to celebrate in full the industrial sector - given the presence of so many manufactories along with several independent brands - and not just the Swiss one since other nationalities brands are awarded too, as evidenced by the last edition. And this definition does nothing but reinforce my basic concept: the GPHG is the biggest competition of international watchmaking in the world! And I think that the very fact of being a competition is one of its strengths. What is a competition after all? It is a contest between persons or groups who are looking with loyalty and determination for overcoming and conquering a record. And this constant pursuit of supremacy leads inevitably to an improvement and, consequently, to a search for excellence. The GPHG, then, focuses the competition on watches - which are my great passion - and so to be part of this event, first as a juror and currently as President of the jury, is not only a great pleasure and an honour, but also a sort of "duty" on two different levels: on one hand as an operator to contribute to the development of this wonderful project, and on the other hand as a resident of Geneva, leading city in the Country of watchmaking!

## **How has the GPHG changed this year?**

The GPHG is constantly evolving, and its precise mission is to improve and keep pace with the trends and developments in the market, to ensure adequate visibility to the watch production. For this reason, after 14 years, the format keeps being successful, as confirmed by the fact that, this year, over 240 watches have been presented! It is always amazing to realize that, despite the passing of the years and the growing number of players on the market, the industry is able to renew itself in the respect and preservation of its core values of excellence, innovation, precision and experience. For this reason it is necessary to constantly change the awards and categories, and for this edition we have also added a prize for chronographs, calendars, tourbillons, sonneries and what we have called "Mechanical Exceptions". Another GPHG asset is the jury, always very heterogeneous, which makes use of skills, capabilities, professional backgrounds and different cultures. Like every year, for this edition too, one fourth of the jurors has changed to ensure a proper turn-over of its composition, yet maintaining a solid base.

## **What is in the future of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève?**

I will tell you what the GPHG should become, in my opinion. For all that I have said so far, I think that the GPHG has all the features to be a lovemark as well as an export product with which to promote not only the watch industry, but especially the brand name "Geneva" in the world.

## BREGUET



One of the secrets of Breguet's success with women is that it creates real mechanical movements, sometimes with exceptional complications for its female clients, instead of just adding gemstones to an existing man's model. Breguet very soon made women equal to men in terms of watchmaking with a judicious combination of horological know-how and graceful styling.

## DE GRISOGONO



The newest addition to the Allegria jewellery collection is a square-shaped watch set with a firework of precious stones. Blending jewellery extravagance with watchmaking know-how, its interlaced gold rings act as a clasp, while the soft and custom-fit leather bands are available in a range of shimmering and tangy colours. As colourful as life, and as vibrant as love, Allegria asserts joy and happiness.

## DELANEAU



This creation captures delicate hand engraved magnolias in translucent Grand Feu enamel. Complementing an heritage in jewellery watchmaking, the 36mm white gold case is set with 78 diamonds and a diamond-embedded crown. Equipped with an automatic movement, a strap with white gold deploying buckle set with two diamonds, this exquisite timepiece totals approximately 1.38ct.

## HARRY WINSTON



Harry Winston introduces an enchanting new dial design that celebrates the brilliance and sparkle of the world's finest diamonds. Like a pointillist painter, the gem-setter creates an intricate composition using only brilliant-cut stones, replacing colors with the sparkle of icy white gems. This enchanting canvas demonstrates the Harry Winston's expertise in gem-setting.

## LAURENT FERRIER



Laurent Ferrier has decided to treat its emblematic Galet Micro-Rotor model to a feminine interpretation. The movement has remained unchanged and loyal to the stringent demands of Laurent Ferrier in the domain of mechanical horology and finishing. Meanwhile, the more distinctly rounded case comes in a 39 mm diameter to ensure a closer fit and even more comfort on a ladies' wrist.

Among the timepieces Breguet produces, those in the Reine de Naples collection have always been noted for lapsing into poetry. This impression is due to the unique shape of the case, but it could also be because each highly complicated watch is made only for women. Precious watches are inspired by nature, expressing a different dimension of time, of movement, of emotion and celebrating the savoir-faire of jewellers, engravers, stone-setters, sculptors, miniature painters and watchmakers who perpetuate and enrich the Maison's watch collections. Each timepiece embodies the extraordinary dreams, creativity, technical ingenuity and jewellery expertise of Chaumet.

At the heart of Chopard traditions, the Happy Sport Tourbillon Joaillerie watch showcases the vast array of exceptional skills cultivated within the Manufacture in Geneva. Haute Horlogerie and Haute Joaillerie thus combine to give birth to an entirely diamond-studded watch providing a precious backdrop for an L.U.C tourbillon movement.

CHRISTOPHE CLARET

The first Christophe Claret complication specifically developed for women. "He loves me... He loves me not." The elusive answer wafts in on a delicate petal, announced by a Tinker Bell-like chime. Behind the game, an enchantingly innovative complication specifically developed for women. Christophe Claret's Margot 'picks petals' with the simple press of a button.

Called Surya, in reference to the INDIA God of sun, the sun-shaped hour display is unique. It is the first hour display over 24 hours that shows the sun's path and the alternation of night and day. Simple to read yet fitted with a complex mechanism, this piece in Frédéric Journe's Solar Deity collection has two faces, corresponding to the day and night cycles.

Louis Vuitton is opening a new chapter in its Great Complications saga by offering a Tambour Monogram Tourbillon in white gold. The exceptional Tourbillon is seen as the most illustrious of complications and has become the ambassador for the Maison's watchmaking dimension. Pink gold makes way for white gold, but its manufacture mechanism remains unchanged.

# MEN'S

## BREGUET



The watch, in rose or white gold is fitted with the new Hand-wound calibre 574DR, which takes advantage of the latest developments from the workshops. This achievement was mainly due to its balance frequency of 10Hz. When it was applied for the first time in the Type XXII chronograph, this frequency was shown to have improved the time-keeping performance of the balance and spring.

## BULGARI



The Octo Finissimo's extra-thin Finissimo calibre was developed and manufactured in-house. This mechanical hand-wound movement, only 2.23 mm thick, is housed in the Octo case, a contemporary and architectural icon. With its hour and minute displays and a small seconds hand at 7:30, the Finissimo calibre provides a large torque that will accommodate various additional complications in the future.

## MB&F



Legacy Machine 101 embodies and accentuates the very essence of what is essential in a wristwatch: the balance wheel, which is responsible for regulating precision; how much power remains in the mainspring, which indicates when it needs to be next wound; and of course, the time. LM101 houses the very first movement developed entirely in-house by MB&F.

## OMEGA



In 1957, OMEGA introduced its Seamaster 300 for divers and professionals who worked underwater. More than half a century later, the Seamaster 300 has been reintroduced in a completely upgraded and enhanced form. The featured model is crafted from grade 5 titanium and 18K Sedna™ gold, a stunning alloy of gold, copper and palladium, whose unique rose gold colour is particularly long lasting.

## TUDOR



The TUDOR Heritage Black Bay derives its lines and its domed crystal from the TUDOR Submariner reference 7922, launched in 1954. It also owes to its ancestor its domed dial, a feature shared by the first TUDOR Submariner models, but which had since vanished. Its imposing winding crown is a nod to a model presented in 1958 under reference 7924 and dubbed "Big Crown" by collectors.

## URBAN JÜRGENSEN & SONNER



In a new variation of the extraordinary UJS-P8 detent escapement, the first detent escapement ever created for a wristwatch, the choice was made to renew and connect with the history, tradition, experience and pursuit of accuracy at Urban Jürgensen & Sønner, a quest which has been at the heart of the brand's existence since the 18th century.

The rose-gold case of the DB29 with its smooth curves features the brand's trademark cone-shaped lugs with closer strap attachments ensuring optimal comfort on the wrist.

A patented chronograph function enables the Montblanc TimeWalker Chronograph 100 to perform a feat that's seldom achieved by mechanical timepieces: it can measure elapsed intervals to the nearest 100th of a second. To accomplish this, the watch relies on the Montblanc Manufacture's nearly century-old competence for measuring intervals to the nearest 100th of a second.

Emblematic of OMEGA's bold style, the all-black OMEGA Speedmaster "Dark Side of the Moon" is a sleek and sporty new addition to the brand's iconic chronograph collection. The 44.25mm case in brushed and polished ceramic, fashioned from a single block of black ceramic, is complemented by a matching black ceramic dial crafted from black zirconium oxide.

The TUDOR Fastrider Black Shield, a distillation of strength and virility matched with supreme reliability. In this spirit, and to accompany the launch of the TUDOR Fastrider Black Shield, TUDOR—in collaboration with its partner, Ducati—has customized the one-of-a-kind Diavel Carbon model with a black matt finish on the whole motorcycle and bronze highlighting on the details.

A movement well-known to collectors beats at the heart of the latest Zenith watch: Calibre 410. Created in 1969 as a variation of the legendary El Primero, it combines the performances of the world's most accurate automatic chronograph with triple calendar and moonphase indications. Steadily perpetuated over the years, it now appears in a form bridging past and present.

# TOURBILLON

BLANCPAIN



The new Calibre 242 takes things to a new level by further improving on the record-breaking autonomy of Calibre 25 unveiled in 1998: the world's first self-winding tourbillon with an 8-day power reserve. The new self-winding tourbillon movement has an exceptional 12-day power reserve guaranteed by a single barrel. 243 parts united within just a space just 6.10 mm thick and 30.60 mm in diameter

BREGUET



Breguet's Classique Tourbillon extra-plat automatique returns to the stage nobly dressed in platinum. Its looks are matched by ingenuity, for this extra-thin watch houses one of the more spectacular horological inventions – an off-centred tourbillon of which the lightened titanium carriage carries a Breguet balance with a silicon balance spring, as well as a specially developed escapement.

BULGARI



The quest for thinness has been one of the watchmaker's goals for a long time. By introducing the Octo Finissimo Tourbillon, Bulgari has reached a new milestone in the development of ultra-thin watches with a major complication: its 1.95-mm-thick movement makes this flying tourbillon simply the slimmest on the market – no others even come close – and the thinnest ever made.

GRÖNEFELD



The Parallax Tourbillon features: a flying tourbillon; tourbillon cage synchronised to large central seconds hand (with innovative mechanism to improve accuracy); push-to-set-push-to-wind crown; crown function indicator; hacking seconds; power reserve indicator; all stainless steel bridges; in-house movement; superlative hand finishing; multi-layered solid silver dial.

MONTBLANC



The ExoTourbillon Rattrapante combines a split-second chronograph and Montblanc's patented ExoTourbillon, which has a large balance that oscillates outside the tourbillon's rotating cage. The three-dimensional regulator dial is made of gold, decorated with grand feu enamel elements crafted in accord with the tradition of ultrafine watchmaking.

TAG HEUER



Tag Heuer's avant-garde haute horlogerie workshop has pulled off some of the most impressive breakthroughs in watchmaking history. In 2014, it takes a step beyond with the Carrera Mikropendulum Tourbillon – the world's first double tourbillon combining a mechanical tourbillon for the watch and a magnetic tourbillon regulation system for the chronograph, accurate to 1/100th of a second.

# CALENDAR

A. LANGE & SÖHNE



This horological masterpiece combines A. Lange & Söhne's benchmark precision, inventiveness, and design competence. Featuring an orbital moon-phase display, a perpetual calendar with the Lange outsize date, a power-reserve of 14 days, and a constant-force escape-ment, this extraordinary time-keeping instrument represents the pinnacle of Saxon watchmaking artistry.

BREGUET



Breguet's watchmakers created a new perpetual calendar model: the reference 3797. In it, they have paid particular attention to the styling for a more intuitive display of the indications. The amount of information displayed on the dial can be confusing, so Breguet has added a third dimension. By lifting the hours and minutes chapter, the timepiece draws attention to the essential information.

JAQUET DROZ



The Eclipse, a poetic masterpiece of Fine Watchmaking, is one of the brand's most iconic timepieces. This year, Jaquet Droz craftsmen in La Chaux-de-Fonds masterfully paired the moon phase complication, which displays the fascinating cycles of the night of the sky on the dial, with the Perpetual Calendar: a finely orchestrated union which raises these two complications to a new level of elegance.

MONTBLANC



The Montblanc Meisterstück Heritage Collection is inspired by the ninety-year heritage of the Meisterstück. With classical design, discriminating complications and sumptuous decorations, these elegant timepieces manifest the values of the Montblanc Meisterstück and the traditional features of fine Swiss watchmaking in every detail – thus making them their owners' lifelong companions.

VAN CLEEF & ARPELS



This new Poetic Complication timepiece provides a miniature representation of the movement of six planets around the sun and their position at any given time. The planets are set in motion thanks to a self-winding mechanical movement of great complexity: equipped with an exclusive module developed in partnership with the Maison Christiaan van der Klaauw, it contains 396 separate parts.

ZENITH



Stemming from fruitful cooperation between the Musée International d'Horlogerie and the Manufacture Zenith, the Captain Winsor Annual Calendar Boutique Edition combines the most precise series-produced calibre with a complication that is both useful and innovative: the annual calendar. Its creative mind is Ludwig Oechslin, curator of the MIH in La Chaux-de-Fonds.

# STRIKING

BREGUET



The reference 7800 Classique "La Muscale" watch, is fitted with Breguet's self-winding 777 movement with a silicon escapement and balance spring. Yet when the button at 10 o'clock is pressed or when a set time has come, this Classique model plays Badinerie, composed by Johann Sebastian Bach as the final movement of his orchestral suite N°2 in B minor.

BULGARI



Four hammers and gongs, a minute repeater and a Westminster chime. Activated by an innovative repeater slide, the striking mechanism of Bulgari's new Grande Complication model L'Ammiraglio del Tempo, is presented with a detent escapement and a constant-force device; the latter is a regulating organ that embodies the ultimate level of horological complexity.

CHRISTOPHE CLARET



The Soprano features a musically accurate 4-note minute repeater striking Westminster Quarters on patented cathedral gongs, a 60-second tourbillon and Charles X style bridges, all on a spectacular dial-free view. It pays homage to the roots of Christophe Claret's manufacture, which has innovated in striking complications, tourbillons and sapphire components since its earliest years.

CLAUDE MEYLAN



CLAUDE MEYLAN takes its inspiration from the great tradition of our Valley and creates « La Répétition 5 ». With its pure and timeless curves associated with the romance of sounds, "La Répétition 5" introduces a new sculpture playing time. The magic of the mechanism combined with the melodies take you to a new dimension where time becomes a space of your own and filled with your senses.

HUBLOT



Born of the desire to pursue an independent route enabling Hublot to design and produce its own movements, the brand has now unveiled its second Minute Repeater coupled with a tourbillon. Exhibiting a marvellous balance between the classic style of its two major complications, this piece is a fine exercise in style that demonstrates the principle of fusion between Tradition and Modernity.

URBAN JÜRGENSEN & SONNER



The Tourbillon Minute Repeater allows the user to call upon it to signal the time when desired. This is accomplished by pushing a sliding lever located on the side of the case at 9 o'clock, thus activating the chiming mechanism. The watch uses two gongs. It features hours, minutes, minute repeater, seconds, tourbillon, a power reserve of 40 hours and beats at 18000 variations / hours.

# MECHANICAL EXCEPTION

ANDREAS STREHLER



With only four components, Andreas Strehler achieves almost eternity. Only almost, because the Lune perpétuelle's phase of the moon mechanism does require an occasional adjustment. To be quite precise, it requires an adjustment by ten minutes every 14000 years or by one day every two million years. This adjustment is made through the crown and also works backwards.

HUBLOT



The MP-05 "LaFerrari" was developed entirely in parallel with the car, alongside the Ferrari teams. They share a number of common points. Able to boast no fewer than 637 components for the movement, which is also equipped with a Tourbillon, as well as a power reserve of approximately 50 days thanks to its 11 barrels arranged in a line just like a spinal column and interconnected.

JAQUET DROZ



The Bird Repeater represents two Blue Tits, symbolic of Pierre Jaquet-Droz's native Jura region, together over the nest containing their fledglings. In another nod to the origins of the Manufacture, the Saut du Doubs waterfall also figures on the dial of this new horological treasure. Fully animated by a mechanism of unequalled complexity, this three-dimensional picture truly comes to life.

MB&F



Oscillating on high, the exalted double balance wheels of LM2 were inspired by, and pay homage to, one of the rarest mechanisms in the history of watchmaking: the dual regulator. And rarer still, the average rates of Legacy Machine No.2's dual regulators are transmitted by a differential to a single gear train, where the majority had two separate movements.

TAG HEUER



In 2004, Tag Heuer unveiled the Monaco V4 concept watch, the world's first watch with patented belt drives, linear mass and ball bearings. In 2014, building on its top-secret development of transmission belts no thicker than a single hair, it takes its creation to the next level, juxtaposing its patented belt technology with one of the most emblematic complications of watchmaking: the tourbillon.

URWERK



EMC is the world's first precision mechanical watch in which the timing can be monitored and adjusted by the user to suit their lifestyle. Fully 100% mechanical and fully interactive, it features a deconstructed dial with 4 separate indications: a precision indicator; seconds dial; hour and minutes; power reserve. Turning EMC over reveals the in-house movement with integrated circuit board.

The collection of Grand Prix de Monaco Historique watches is composed of three precision instruments intended to support drivers. This high-performance range is composed of three models: the Chrono, the Automatic and the Power control, all dedicated to the most prestigious of the classic Grand Prix races. Together, they embody Chopard's passion for racing as well as its demanding horological standards.

The Montblanc Meisterstück Heritage Collection is inspired by the standards of the Montblanc Meisterstück. Like the legendary fountain pen, these timepieces are distinguished by masterly craftsmanship, timeless design and perfect functionality. The Montblanc Meisterstück Heritage Collection embodies the finest Swiss watchmaking in each and every detail.

SEIKO

Since its birth in 1960, Grand Seiko embodies the pure essence of watchmaking: high accuracy, legibility, and reliability. Every Grand Seiko watch shares these values and has its unique combination of functional beauty and design purity. With sales rising rapidly since its global launch in 2010, Grand Seiko is increasingly recognized as one of the world's great luxury watch brands.

Born in 1963 from the imagination of Jack Heuer, the Carrera collection was inspired by the legendary "Carrera Panamericana Mexico Road Race," the world's most grueling open-road endurance competition. ## BELL & ROSS



The BR126 VINTAGE SPORT HERITAGE GMT FLYBACK aviation chronograph is fitted with a Flyback making it possible to instantly restart the measurement of time and a GMT function displaying a second time zone in 24-hour format.

## BLANCPAIN



Born in the late 1950s from a desire to offer a diver's watch in a size suited to daily wear, the Bathyscaphe was reinterpreted by Blancpain in 2013. This year, the timepiece that is equally at home under water and in chic urban settings takes on board a new self-winding F385 movement featuring a flyback chronograph function.

## HUBLOT



The watch is a Classic Fusion Aero Chronograph limited to just 500 pieces, with 45 mm polished/satin-finished ceramic case, and an automatic mechanical Aero Hublot chronograph movement. The sapphire dial has faceted and polished indices and transfers in silver powder and yellow. Pelé's famous signature is found on the watch's case back.

## TISSOT



Tissot's pioneering spirit is what led to the creation of tactile watches in 1999. In touch with the technology it bears, the Tissot T-Touch Expert Solar's design is truly modern and dynamic with strong lines, whether straight or angular. The push buttons are given an ergonomic aspect, while the milling provides the strap with further modernity and a better grip to the bezel on which it also features.

## TUDOR



Inspired by a historic model, also named Ranger, which the brand produced in the late 1960s, this new model embodies the unique creative approach developed by TUDOR to showcase its heritage in 2010 with the launch of its Heritage Chrono. Far from being a mere re-edition, it is a distinct reinterpretation, a true temporal and stylistic encounter of past, present and future.

## ZENITH



The new El Primero Lightweight is distinguished by its carbon case featuring an original and complex construction. It combines flowing dynamics and lightness while displaying exceptional power, very much like the most appealing automotive bodywork. Its sapphire crystal reveals the exceptional 'engine' inside: El Primero Calibre 400B Titanium, roaring at a speed of 36,000 vibrations per hour.

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## Breguet Wins Top Honours at Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève

On Friday October 31st in the **Grand Théâtre de Genève**, on the occasion of the 14th Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) prize-giving ceremony, an international jury handed out 16 prizes, including the supreme "**Aiguille d'Or**", distinction, which was awarded to **Breguet** for the **Classic Chronométrie** model.

Around 1,500 guests, including collectors, watchmakers, journalists, designers and international retailers, such as Seddiqi and Singapore's Hour Glass, attended the ceremony.

This 14th edition of the GPHG registered a record participation with representation from all the major watchmaking groups as well as a number of independent companies.

Nominated for the GPHG's grand finale along with 71 other timepieces, the Breguet Classique Chronométrie competed in the Men's category. The luxury brand owned by Swatch group also won the Audience Award for the Breguet Classique Dame, and together with Swiss brand **Urwerk**, who won the Mechanical Exception Watch Prize category with its EMC, and the Innovation Watch Prize award, were the only two brands to take home two awards.

This edition celebrated the classic styles of the winning models and the recognition of the work of small independent companies, such as **Urban Jürgensen & Sonner** and **Voutilainen**, as well as Japanese **Seiko** with its iil Grand Seiko Hi-Beat model, which won the Petit Aiguille award, a category dedicated to watches under 8,000 francs.

After New Delhi and Beijing, the exhibition of the watches pre-selected by the jury was on show in Geneva and ends in London.



### Breguet, el gran vencedor del GPHG 2014



A tenor de los resultados es evidente que Breguet puede considerarse como el gran vencedor del GPGH (Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève) de este año 2014, ya que se ha llevado los dos premios más importantes: L'Aiguille d'Or, el máximo galardón que se concede en el certamen y el "Public Prize", que como dice su nombre se otorga mediante votación popular.

Este certamen, del que este año se cumple su 14<sup>a</sup> edición, tiene como fin premiar a los relojes más destacados del año en 18 categorías, lo cual es sin duda una buena idea e iniciativa para el sector. El "como", el "quién" y el "porqué", personalmente me parecen como mínimo cuestionables.

El jurado, que es quién decide en todas las categorías menos en la del "Public Prize", se designa "a dedo" y realmente desconozco cuales son los criterios que se siguen para ello. Y evidentemente, los resultados son cuanto menos sorprendentes, por no decir que dudosos.

Hay que mencionar que los relojes que se someten a elección los eligen las mismas marcas (1 por categoría) que deciden concursar en el evento. La única restricción es que se deben haber presentado después de marzo del 2013 y antes de noviembre del 2014, un periodo poco lógico y confuso, ya que abarca la feria de Baselworld del 2013 (25 de abril a 2 de mayo), pero no se si la del 2014 (27 de marzo 2014 a 3 de abril). Por contra, está claro que solo abarca el SIHH del 2014.



La “**Aiguille d’Or** Grand Prix”, que es el máximo galardón que se concede, ha recaído este año en el **Breguet Classique Chronométrie**. Sin duda se trata de un gran reloj, que además del clasicismo y elegancia típicos de Breguet aporta una buena carga de tecnología avanzada con su frecuencia de oscilación de 10 Hz. Es una decisión respetable y merecida, aunque este año se han presentado algunos otros relojes que podrían poner en brete esta elección.

Claro que a Claret ya se le ha concedido el (merecido) premio "Ladies' High-Mech Watch Prize" por su Margot...

Lo que ya me parece surrealista es que se conceda el premio "Revival" al "Speedmaster Dark Side of the Moon" de Omega, que a pesar de ser un gran reloj, no tiene absolutamente nada que ver con el Speedmaster original o histórico. Menos comprensible resulta cuando la misma Omega había presentado también el Seamaster 300, que emula con gran fidelidad el Seamaster original y que además incorpora una impresionante carga tecnológica en su interior.



Pero lo más asombroso es que el “Public Price” se haya concedido al Breguet Classique Dame. Mi asombro no viene porque no lo considere un gran reloj, viene porque se me hace realmente difícil de creer que se haya concedido a un reloj femenino, cuando, lamentablemente, el porcentaje de féminas aficionadas a la Alta Relojería no llega ni al 0,1% del total. ¿quien ha votado entonces?....

También resulta algo decepcionante que, además de otras muchas marcas, ni Patek Philippe, ni Vacheron Constantin, ni Audemars Piguet presenten ningún reloj a concurso en este certamen. Habría que preguntarse seriamente el porqué....

### GPHG 2014: os finalistas na categoria ‘Turbilhão’



De acordo com as regras da edição de **2014** do **Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève**, a categoria de **turbilhão** inclui relógios que apresentem pelo menos um **turbilhão** e que podem incluir também **outras complicações**. Apresentamos hoje os **seis finalistas** que procuram um lugar ao sol nesta categoria nos apelidos óscares da relojoaria.

O turbilhão é um dispositivo que visa compensar os efeitos da gravidade no mecanismo e assim contribuir para a precisão do relógio. Quando foi inventado (por Abraham-Louis Breguet em 1801), o turbilhão fazia especial sentido, tendo em conta a sua aplicação ao relógio de bolso e a sua constante posição vertical. No domínio dos relógios de pulso, esta complicaçāo tem sido posta em causa enquanto utilidade, embora concursos de cronometria contemplem mesmo relógios com turbilhão. Polémicas à parte, a verdade é que em relojoaria de pulso o turbilhão é um dispositivo particularmente apreciado e respeitado e são muitas as casas relojoeiras que fazem questão de o introduzir nos seus instrumentos do tempo.

No contexto do Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève deste ano há outras categorias que incluem relógios com turbilhão (categoria de cronógrafos, por exemplo), mas as peças

finalistas na categoria turbilhão em si, evidenciam bastante esta complicação. O júri não terá uma tarefa fácil. Os seis relógios finalistas oferecem diferentes abordagens de turbilhão, todas elas exímias.

Dois dos modelos em causa são particularmente simples: o Blaincpain Villeret e o Bulgari Octo Finissimo apresentam o turbilhão num mostrador limpo com apenas as horas e os minutos. Nestes dois casos, a utilidade do turbilhão é ainda mais discutível já que nem os segundos os relógios apresentam. Sendo assim, a precisão é aqui um aspeto secundário. No entanto, o facto de no Bulgari se tratar de um movimento ultraplano e o facto de no Blancpain se tratar de um turbilhão voador são por si só características técnicas notáveis.

O caso do Breguet é um pouco mais concensual, pois combina o turbilhão, com as funções base (inclusive segundos) e com a reserva de corda. As decorações são sublimes, um aspetto tão característico da marca, e o movimento de corda automática torna-o particularmente usável no dia a dia. Se neste caso quisermos fazer referência a um caráter inovador, talvez seja mais complicado, até porque existem outras peças mais flagrantes neste sentido – caso do impressionante Carrera MikroPendulum da TAG Heuer. De aspetto desportivo e com soluções técnicas fora de série, este é certamente um dos candidatos mais fortes à conquista do almejado galardão, ainda para mais quando sabemos que o grande vencedor do Auguille d'Or na edição do ano passado foi precisamente o notável Mikrogirder da marca suíça (veja [aqui](#)).

Mas há ainda dois fortes candidatos: o Montblanc ExoTourbillon – cativante pelo conjunto de complicações e pelo turbilhão em si – a original ponte ‘torcida’ e o balanço de grandes dimensões, que a marca refere ser o único que é maior do que a própria gaiola, são alguns dos aspetos a destacar neste modelo; por outro lado, refira-se a estética clássica com misto de sofisticação – e o misterioso Gonfled que supreende pelas soluções técnicas de cortar a respiração, nomeadamente a sincronização da gaiola com o ponteiro dos segundos, e pelos excelentes acabamentos.

No final, fica realmente a certeza de que esta é uma das categorias em relação às quais temos mais curiosidade.

**E**l pasado 31 de octubre, el mundo de la Alta Relojería volvió a darse cita en el Grand Théâtre de Ginebra con motivo de la Gala de entrega de premios del Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Gineve, el evento que cada año sirve para clausurar oficialmente la temporada relajista y a la espera de que buenas parte de las grandes firmas del sector presenten sus nuevas creaciones en la siguiente edición del Salón Internacional de la Alta Relojería.

Una vez más, los 1.500 invitados al evento entre los cuales, importantes personalidades tanto del mundo de la relojería como de la sociedad suiza se divertieron con la simpática presentación del escritor y crítico francés Frédéric Beigbeder, que volvió a ejercer de

maestro de ceremonias, acompañado en esta ocasión por la actriz y modelo suiza Melanie Winiger.

Sin embargo, el protagonismo de la jornada se lo llevó la manufactura Breguet, que en su vuelta al Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Gineve se llevó tanto el Premio del Público -por su pieza femenina Classique Dame- como l'Aiguille d'Or, el galardón que distingue al mejor reloj del año.

El modelo que mereció tal reconocimiento por parte del jurado internacional de esta edición, formado por profesionales y expertos del sector de la relojería, fue el Classique Chronométrique, un reloj que refleja el espíritu innovador de la firma heredera del genio de Jean-Antoine Breguet. El reloj, elaborado en oro rosa o blanco, incorpora el nuevo calibre de carga continua 574DR, dotado de un escape integramente elaborado en silicio que le permite alcanzar una frecuencia de 72.000 alternancias por hora y, en consecuencia, una precisión óptima. Sin embargo,

su innovación más significativa es el uso de pivotes magnéticos para minimizar la perturbación estásida del órgano regulador (oscilador) más sofisticado sobre este sistema en nuestra sección de Técnica).

En cuanto al reloj Classique Dame, que fue el más votado por el público a través de Internet y en las exposiciones de Pekín y Nueva Delhi, donde pudieron verse piezas de la colección de la firma heredera del genio de Jean-Antoine Breguet. El reloj, elaborado en oro rosa o blanco, incorpora el nuevo calibre de carga continua 574DR, dotado de un escape integramente elaborado en silicio que le permite alcanzar una frecuencia de 72.000 alternancias por hora y, en consecuencia, una precisión óptima. Sin embargo,

o no me quiere-, la usuaria del reloj debe presionar un pulsador situado en la parte inferior de la corona o dos pétales de la manecilla que decora la parte central de la esfera desaparecen suavemente y, en cambio, en una ventanilla situada a las cuatro horas aparece aleatoriamente una respuesta en francés: "Un peu" (un poco), "beaucoup" (mucho), "justement" (apenas/adamantemente), "à la folie" (locura) o "pas mal" (no mal). La pieza también viene acompañada de un repique del mecanismo de sonería que Claret ha incorporado al mecanismo (sin duda, una de sus especialidades). Presionando un segundo pulsador situado a las cuatro, la manecilla recupera todos sus pétales y las respuestas desaparecen de la ventana.

Por su parte, Christophe Claret comenzó el Blancpain anteriormente mencionado se ha incluido en el Especial Máquinas Femeninas de esta misma edición.

Para cerrar el póker de los premios principales del Grand Prix, el jurado decidió conceder el galardón al mejor reloj masculino a la firma Urban Jürgensen & Sonner, heredera de una dinastía de relojeros daneses cuyo origen se remonta al siglo XVIII, por su modelo Central Second.

mas allá de su cuidada estética clásica, en el extraordinario calibre que late a 18.000 latidos de la cada detalle de escape de gatillo caro y utilizado en los cronómetros marinos desde su invención por parte de John Harrison en el siglo XVIII. Así pues, el nuevo movimiento es una evolución del calibre UJS-P8, creado en 2011, con el que la firma escandinava demostró que era posible adaptar el escape de gatillo a un calibre para reloj de pulsera.

Además de su gran precisión, el calibre ofrece algunas particularidades capaces de cautivar a los amantes de la técnica relojera, como el singular movimiento de la aguja de segundos, que salta en incrementos de 1/3 de segundo como lo hacen los viejos cronómetros fabricados por la marca.

### PREMIOS POR COMPLICACIONES

En los últimos años, el Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Gineve ha modificado en varias ocasiones las categorías en las que se dividen los relojes seleccionados para ajustarlos mejor a las distintas tipologías existentes. En esta última edición, uno de los cambios significativos fue la introducción de cuatro categorías relativas a sendas complicaciones relojeras: cronógrafo, tourbillon, calendario y sonería.

El premio al Mejor Cronógrafo fue para la firma independiente De Boullemeier, ganadora de l'Aiguille d'Or 2011 -para su modelo de Marca Oro-. Los resultados de este año de introducción y desarrollo por parte de los profesionales de la manufactura. Huyendo de las clásicas subesferas, este cronógrafo con monopulsador presenta cinco agujas centrales que permiten una lectura sorprendentemente cómoda de todas las indicaciones, cuyas escalas se ordenan concéntricamente en una esfera -a pesar de todo- de diseño clásico. Este formato permite contabilizar tiempos

largos, hasta 23 horas, 59 minutos y 599 segundos, el doble que en el caso de los cronógrafos tradicionales. Un movimiento de alta frecuencia (26.000 alternancias por hora) regulado por un tourbillon y dotado de un complejo sistema de tres ruedas de pilares garantiza, además, una gran precisión y una nada despreciable reserva de marcha de 120 horas.

El premio al Mejor Tourbillon, por su parte, fue concedido a la marca holandesa Grönfeld por su Parallax Tourbillon. Le da vida un movimiento de manufactura regulado por un tourbillon volante cuya caja está sincronizada con la aguja central de segundos a través de un sistema de engranajes que el protagonismo al tourbillon, los hermanos Tim y Bart Grönfeld lo han levantado respecto al movimiento y lo han situado por encima de la esfera. Ello justifica, sin duda, el acabado inmaculado de todos sus componentes, que requieren hasta tres días de trabajo.

La firma alemana A. Lange & Söhne, otra habitual en el palmarés del Grand Prix, se llevó, en esta ocasión, el premio al Mejor Reloj con Calendario por su Richard Lange Perpetual Calendar "Terraluna", un reloj que combina la indicación horaria propia de un regulador (esta información está contenida en una subesfera independiente aunque los minutos ocupan un lugar permanentemente en el calendario) con una indicación orbital de fase lunar y la gran función característica de la marca sajona (el día de la semana y el día del mes, así como el año de traspaso, pueden leerse en tres ventanas repartidas por la esfera).

El calibre L096.1 que se esconde en la caja de oro rosa del reloj no sólo se caracteriza por los elementos propios de la relojería sajona, de la que A. Lange & Söhne es uno de los principales embajadores, sino también por una impresionante reserva de marcha de 14 días, cuya evolución puede leerse en la esfera.

Por su parte, Walter Lange, Presidente Honórico de la manufactura alemana, recibió el Premio Especial del Jurado en reconocimiento a la labor realizada desde que en 1990 se lanció a recuperar la marca fundada por su abuelo Ferdinand Adolph Lange. Cabe destacar que la marca celebra este año su 150 aniversario, lo que la hace históricamente alejada de cualquier otra firma, a medio camino entre la relojería mecánica y la electrónica.

El último de los premios relativos a complicaciones concretas fue para la firma Hublot, que se llevó el galardón al Mejor Reloj con Sonería por su modelo Classic Fusion Cathedral Tourbillon Minute Repeater.

El segundo reloj de la firma que combina un mecanismo de sonería y un escape de tourbillon -el primero fue lanzado en 2010-, incorpora el nuevo calibre HUB 8001, íntegramente elaborado en la manufactura y perfectamente visible gracias a la eliminación de la esterilla.

Respecto a sus predecesores, el Cathedral Tourbillon Minute Repeater de la firma Suiza ya dejó en el sistema de competencia en hora y una mejor integración del escarpo que activa la función de repetición de minutos. La caja del reloj, de 45 mm de diámetro, se caracteriza por una estética elegante y contemporánea y está fabricada en titanio o King Gold, un oro exclusivo de la marca, con un 5% más de platino.

#### DOBLE ÉXITO PARA URWERK

El año pasado, Urwerk anunció la última joya salida de su laboratorio experimental U-Research Division,

denominada Martin Frei y Felix Baumgartner y diseñada según a su imaginación más extrema. Se trataba del mecanismo EMC (acrónimo de "Electro Mechanical Control"), equipado con un "ojo inteligente" y un oscilador eléctrico que permiten calcular el grado de precesión del volante, de modo que ofrece al usuario la oportunidad de ajustarlo aumentando o disminuyendo la velocidad de rotación.

Después de varios meses de trabajo, durante los cuales los ingenieros de la firma encararon el difícil reto de miniaturizar el movimiento. Urwerk lanzó este año el modelo EMC, un reloj estéticamente futurista y técnicamente alejado de cualquier otra creación, a medio camino entre la relojería mecánica y la electrónica.

El jurado del Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève valoró el esfuerzo de innovación de la firma independiente con el EMC y le otorgó dos premios: a la Excepcionalidad Mecánica y a la Innovación Relojera.

Incorporado al certamen en 2010, el premio *Petite Aiguille* se entrega al mejor reloj con un precio menor a los 5.000 francos suizos (aproximadamente 4.150 €). En esta ocasión, el honor recayó en la firma japonesa Seiko por su modelo Hi-Beat 36.000 GMT.

Piel a la vista. La firma Grand Seiko, que desde su creación ha buscado la perfección de la relojería, el modelo combina precisión -gracias al calibre de alta frecuencia 9S85, que late a 36.000 alternancias por hora-, legibilidad, belleza funcional y un diseño puro.

En cuanto al premio al Mejor Reloj Deportivo, fue otorgado a la firma suiza Zenith, que ya se lo había

llevado a casa el año pasado. En este caso, fue por el modelo El Primero Lightweight, una revisión vanguardista de su clásico cronógrafo El Primero de 1969 que reduce el peso para dejarlo en 100 gramos.

Para ello, los ingenieros de la manufactura recurrieron a materiales caracterizados por su ligereza: los puentes del movimiento están elaborados en titanio, mientras que el escape es de silicio, la caja, por su parte, es de carbono y aluminio, con los pulsadores de titanio. El esqueleto de la esfera no sólo contribuye a reducir el peso del conjunto sino que permite ver el movimiento de B Titanium, que late a 36.000 alternancias por hora.

El premio "Révélation" al reloj que mejor interpreta un modelo histórico fue para Omega y su cronógrafo Speedmaster "Dark Side Of the Moon", heredero del icónico Speedmaster que la firma lanzó en 1957. La referencia a la luna -muy presente en la colección desde que el reloj fue utilizado en seis misiones lunares de la NASA-, en esta ocasión deriva del profundo color negro de la esfera negra, elaborada en óxido de zirconio.

#### ARTESANÍA Y JOYAS


Es poco habitual en el Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève que uno de los relojes premiados esté equipado con un calibre de cuarzo, puesto que el elemento técnico tiene un carácter preponderante en la mayoría de categorías. Sin embargo, es el caso del Bulova Diva High Jewellery Emerald, un reloj femenino que, como no podía ser de otra forma, se llevó el premio al Mejor Reloj de Joyería.

Totalemte engastado con diamantes y esmeraldas, el reloj es una joya que rinde homenaje a las raíces joyeras de la firma italiana, que hoy es también uno de los grandes nombres de la Alta Relojería gracias a su manufactura ubicada en Neuchâtel.

Un ejemplo de impresionante era el modelo Hisui de la firma independiente Voutalainen, que se llevó el premio al Mejor Reloj de Artesanía por su espectacular esfera lacada, realizada por los artesanos del prestigioso taller Uriyuan, en Japón, bajo la guía del maestro K. Nakamura. El reloj, que tiene que ser tallado a mano, es de titanio, que resiste mejor que el acero de horas de trabajo, está incrustado en el jade y la esmeralda, y ha sido elaborado con materiales tan preciosos como el Kimpar (póalo de oro), el Yuumintakane (hoja de oro), el Yatou-gai (concha de Turbo Marmoratus) y Azuchi-gai (una orea de mar propia de Nueva Zelanda).

Tras la celebración de esta 14<sup>a</sup> edición del Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, el mundo de la Alta Relojería ya espera con ansia la siguiente edición del Salón internacional de la Alta Relojería, que se celebrará entre el 19 y el 23 de enero de 2015, y cuyos primeros adelantos ya han empezado a llegar a nuestras redacciones.

— Расскажите, пожалуйста, о деятельности Фонда GPHG, Президентом которого вы являетесь.

— Фонд Grand-Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève был создан в 2010 году с целью гарантировать официальную поддержку и долгосрочное существование GPHG. Учредителями Фонда GPHG являются Кантон Женева совместно с Государственным Советом Женевы, Международный Музей Часов в Ла-Шо-де-Фоне, главная часовья лаборатория Женевы (Timelab) и медиа-группа Edipresse со штаб-квартирой в Лозанне. С 2010 года Фонд Grand-Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève организует передвижные выставки часов, участвующих в Гран-При. На сегодняшний день выставки прошли уже в Шанхае, Гонконге, Пекине, Макау, Дубаи, Сингапуре и Москве.

— А по каким критериям Фонд GPHG выбирает города для своего мирового турия? И какие новые города вы планируете включить в свое расписание в ближайшем будущем?

— В 2014 году Фонд GPHG проведет выставки часов в Нью-Дели (26-27 сентября), Пекине (9-10 октября) и Лондоне (дата уточняется). Ключевыми критериями для того, чтобы выбрать новую страну для передвижной выставки, являются локальный интерес к швейцарским часам и важность данного рынка для часовской индустрии. Мы пытаемся каждый год вводить в наше расписание новые города, постоянно расширяя географию присутствия исключительного Искусства изготовления часов, но мы стремимся также укрепить свое присутствие в тех странах, где уже имели успех в прошлом. Очень важным, и, наверное, самым сложным пунктом является транспортировка драгоценных грузов, что является очень серьезной задачей в плане урегулирования административных и таможенных

вопросов, поскольку у нас есть четкие требования для обеспечения надежности и безопасности.

— Вы непосредственный участник эволюции развития швейцарских часов. Как вы могли бы охарактеризовать нынешнее состояние швейцарской часовой индустрии?

— В настоящее время промышленность изготовления часов поднялась на очень высокий уровень и способна поразить нас механизмами экстраординарной сложности, которые реализованы с высочайшей точностью. Это является отражением удивительного творческого потенциала наших часовщиков. Сегодня швейцарские часы представляют собой механическое чудо, сделанное с применением инноваций и самых последних технологий, и к тому же великолепно отделанное художественно. И именно по всем этим причинам мы решили дать изготовлению часов статус Двенадцатого Искусства.

— Но в последнее время в прессе часто имеют место обсуждения о необходимости замены стандартов «Poinçon de Genève». По вашему, это действительно необходимо?

— «Poinçon de Genève» или Женевская печать — самое древнее свидетельство аутентичности и качества в часовской индустрии, которое регулирует процессы изготовления, отделки и сборки часов. Для обеспечения превосходного качества, производимых в Женеве часов, эти критерии улучшались в течение многих десятилетий, а потому я считаю, что Женевская Печать существует и будет существовать, так как по-прежнему соответствует стандартам Международной Организации по Стандартизации (ISO), а часовые компании по-прежнему признают ее ценность и значимость и обращаются к ней как свидетельству высочайшего стандарта качества. ■■■

## **Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève 2014**

31 октября глобальная часовая закулиса подвела в Женеве итоги Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève. Жюри конкурса официально утвердило список лучших часов 2014 года и просмотрев его, вы можете соизмерить свои личные пристрастия с мнением коллектива, собранного при поддержке семейства Ротшильдов из самых маститых экспертов мира.

**GRAND PRIX D'HORLOGERIE DE GENÈVE**

Высочайшую награду по итогам голосования не менее высокого жюри получили часы Breguet Classique Chronométrie. Их ключевая особенность состоит в том, что они работают с частотой 10 Гц или 72 000 полуколебаний в час. За счет такой частоты инженеры Breguet попытались повысить стабильность и точность хода. Чтобы пружина баланса и другие части спускового механизма могли выдержать бешеную нагрузку, их изготовили с применением кремния. Отдельного слова заслуживает циферблат модели – такого разнообразия отделок вы больше нигде не найдете. Цена: CHF 39 000.



Приз за лучшие женские часы достался компании Blancpain. Симпатии часовых экспертов на свою сторону склонила модель Blancpain Women Off-Centred Hour. Главная характеристика часов — это децентрализованные часовая и минутная стрелки, а также ретроградная малая секунда, измеряющая 30-секундные отрезки. Модель получила великолепный бегель, упакованный сияющей спиралью из разноокалиберных бриллиантов. Цена: CHF 30 800.



Лучшими сложными женскими часами журнала признало уникальную механическую игрушку Margot, созданную Кристофом Кларе. Часы оснащены механизмом, позволяющим дать ответ на главный вопрос, который мучает незамужних девушек. Нажатием кнопки на «2 часах» либо один, либо пара лепестков в случайной последовательности исчезают под циферблатом, а в окошке, получившем название «Сила чувств» появляются каллиграфические надписи на французском: un peu (немного), бешосор (сильно), passionnément

(страстно), à la folie (сумасшедшая любовь) и раз du tout (всё не любят). Каждое нажатие кнопки сопровождается звуком гонга. Цена: CHF 278 000.



Титул лучших мужских часов завоевала датская марка Urban Jürgensen & Sonner. Победителем стала модель Central Second. С виду это просто классические часы, однако же у них очень интересная начинка. Компания использует в своих механизмах редкий стопорный спуск, в котором импульс на балансовое колесо передается напрямую, а не посредством рычага. Это

позволяет механизму идти с большой точностью. Если вы хотите, чтобы механизм ваших часов был не похож на 99,9% остальных часовских механизмов, то это модель для вас. Цена: Price: CHF 49 000.



Лучшим хронографом 2014 года стал хронограф DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon, созданный компанией De Bethune. Он не похож на все остальные хронографы системой индикации — все счетчики, которые обычно используются в часах такого типа убраны, а вместо них по периметру циферблата нанесена шкала с

60-ю делениями, которая используется для того, чтобы при помощи длинных тонких стрелок засекать секунды и минуты. В центре же разместилась шкала 24-часового счетчика. Механизм тоже представляет из себя нечто необычное — в нем используются три полунезависимых системы сцепления. Минутный счетчик регулируется качающимся трибом, часовой — стандартным горизонтальным зацеплением, секундный — вертикальным зацеплением, которое включается и выключается почти мгновенно, а значит и обеспечивает большую точность показаний. На каждый из перечисленных счетчиков приходится свое колесное колесо. При этом для запуска и остановки хронографа используется только одна кнопка. Помимо хронографа, часы укомплектованы турбийоном. Цена: CHF 270 000.



Турбийоном года стали часы Parallax изготовленные Тимом и Бартом Гренефельдами. Параллакс — это изменение видимого положения объекта относительно удаленного фона в зависимости от положения наблюдателя. Название модели выбрано в связи с тем, что голландские часовщики максимально приближили центральную секундную стрелку к секундной шкале и, таким образом, свели к минимуму возможность выставить точное время непривычно. Кроме того, пользователю очень помогает функция

одновременной остановки секунды и турбийона — когда часы переводятся в режим коррекции времени, стрелка и каретка турбийона автоматически перемещаются в положение «12 часов». Цена: CHF 167 250.



Лучшими часами с календарем признан «вечник» Richard Lange Perpetual Calendar Terraluna, представленный в 2014 году компанией A. Lange & Söhne. Самое главное в этих часах — индикатор лунных фаз, расположенный с тыльной стороны корпуса. Он состоит из трёх дисков: на центральном

изображена Земля, вокруг нее вращается диск со звездным небом, в котором проделано круглое окошко для золотой Луны, нанесенной на третий диск. Балансовому колесу в этой системе отведена роль Солнца. В новолуние полностью затмевший спутник Земли занимает положение между светилом и родной планетой. Диск с изображением Земли делает оборот вокруг своей оси ровно за один сутки и по ее положению относительно баланса, можно определить в какой части земного шара сейчас день, а где наступила тьма. Точнее определить время суток можно благодаря 24-часовой шкале, выгравированной по периметру небесного свода. Цена: CHF 216 800.

Репетиром года стала модель Classic Fusion Cathedral Tourbillon Minute Repeater, в которой компания Hublot использует свой собственный механизм с трубойоном и минутным репетиром. Разработчики этих часов удостоились награды за то, что смогли гармонично соединить традиционные сложные функции и современный авангардистский дизайн. Цена: CHF 230 000.

зависит от многих факторов – температуры, влажности, положения в пространстве – и Баумгартнер подарил людям возможность оперативно подстраиваться под эти параметры. Цена: CHF 118 000.



Самыми исключительными механическими часами года признаны EMC, созданные Urtwerk (эта же модель получила приз за инновации). Инструмент примечателен тем, что позволяет владельцу без помощи мастера регулировать точность хода. Механизм модели получил электронную надстройку, которая по сути является контрольно-измерительным модулем (EMC = Electro Mechanical Control), опираясь на его показания, пользователь может изменить длину спирали баланса и сделать ход часов точнее. Работа механизма, как известно,



«Малой стрелки» удостоилась компания Seiko. В Женеве признались, что японские часы Grand Seiko Hi-Beat 36000 GMT являются собой образец совершенства и удачное соединение технической изощренности с визуальной простотой. В этой модели используется высокочастотный механизм, работающий с точностью +8/-1 секунд в день. Его спираль выполнена из высокотехнологичного сплава Spring 610, который незосприимчив к магнитным полям и выдерживает сильнейшие нагрузки. Цена: CHF 7 750.



Лучшими спортивными часами были названы часы El Primero Lightweight, которые компания Zenith сделала из алюминия, титана и карбона. Это самый легкий из существующих ныне хронографов, его вес составляет фантастические 15,9 грамм. Внутри установлен высокочастотный калибр El Primero, тоже сделанный из титана, за счет чего его удалось облегчить на 25%. Цена: CHF 17 500.



Часами с лучшей декоративной отделкой была признана модель Hisui, созданная Кари Вотилайненом и его японскими партнерами. В отделке лакового циферблата они использовали золотую пыль, золотую фольгу и перламутр от раковин нескольких видов океанических моллюсков. Изготовление одного такого циферблата занимает больше тысячи часов, но цвет, а также его глубина и яркость заслуживают таких временных затрат. Цена: CHF 225 000.



Приз за ювелирное искусство достался компании Bulgari. Жюри гран-при так высоко оценило модель Diva High Jewellery Emeralds, декорированную бриллиантами и изумрудами. Цена: CHF 620 000.



Еще один приз взяла компания Омега. Он достался ей за хронограф Speedmaster Dark Side of the Moon, который представляет из себя переиздание легендарной исторической модели, только выполненное на современнейшем технологическом уровне. Корпус модели сделан из керамики, а стрелки приводятся в движение механизмом с коаксиальным спуском. Цена: CHF 10 800.



Приз зрительских симпатий тоже достался Breguet. Компания получила его за консервативные, строгие и дорогие часы Classique Dame. Цена: CHF 25 900.



PS В нынешнем году конкурс пополнился шестью новыми номинациями, а участие в гран-при вновь принесла Swatch Group. По количеству призов, взятых компаний (Breguet, Blancpain, Omega), можно сказать что принесла ее очень тепло.






Представляем вашему вниманию лучшие часы года, ставшие лауреатами главного часового конкурса Grand Prix d'Horlogerie, который прошел в Женеве 31 октября 2014. Подробности на интернет-портале FASHIONPEOPLE.RU.

Номинация «Лучший хронограф 2014» - модель De Bethune DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon. Эти часы отличаются от классических хронографов тем, что, вместо традиционных счетчиков, они оснащены центральными стрелками хронографа, движущимися вдоль шкалы, нанесенной по окружности циферблата. В центре же разместилась 24-часовая шкала. Хронограф управляет одной кнопкой, встроенной в заводную коронку. Модель оснащена уникальным механизмом (подана заявка на патент), в котором используются три полунезависимых системы сцепления. Специальная кнопка у отметки «4 часа» открывает заднюю крышку, позволяя полюбоваться необычным механизмом с турбийоном.

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
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## Победители часового конкурса Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Geneve

В Женеве в 14-й раз вручены призы часового конкурса Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Geneve. В этом году устроители конкурса добавили сразу шесть новых номинаций, так что количество призов выросло до 12 плюс собственно Grand Prix. Состав жюри в этом году изменился почти полностью, председателем стал руководитель женевского отделения аукционного дома Сотби's Орель Бак. В 2014 г. в конкурс вернулась крупнейшая часовья группа в мире — Swatch Group — и немедленно была вознаграждена: призы в разных номинациях достались входящим в группу маркам Blancpain и Omega, а Grand Prix — марке Breguet. В этом году в GPHG впервые участвовала русская часовья компания: марка Konstantin Chaykin представила свои часы в двух номинациях, но в шорт-лист они не прошли.

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## ЛАУРЕАТЫ GRAND PRIX D'HORLOGERIE DE GENEVE

Представляем вашему вниманию лауреатов главного часового конкурса года – Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève 2014, который прошел 31 октября в Женеве:

### Номинация «Лучший хронограф 2014» – модель De Bethune DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon

Эти часы отличаются от классических хронографов тем, что, вместо традиционных счетчиков, они оснащены центральными стрелками хронографа, движущимися вдоль шкалы, нанесенной по окружности циферблата. В центре же разместилась 24-часовая шкала. Хронограф управляется одной кнопкой, встроенной в заводную коронку. Модель оснащена уникальным механизмом (подана заявка на патент), в котором используются три полуавтономные системы сцепления. Специальная кнопка у отметки «4 часа» открывает заднюю крышку, позволяя полюбоваться необычным механизмом с турбийоном.



### Номинации «Исключительные механические часы» и «Инновационные часы» – модель Urwerk EMC

Эти часы представляют собой первый «разумный» часовой механизм. За названием модели таится разработка Electro Mechanical Control. Речь идет о первых полностью механических часах, заключающих в себе модуль оценки собственных параметров. По сути в часы встроен измерительный прибор, позволяющий владельцу получить точные и надежные данные о своих часах и отрегулировать точность хода без помощи мастера.

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# ОТ МАЛЕНЬКОЙ ДО ЗОЛОТОЙ НАГРАДЫ ЖЕНЕВСКОГО GRAND PRIX 2014 АЛЕКСЕЙ ТАРХАНОВ



Церемония Grand Prix d'Horlogerie проходит в Большом театре маленькой Женевы

В Большом театре Женевы состоялась традиционная церемония вручения премии, которую сравнивают с часовым «Оскаром» Швейцарии — Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève. Первая женевская награда в истории марки — у Bulgari, два приза подряд — у Urwerk и A. Lange & Söhne. Swatch Group получил целую серию наград, в том числе и гран-при — «Золотую стрелку». Церемонию, которую вели писатель и поэт француз Фредерик Бегбедер и «Мисс Швейцария» Мелани Виннеке, впервые удалось уложить менее чем за два часа, несмотря на нетрадиционное большое количество номинаций и традиционно длинные и запутанные речи политиков, приглашенных ради политеса.

## Двойная заслуга

В 2014 году конкурс преподнес немало сюрпризов. Первый из них — состав участников. В последние годы конкурс упрекали в том, что многие важнейшие игроки не принимают его всерьез. И это не только марки Rolex или Patek Philippe, которые считают, что им незачем участвовать в чем бы то ни было, если у них заранее нет первого места на пьедестале, причем по возможности — единственного. Их примеру следили и другие компании. Особенно — влиятельные. Стоило им не выиграть гран-при или получить не ту награду, что им хотелось, не в той номинации, как они поворачивались к призу спиной и объясняли, что ноги их больше не будет там, где их красоту и важность не могут оценить по заслугам.

Мне много раз приходилось слышать, что трудно себе представить «Оскар», на который свои фильмы присыпает Warner Brothers, но не дает MGM. Три

4008 Titane), впервые получил мосты из титана и кремниевый узел спуска. Корпус — из карбона и алюминия с титановыми кнопками запуска хронографа. Инженеры гордятся тем, что им удалось снизить 25% веса, не потеряв ни точности, ни прочности.

Другой пример хронографа — De Bethune DB29 Maxichromo Tourbillon, часы, победившие в номинации «Хронографы». На самом деле, как свидетельствует название, они могли бы оказаться и в категории «турбийонов», тем более что в конструкции Tourbillon 30 seconds De Bethune есть чему поучиться. Но в качестве сапфировочного хронографа эти часы имеют огромное преимущество — в качестве хронографических шкал используется главный циферблат. Что позволяет при запуске отсчитать время, почти разное 24 часам. Возможно, именно это качество позволило журю выбрать De Bethune среди таких сильных соперников в создании хронографа, как Chopard (L.U.C. 1963 Chronograph) или Zenith (El Primero 410).

Камни, скuptуры, лаки Большой победой обернулось в этом году участие Bulgari в категории ювелирных часов. Их Diva Emeralds High Jewellery — с 42 бриллиантами багетной огранки, 8 бриллиантами круглой огранки, 394 бриллиантами бриллиантовой огранки, 250 багетными и 8 крупными изумрудами — не просто часы с драгоценными камнями, как некогда звучала эта номинация, но настоящий пример высокого ювелирного искусства.

Это же механические часы, у них специальный кварцевый механизм швейцарского производства — и тем не менее это первый приз марки на часовом конкурсе. Вместе суператомными часами Осло марка очень достойно выступила на Grand Prix de Genève, и ее новый глава Жан-Кристоф Бабен не скрывал своего торжества. Хотя он не первый раз стоит на трибуне Большого театра Женевы (в прошлые годы он принимал премии в качестве руководителя TAG Heuer), но в год 130-летия марки Bulgari ее первый часовой приз очень важен. «Для нас особенная честь получить эту награду за модель, которая представляет собой одновременно шедевр часового и ювелирного мастерства», — сказал Жан-Кристоф Бабен.

В категории «Metiers d'Art — художественные ремесла» марки соревновались в основном в украшении циферблата. Chanel, Chaumet и Jaquet Droz использовали фигурационное искусство — от фигурок играющей на флейте китаянки в Chanel Cocoromandel Twin Volute Enchantee до бабочек у Chaumet Montre Precieuse Attrape-Moi... Si tu m'aimes et pitié у Jaquet Droz Petite Heure Minute Relief Saisons. В своих часах Alceste Millefiori мастера Немоис использовали более абстрактный красный цветочный рапорт. Марка Greubel Forsey, основанная десять лет назад античником Стилем Форси и французом Робером Требелем, выставила свои Art Piece 1, разработанные вместе со скульптором Биллардом Виганом. 55-летний античник Виган известен своими скульптурами, различимыми только под микроскопом, и потому в Art Piece 1 встроена лупа, позволяющая рассмотреть миниатюрную маску работы Вигана.

Жюри предпочло им всем часы Voutilainen Nissi — произведение независимого мастера-часовщика Кари Вутяйнена. Финн, работающий в Швеции, не раз получал премии на Grand Prix de Genève и считается образцовым механиком. Его часы давно стали классикой профессии, а на сей раз он показал себе достойного партнера, обратившись к мастеру лаковой росписи — специалисту по инкрустации японцу Китамуре. Он сделал для его призовой модели единственную в своем роде циферблат, сочетающую разные текстуры, и потребовал от него рассмотреть миниатюрную маску работы Вигана.

«Золотая стрелка» Самый главный приз в Женеве — Aiguille d'Or («Золотая стрелка»). Он дается вне категорий — мужским, женским, сложным, любым часам, отобранным в финале. Единственное условие — эти часы не могут стать победителями ни в одной конкретной номинации. Когда обладателя Aiguille d'Or был объявлен, стало ясно, что фаворитом в мужских часах был, скорее всего, не Urban Jürgensen & Sonner. И именно выход Breguet на «золотую стрелку», то есть за рамки категорий, оставил первое место марке, носящей имя датского часовщика, который переехал два века назад в Швейцарию. Это неплохой подарок, следивший за младшим сыном братьев Urban Jürgensen со стороны «старшего» Breguet. Как мастера мастеру, как часовщика часовщику.

— А в какой категории могут очутиться поэтические усложнения вроде тех, что делают Van Cleef & Arpels?

— В этом году есть две такие модели: Кристоф Кларе и Фредерик Жувено сделали веци с особыми игровыми модулями. У Жувено в Frederic Jouvenot Surya время показывают 12 лепестков цветка. У Кларе в Christophe Claret Margot каждое нажатие на специальную кнопку приводит в действие механизм гадания вроде «любит-не любит».

— Многие марки сейчас воздерживаются от Гран-при. Как это изменить и убедить часовщиков в том, что участие важнее победы?

— Для меня это очень важная задача. Чем шире будет участие, тем лучше. Ясно, что, если есть соревнование, одни выигрывают, а другие могут проиграть. Иногда, как это бывает в спорте, на долю секунды. Но Гран-при не должен восприниматься как беспроигрышная лотерея. Нужно, чтобы марки, да и все часовое сообщество, восприняли конкурс как семейное дело, место обмена, а не спора. Это же важно для них самих: если бы не было, скажем, «Формулы-1», многие технические усовершенствования в автомобилях никогда не были бы разработаны. А ведь там тоже есть победители и побежденные.

— Когда же, например, на конкурс придет Patek Philippe?

— Конечно, я сожалею, что такая выдающаяся марка воздерживается — по причинам, о которых я, кстати, ничего не знаю, — от участия в Гран-при. И это не только Patek Philippe или Rolex. Мы с вами можем легко назвать несколько очень престижных имен, которые сейчас в конкурсе не участвуют. Но зато есть и важные марки, которые решили вернуться в соревнование. Прежде всего Swatch Group. Это решительный шаг, и я его приветствую. Но не меньше я радуюсь и участию независимых марок. Понятно, что не стоит ждать всех подряд каждый год — у всех свои планы и свой ритм подготовки новинок, но миссия Гран-при состоит в том, чтобы объединить все мануфактуры, все группы. Grand-Prix de Genève должен стать зеркалом, отражающим состояние часовой промышленности.


— Почему вы покинули Christie's и занялись часовым конкурсом?

— Есть периоды в жизни, которые заканчиваются. Уходя из Christie's я подсчитал, что продал за время работы там 25 тыс. часов на \$1 млрд. Все это время обороты росли: когда я начал в 2003 году, это было \$10 млн, когда уходил — \$130 млн. У меня было ощущение, что для меня это слишком, я хотел уменьшить количество продаж и повысить качество вещей, с которыми имею дело.

— Но вы ведь все равно не сможете расстаться с аукционами?

— Коллекционные часы по-прежнему моя главная страсть. Я поддерживаю отношения с большинством коллекционеров, слежу за новыми продажами и даже в нихучаствую. Но Гран-при не менее важная работа для часовщика: все лучшие современные часы проходят через мои руки.



## GPHG 2014 – Official Pre-Selection

Seen any good watches lately? The jury for the 14th edition of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie, (which this year includes Hodinkee's Ben Clymer), have been locked away sustained only by Espressos, Perrier or Pellegrino for liquid sustenance as they debate, deliberate and determine the pick of the crop for 2014. It's been a hard fought summer but they have now delivered their initial verdict on what the runners and riders will be. They have whittled down a myriad of ambitious and pertinent timepieces to just 72 pre-selected choices which will now go forward to be considered for the coveted Aiguille d'Or, or Golden Arrow Grand Prix, the Oscars of the watch world which this year have seen more entries than ever before with strength in depth in each and every category.



## GPHG 2014 Countdown

But unlike the Oscars, where the selection panel makes often curious and sometimes perplexing decisions, the Foundation of the GPHG invites you, the consumer, to visit its [www.gphg.org](http://www.gphg.org) site in to discover the watches in the running. In addition to the “*Aiguille d’Or*” there are 16 other prestigious prizes up for grabs, each of which create excellent publicity for the winning watch brands.

Very much in evidence this year is the growth in independent companies vying for contention with ambitious new watches. Brands both large and small are given equal consideration, because judging criteria is not about the marketing power of the product, but the creativity and ingenuity of the design concept.

The travelling exhibition, which displays the watches to an appreciative global audience of connoisseurs and collectors, reflects the way in which up and coming BRICS countries have become vitally important new markets for luxury watches and so subsequently destinations which would not have been considered just ten years ago are now very much on the schedule, these include stopovers such as New Delhi and Beijing, in addition to the more usual venues of Geneva and London.

The tour will get under way in late September, stopping first in New Delhi on September 26th and 27th, where the exhibition will be on show at the Swiss Embassy and then at the Imperial Hotel. For the second year running, the Maison des Arts – Yishu 8 in Beijing will be presenting the pre-selected watches from October 10th to 12th 2014; while Geneva will as per tradition, host the exhibition's third stop-over in the Cité du Temps from October 23rd to November 2nd. For the last stage of the roadshow, the winning watches in all the many 2014 categories will be on display in London following the prize-giving ceremony at the [SalonQP](#).

So which brands and which models have made it through to the final 72? For the most part, it's no surprise to reveal that it's a pretty exclusive and rarefied field. Under the Men's section there is strong representation from the upper echelons of the mighty House of Swatch including the Breguet Classique Chronométrie, and the OMEGA Seamaster 300. But some fiercely independent brands are also up for consideration such as MB&F's Legacy Machine 101, and the Central Second from Danish/Swiss brand Urban Jürgensen & Sønner, a company owned by passionate and knowledgeable watch connoisseur Dr. Helmut Crott.

The watches are divided by complications. Under Chronometers this year there is the likes of the Chopard LUC 1963, the Zenith El Primero 410, and the much admired OMEGA Dark Side of the Moon.

For Tourbillons one has to wonder whether Jean-Claude Biver was on the jury (he's not). Many of the brands have had, or continue to have, the benefit of his input. This includes the Blancpain 12 Day One Minute Tourbillon, (Biver sold the brand prior to Hublot) the Bulgari Octo Finissimo Tourbillon (LVMH), and the TAG Heuer Carrera MikroPendulum Tourbillon (LVMH). Other contenders include clever Dutch independents Bart and Tim Gronefeld, Montblanc and Breguet.

Among the Sports watches category are Bell & Ross' BR126 Vintage Sport Heritage GMT Flyback, the Hublot Aerofusion Chronograph Pele which the legendary footballer wore throughout the World Cup in the summer, and a surprise contender from the Swatch Group's Tissot T-Touch Expert Solar – good to see representation from at least one watch which the average punter can afford.

You can decide upon your favourites by visiting the website and eyeing the form. When or if you decide to cast your vote for the Public Prize, **bear in mind that you only get one vote for one watch out of all the categories, not each category**, so take time to decide on your true overall favourite.

## The GPHG 2014 Attracts Record Participation

### All Watches at -80%

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The 14th addition of the most eminent watchmaking annual awards competition, Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, has attracted a record number of participants with all the major brands and a vast number of independent ones being present. Apart from the grand prize, Aiguille d'Or or Golden Hand in English, the submitted timepieces will compete for one of a dozen major and six auxiliary trophies. The jury of the competition which is headed by a horological expert, Aurel Bacs, and consists of 24 eminent figures from the field has already selected shortlists for each of the 12 major categories. The names of the winners of the GPHG 2014 awards will be revealed at a gala event which will be organized in Geneva on October 31.

During its 14 years of existence, Grand Prix d'horlogerie de Genève has secured its place as the most relevant selection of the year's best watches. As it is customary, all the submitted watches (whose number has reached the record amount this year), are in the competition for the **grand prize of the event – Aiguille d'Or**. Apart from the most important award, there is a certain number of major categories which are changeable from year to year. For the GPHG 2014 edition, there will be **12** of these brackets and the jury will pick the best models of the year in the following **groups**: **Ladies'** (the watches with no complications, the maximum of two indications and a jewelry limit of 5 carats), **Ladies' High-Mech** (which will reward the mechanical ingenuity and innovative complications), **Men's** (with restrictions equivalent to women's category), **Chronograph** (at least one stopwatch with any additional complications), **Tourbillon** (the same as the last one), **Calendar** (at least one calendar or a different astronomical feature), **Striking** (with audible representation of time and optional other complications), **Mechanical Exception** (for new features or types of display), **Sports, Jewelry, Artistic Crafts** (featuring some of the traditional artistic disciplines) and **Petite Aiguille**. The last one of these whose name translates to "Small Hand" Prize is especially interesting to the broader public, since it rounds up the most successful watches whose **price does not exceed 8,000 CHF** (which is roughly \$8,500).



## Additional and Optional Prizes

Apart from the major trophies, the GPHG 2014 will also award the **maximum of six auxiliary prizes**. These will be: **Innovation** (reserved for the piece from one of the dozen major categories which is presented with an innovative feature or design), **Horological Revelation** (optional accolade for a feat of a new brand or younger watchmaker), **Revival** (for revival or a contemporary reinterpretation of a classic model), **Special Prize** (which will be given to a person, an initiative or an institution and cannot be awarded to a model or a brand). There will also be trophies for the best timepiece in the **selection of the public**, as well as an accolade to the most successful student of the first year of the **Geneva Watchmaking School**.

As it is customary for GPHG, the winners will be selected by a jury which consists of top experts from various relevant fields. This year, the jury will be presided by an expert for both modern and vintage timekeepers, **Aurel Bacs**. Additionally, there will be **24 more figures of authority from different disciplines of horology**. Among them there will be a master watchmaker, Philippe Dufour, a horological author, John Goldberger, a historian of the Fondation de la Haute Horlogerie, Dominique Flechon, the director of the most relevant Mexican timekeeping event **Salon Internacional Alta Relojeria**, the founder of Hodinkee, Benjamin Clymer, a journalist, Elizabeth Doerr and others.



As the rules of the competition state, only the models which were available for sale after the March of the last year and prior to the next November are eligible for the prizes. While the deadline for submission was the end of June, the **shortlists of pre-selected six timekeepers in each of the categories** have been recently unveiled (we will cover each of the selections in detail in some of our upcoming articles).

The official ceremony where the list of winners will be disclosed is going to be held on **the last day of October at the Genevese Grand Theatre**. As it has been announced, the event will be **hosted once again by a French writer, critic and TV presenter, Frederic Beigbeder**. GPHG has also confirmed the presence of Swiss Federal official Johann Schneider-Ammann. However, Geneva will not be the only place to see the competing timepieces. Watches that have managed to find their way to the pre-selection list will initially be exhibited in two major cities in Asia. The first event will be organized in **New Delhi** on September 26 and 27. Members of the public will be able to see the top of the crop of this year's horology in **the Swiss Embassy and the Imperial Hotel**. Next in line is China, or to be specific, **Beijing** where the exhibition is going to be held from October 10 to 12 at the **Maison des Arts –Yishu 8**. The third stop is, naturally, **Geneva** where the watches will be showcased at the traditional venue – the Cite du Temps. Over here, the best timekeepers of the year will be shown a week before the unveiling of the winners and a single day after the ceremony is held. Finally, the last stop of the traveling exhibition is **London** where the winners of the GPHG 2014 accolades will be on display at **Salon QP**.

## 6 Watches Vie for Artistic Top Prize

A record 77 timepieces were pre-selected to compete for the Aiguille d'Or (or golden watch hand) at the **Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève**, and their manufacturers also hope to win in one or more of the 12 GPHG categories, such as Best Jewelry Watch or Best Tourbillon.

Aficionados will soon be able to see some of those pre-selected timepieces up close, as organizers take them to New Delhi on Sep 26-27 then to Beijing (Oct 10-12), before returning to Geneva (Oct 23-Nov 2), surprisingly by-passing Singapore and Hong Kong. The winners will also be exhibited in London at the SalonQP in November.

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At Boulain Lifestyle, we naturally take a particular interest in the **Artistic Craft category** to which a record 23 timepieces were entered, underlying the growing trend that started a few years ago amongst watchmakers to reach out to métiers d'art, and a final six have now been pre-selected.

**Chanel**, which won the category last year with the Mademoiselle Privé Camélia Brodé using the savoir fair of the Atelier Lesage embroiderers, is hoping to make it two years in a row with two new creations for the same "Mademoiselle Privé" collection: the Coromandel Twin watches (sold together) showcase sculpted mother of pearl and Grand Feu enameling on their dials.

**Jaquet-Droz**'s Petite Heure Minute Relief Seasons also offers a dial fashioned in hand-engraved mother-of-pearl with miniature hand-painted bird sculpted out of gold, while **Chaumet** is hoping the savoir-faire of its stone setters will draw the jury members' attention to a new attrape-moi...si tu m'aimes timepiece which depicts six fluttering butterflies in an intricate inlay of red carnelian, blackened gold and white wood.

Independent watchmaker **Kari Voutilainen** worked with Unryuan, a well-known lacquer studios in Japan for its Hisui timepiece that brings together gold dust and gold leaf techniques, Yakou-gai (shell of great green turban), and Awabi-gai (abalone shell from New Zealand).

**Hermès** reached out to its sister company, the Cristalleries Royales de Saint-Louis, for its Arceau Millefiori that uses a crystal technique usually associated with the creation of colorful paperweights to create a flowerbed in glass on the dial.

Finally, rounding up the contenders is **Greubel Forsey**'s Art Piece 1, a timepiece called Golden Sail. Its dial has been hand-sculpted in gold by British micro-sculptor **Willard Wigan** to represent a three-masted caravel, enhanced by an exclusive miniaturized optical system.

### In Conversation With Aurel Bacs, President, Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève

**Aurel Bacs, President of the Jury for the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, encourages the European watch industry to think beyond the next Baselworld launch.**

Aurel Bacs will require little introduction to those invested in the watch industry. For ten years he served as the outgoing International Head of Watches at Christie's, growing revenues from \$8 million in 2003 to \$126 million in 2012, an increase of 1575% in just a decade. Prior to joining Christie's he served at both Sotheby's and Phillips.

He is credited with creating a veritable retail experience at Christie's, with a focus on bringing the end-consumer to the auction house. Bacs was able to grow the auction pool from "50 European and North American collectors" – on which the market depended – to roughly 1000 active bidders in each sale. One of his most memorable sales was that of a unique Patek Philippe reference 1527, which sold for \$5.7 million.

His departure from Christie's in 2013 sent waves of speculation through the watch industry as to his next move. As 2014 draws near to a close, little more is known about his next steps. But his presence can still be felt in the world of Swiss watchmaking, as president of the jury for the 2014 edition of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève.

Ahead of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, we sat down with Mr. Bacs to gauge how the Haute Horlogerie segment is performing.

"I think the overall health of the high-end watchmaking market continues to exude strength."

**How would you describe the overall health of the Haute Horlogerie segment?**

The philosophical question of what constitutes Haute Horlogerie aside, I think the overall health of the high-end watchmaking market continues to exude strength. We have witnessed an explosion in terms of interest and awareness on five continents, when 150 to 200 years ago the buyers for high-quality watches only came from Europe.

In the 19th century America became the second continent for valuable timekeepers. In the 20th century, we had Asia becoming the third, then South America. We grew and grew and grew, and awareness for fine watches has grown beyond our wildest expectations.

There are some challenges, of course. If China is slowing it has an impact, the same can be said of Russia. I believe we should be very cautious. Brands cannot assume that every year the market can grow 5% to 10% as a given, but I would say we're possibly complaining today at a very high level.

**As the interest in watches has grown, so to have the number of offerings. Therefore, what do you personally define as a piece of true Haute Horlogerie?**

Haute Horlogerie is in no way linked to a price tag or to diamonds or the advertising you see in the press for a specific watch. Haute Horlogerie, in my view, is a discipline, a state of mind. A state of mind where the people who produce the watch stick to values surrounding the making of a watch. That deserves to be called Haute Horlogerie.

We have Haute Couture as another haute domain. There, I think things are much clearer in terms of who can call themselves Haute Couture and who cannot. It's defined. There are rules. There is in a board in Paris who decides which brands have the right to use this description and which do not.

I believe that in watches, it's not just about how expensive, or how many hands or third wheels a watch has. To me, it's about the authenticity of the piece. I'm not talking about authenticity in terms of whether it is made in Switzerland or in China. I'm begging the question; is it an original?

Is the product handmade or is it mass-produced by machines? How does the company – the watch manufacturer – treat its customers? Are they there 5 or 10 or 20 or 50 years later to help the client to service the piece? How transparent is their manufacturing process? How do they talk to their markets?

And how do the manufacturers treat their heritage? Are they respectful towards that history or are they ignoring it? Or

worse, are they even in denial? Are they preserving knowledge and savoir-faire? Are they instilling the values of the watchmakers who started their brand into the next generation? Or just forcing turnover and profits?

At the end of the day I can liken it to fine food. For me Haute Cuisine is as well handmade ravioli prepared by an Italian grandmother with love, who spent hours and hours in the kitchen on one dish, even though it is 'just' pasta. Haute Cuisine is not frozen foie gras served for €100 in an expensive restaurant, despite the 'haute' associations.

Basically its not just what we see, it is everything that surrounds the end product.

" How does the watch manufacturer treat its customers? How transparent is their manufacturing process? "

**Are there any trends that you have identified overseeing the 2014 Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève?**

We're in such a globalized world today, with so many different aesthetics, tastes, budgets and consumer needs that every brand can really create its own industry for each market according to their history and DNA. But globally, in terms of size, I am noticing that watches are slightly and gradually coming back from over-sized or super-sized watch designs.

I have noticed a lot of retro. Many brands have, without abandoning innovation, taken a moment to reflect and revisited the drawing board, thinking about their values and what originally made their brands strong. Innovation is also a trend in itself, but in terms of design we are seeing clearer proposals, more experienced design language, less confusing designs, which I think is healthy.

If I may compare this again to food, after the explosion of Haute Cuisine and molecular gastronomy, we are now shifting back to more organic food, with a focus on sourcing the most outstanding produce, often on a local scale.

To this effect I believe that the watch industry as a whole is no longer just thinking "I need to sell a watch for \$2 million because there is an oligarch or a new billionaire who will buy it". It's not necessarily about buying the 'caviar' of watches.

When you read the news today you realise there are important and difficult things happening in the world , it is not necessarily socially acceptable to feign ignorance and spend exorbitant amounts of money on frivolous things, which have explicitly been designed to be 'expensive'. So I think this 'overkill' approach of 'more is more' is coming to a slowdown, which is a welcome trend.

There are also a lot of innovations in terms of materials and of course technology. Selection is one of the key words these days, selecting materials that come from specific industries and applying them to watches. I think overall, all of these trends are positive for the consumers.

#### **Which nationalities are driving the most significant growth in haute horlogerie?**

There are several ways of seeing 'nationality' as a growth driver. It goes without saying that a nationality that has a population of 200, 300, 500 million or even a billion, will easily outweigh a region of the size of Switzerland with 7 million, simply in terms of sheer size.

At the same time, we have, today, amazingly different economic indicators to consider. For example, how is the country performing? What about GDP growth? Is wealth increasing or decreasing? What are the key socio-political trends? These are all very important, as a watch, per se, is not something you need in life, like fuel, bread or water. Haute Horlogerie is something you consider purchasing for yourself if you are doing well and feeling positive.

The third element relates to the level of understanding and education regarding watches, either Haute Horlogerie or otherwise. There needs to be a baseline appreciation and a certain level of knowledge to appreciate haute horlogerie, regardless of the economic situation. This knowledge is sometimes stronger in struggling economies, yet in flourishing economies, it is sometimes less present.

So it is these three elements combined that make a market an important player, not one sole driver; the size of the country, the economic performance of the country and it is the affinity towards high-end watches. The combination can give us sometimes very, very unusual results.

Hong Kong is a great example, and one that is still absolutely leading in terms of sales. Hong Kong is nowhere near the size of Germany or Brazil or India, but the market has a very high-level of understanding and a very strong economic backup, which gives Hong Kong all the ingredients to be a top market for valuable objects.

At the same time, just to give you another example, over the last decade I've witnessed countries like Indonesia become one of the greatest and the most positive surprise supporters of this domain. The economy has consistently outperformed European countries in the past decade, supported by over 300 million inhabitants with an incredible appetite for fine watches.

Then there are countries where the market will shift depending on what the president says one day and what the banks decide on another day, making the market a challenging but interesting moving target. China, of course, has had its ups and downs with the crackdown on corruption and gifting. But overall, as long as one market is slowing by 10% and another market is up by 10% – provided that they are of the same volume or size – then for the Swiss watch industry, it's neutral news.

**Beyond nationalities, how significant do you believe the opportunity is for complicated women's watches?**

Complications for women are undoubtedly the most challenging and interesting segment. Women, as we naturally understand, constitute 50% of the planet's population, so technically speaking we can tap into this market. We are seeing women's wealth increase, which is great news, obviously not only for the watch market. But there are many, many parameters to be considered in realising this opportunity.

Whether it is that – and I say regrettably – decision-makers in the household are still by a vast majority, male. There is also a question as to the level of interest that women may have towards a mechanical chronograph and mechanical perpetual calendar and a mechanical repeater, versus nice, stylish, practical watches that maybe even have a quantum mix.

I believe when you think of women and their past in the 20th century, how women have started to become CEOs, Prime Ministers, smoking cigars, driving SUVs, drinking scotch or joining the army, society is indeed changing. And the interests of women are changing, which I conclude will certainly be reflected in the years to come in their interest in mechanical, complicated watches.

One of the trends I have noticed is that women are looking for bigger watches. It was an absolute faux pas twenty or thirty years ago for a woman to wear a watch that was more than 25 millimetres in size. In fact, watchmakers would compete to be able to produce the smallest mechanical watch, which was also beautiful. Today women are wearing diver's watches, pilot watches, men's watches, as much as they drive Range Rovers and Harley Davidson motorbikes.

I think that the woman's watch as a concept is possibly going to be revived. Of course, nature will continue to suggest women's watches need to be smaller due to its own definition, a lady's wrist is smaller, but women also like SUVs for practical reasons, for status, for security. In watches, many women say, "Well, on the watch I inherited from my grandmother I couldn't even read the time. It's too small."

Sometimes maybe it's just that we need, as an example, an Oprah Winfrey to tell the world in her TV show that she's fascinated by wearing a mechanical split-second chronograph, and we may see that next week that women buy such a watch. Sometimes you just need that trigger. But eventually it will happen. I'm absolutely sure.

#### **And what about millennials? How can Haute Horlogerie engage the next generation of luxury consumers?**

I agree that Haute Horlogerie is a baby boomer market. There have been no world wars in some years, growth has continued despite a few bumps and hiccups, but overall the world population has been allowed to discover and enjoy the beautiful things in life. Travel is one of them. Art is another. 200 years ago, it was only the elite who could even consider such luxuries.

Today, art is something that has become much more democratic and accessible. You don't need to be a professor in art history to afford or enjoy art, nor a billionaire. Watches are no exception. Even though in hindsight we call it Haute Horlogerie, a wristwatch 50 years ago was not a collector's item.

For the moment, the baby boomers will support this market. But what is the next generation going to do? The next generation may not even want a mechanical wristwatch. They may want an Apple watch. They may want no watch at all and say, "My mobile phone in my pocket is actually doing everything that the grand complication of my grandfather is doing."

This is a challenge. This is a real challenge. I think the watch industry will survive despite the challenges and attacks from new gadgets and new time-telling devices. When you look at wine it is a unique beverage in the sense it does not address thirst, not like water or sports drinks do. Wines from Bordeaux and Tuscany don't quench thirst yet still they are here today, at the heights of their production because wine is considered culture.

Watches are culture too because it's no longer about time measurement. We all read the time on our dashboard in the car or a clock on the oven or on our smartphones. Instead Haute Horlogerie is an expression of culture and a level of sophistication within society. It is a celebration of beautiful things and an expression of education and savoir-faire..

#### **Overall, what do you feel are the most pressing challenges the industry is facing?**

First of all I think that Swiss or European high-end watchmaking should look much closer and listen more carefully to the needs of its clients, not just in the short term but also in the long term. An industry driven by immediate goals risks losing sight of the bigger picture., when the immediate goals are market share, sales, shareholder value and growth.

A lot of houses are not sufficiently thinking about what do they need to do in order to be well-positioned vis-à-vis the market in five or ten years from now. They are thinking about how to increase revenue and to perpetuate the stellar

performance of the industry over the past decade.

But I believe the industry needs to refocus on sustainability, on sustainable growth, to think beyond the next Baselworld launch or watchmaking competition. Perhaps brands should consider limiting growth, just as has been the strategy of some AAA car manufacturers or famous workshops producing maroquinerie. I know this is not the goal of any businessman, but we need to ensure the longstanding desirability of this non-necessity object, which no-one actually needs, especially not to tell the time.

The industry also needs to understand that year after year, consumers are much better informed and there is almost a demand or need for transparency. Watch manufacturers must realise that the times where you could just cut corners are definitely over in today's world.

That means that they can only adhere to the purest, most diligent, most sincere business practices if they want to create long-term loyalty and cultivate respect from their clients. Once you have decided to spend thousands, tens of thousands, or even hundreds of thousands on a timepiece, it's not just about the product. It's the manufacture, the knowledge, the retail experience and the after sale service.

**In terms of protecting the positioning of a luxury timepiece brand, at what point should growth be officially limited?**

It's an extraordinarily interesting question in my view. Personally, I don't think there should be a limitation to growth even though some brands have, in my view, pushed the limits too far. Volume can endanger the status of a brand but mustn't necessarily. And I say that because in many industries we see very successful examples of managing this balance. If you are a brand and you take your customer very seriously, you can grow without either ruining your image or ruining the idea of being a luxury to your consumer.

Take Rolex as an example, where it is believed that over one-million pieces are manufactured each year. There are official reports that can be found in the industry that confirm the number of chronometers that they have tested each year and the quantity of gold they are consuming for their production. And Rolex, in my view, is taking their client very seriously.

They offer an excellent product. And when consumers purchase their product they understand that they are not just one of a select few. They take their customer very seriously and offer an excellent product, thus they continue to be a luxury brand in my view.

Porsche is another good example in the car industry. It is a brand that remains a 'gold standard' in the industry in terms of quality and performance, despite the fact you will see many of their cars throughout the world. Porsche has really done their homework in terms of managing quality and pricing, alongside innovation and tradition, to show that 'luxury' can be done at numbers that Ferrari or Lamborghini couldn't even consider. So I think it can be achieved.

**Finally, what do you feel are the biggest opportunities facing Haute Horlogerie?**

The ever growing and opening markets in Asia, in South America and in Africa. Africa has not even been tapped in on the surface, in my view. There are an inordinate number of people who have not yet had the pleasure to discovering and explore Haute Horlogerie.

There are many people on the planet and there are many priorities, understandably. But with the markets coming together and communication now being so much easier thanks to the tools we have, I think that the watch industry can expect that the world-wide community will continue to grow, over the coming decade.

And this will be I think, enough growth. The industry must be careful to manage both the old loyal client and the new, and not lose sight of just chasing new markets or generations in the quest for growth. Brands must continue to be faithful to their clients, as they hope that their clients are faithful to them, to keep their own communities together.

Just like a shepherd must keep together his herd, the watch industry must look after every soul interested in timepieces. By giving them what they deserve and what they rightly can expect.

# Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève 2014: Live from Geneva !



November 12, 2014 by Olivier Müller

Another night in Geneva, another GPHG, « Grand Prix de l'Horlogerie de Genève ». That's how things went for the fourteenth time near the Leman Lake, in the Grand Theatre. There, hundreds of CEOs and watchmakers attended the celebration of fine watchmaking, embodied through a dozen of categories. These included the traditional « Men's watch », « Ladies watch », « Sport watch », etc. but also five new categories, amongts wich the Sonnerie, the Tourbillon or the « Mechanical exception ».

While the 2013 edition had been a huge success for independent watchmakers, tonight in Geneva the prizes were much more balanced. For the first time in seven years, the BIg Three were reunited – or, so to say, competing : [LVMH](#), [Swatch Group](#) and [Richemont](#). However, enter the contest only the brands that wanted to. Some might notice that major independents, such as Patek Philippe, Rolex or Breitling, did not send any of their watches. Afraid to lose ? We'll never know...

## GPHG 2014 – German touch and Bien feeling

At the very start of the ceremony, 90-years old Walter Lange was awarded for his major contribution both in resuming A. Lange & Söhne's activity 20 years ago, and in putting the city of Glashütte back on the horologic map. A few minutes later, an outsider came on stage : Urban Jürgensen & Sønner. The Danish brand won the coveted prize of Men's watch. The jury has probably awarded the quality of the Seconde Centrale as well as the fact that it's a marine chronometer especially designed and adapted for the wrist.

In Bien, the Swatch Group probably had a glass of Champagne. After 7 years out of the Grand Prix, the Group is back and won one third of the prizes, with two Breguet, one Blancpain and one Omega. But while the Swatch Group made a clean sweep, small independents also had the glory time. Amongst them, Kari Voutilainen, the

(Finnish) very esteemed watchmaker who won a women's prize with his Hisui, which both dial and movement required an amazing 1000 hours.

### **GPHG 2014 – Duets and brothers**

Also coming from the North, the Grönfeld brothers from Netherlands with their now award-winning Parallax Tourbillon. A pretty good bet, especially when competitors in this category included tourbillon masters such as Breguet.

Another duet, not of watchmakers but of prizes : the young independent manufacture Urwerk won two prizes at the time...with the same piece, the EMC ! The watch won the Innovation prize as well as the Mechanical Exception one. The EMC is the first timepiece ever combining a mechanical heart along with an electronic module, which allows the wearer to check the accuracy of his watch...and set it on his own, without the help of a watchmaker.

The young brand De Bethune also made a hole in the sky with its amazing DB29 MaxiChrono. The piece had been unveiled during the latest Baselworld and displays a chronograph with not less than 5 hands on the same dial, along with a very innovative in-house caliber. That's the second time De Bethune jumps on stage of Geneva's GPHG, proving that the brand is clearly becoming a trend-setter in the watchmaking world.



Christophe Claret awarded "Prix de la Haut Mecanique pour Dames"

Christophe Claret, on his side, had to wait all his life before coming on stage, and when he did, yesterday, that was for...his lady's complicated piece, the Margot ! The watchmaker, master in the ultra-technical field of men's complications, created last year a very poetic (and still technical) piece where ladies can pick the leaves of a daisy, as a very famous poem states in French. Next year will be the 15th edition of the GPHG, with, probably, more surprises to come !

### **Editor's Favorites: Top 6 Ladies Watches**

#### **1 – Champs-Elysées: Rive Blanche**



Offering timepieces of unmatched sophistication with a marquetry-worked mother-of-pearl dial and a shiny polished 18-carat rose gold cambered case, the RIVE BLANCHE collection reflects a bold step away from the classic round watch silhouette. The refined and sensual watch attracts with its cultivated and enigmatic form. The radiant roundness of the dial is enhanced by an alluring jewelled water

drop-shaped case. The most spectacular of the models shimmers with 412 round diamonds in a striking “snow setting”, whose seemingly random distribution elegantly features delicate waves.

## **2 – Mouawad Geneve: La Classique Lady Attitude**



With its oversized, stylized numerals that curl around the dial, « La Classique Lady Attitude » has innate glamour that appeals to the senses. Like a pointillist painter, the gem-setter creates an intricate composition using only brilliant-cut stones, replacing colors with the sparkle of icy white gems. This enchanting canvas demonstrates the Harry Winston's expertise in gem-setting and references the signature techniques used in the House's fine jewelry creations: the near-invisible claw-setting on the chatons ensures that nothing distracts from the beauty of each diamond; diamonds are placed on the dial using a snow-setting, demonstrating the gem-setter's skill and precision.

#### **4 – Louis Moinet: Stardance**



In order to create this timepiece, Louis Moinet had to be patient while waiting to obtain the extremely rare Enstatite EH3 meteorite, which contains nanodiamonds from space! What could be more romantic for the creation of a unique, elegant watch with the name 'Stardance'? The meteorite was then shaped by the most highly skilled artisans to indicate the phases of the moon. Stardance is an automatic watch with a design inspired by the worlds of day and night. The seconds hand is in the shape of the sun, while the moon phase is displayed against a starry night sky... The watch skilfully combines different materials including mother-of-pearl for the dial and aventurine for the moon phase sky. The titanium frame perfectly sets off the white gold bezel and diamonds.

## **5 – Hermès: Faubourg**



A secret allure. An elegance perfected in miniature. A very Parisian style. She is there tiny, a perfect jewel, glimpsed with a nonchalant gesture of the wrist. A surprising glimmer of metal on a fine band which embraces the arm – complicit, exquisite.

Equipped with an automatic movement, a strap with white gold deploying buckle set with two diamonds, this exquisite timepiece totals approximately 1.38ct.

## **Editor's Favorites: Top 3 Ladies Mechanical**

### **1 – Breguet: Reine de Naples Jour/Nuit**



Breguet's mechanical expertise is also on display, since this watch is fitted with the movement specially made for the Reine de Naples collection. Apart from indicating the hours and minutes it animates a whimsical representation of the hours of the day and night on a second dial. The two dials combine in a figure 8, a symbolic number in many cultures, which recalls the sign for infinity. A titanium moon is placed on a disc of lapis lazuli while the path of the sun is represented by the faceted rim of the balance-wheel that throws out rays of light. The sun moves according to the motion of the balance on a daylong tour of the Arabic Chapter ring before setting beneath the horizon of the steel bridge supporting the mechanism. Decorations on the disc add to

the enchantment with inserts of mother-of-pearl for clouds and the living gleam of gold stars.

## **2 – Chopard: Happy Sport Tourbillon Joaillerie**



At the heart of Chopard traditions, the Happy Sport Tourbillon Joaillerie watch showcases the vast array of exceptional skills cultivated within the Manufacture in Geneva. Haute Horlogerie and Haute Joaillerie thus combine to give birth to an entirely diamond-studded watch providing a precious backdrop for an L.U.C tourbillon movement.

This is a watch that single-handedly testifies to the entire history of a Manufacture. Epitomising the very core of the Chopard culture, at the exact spot where beauty meets precision, the Happy Sport Tourbillon is a radiant reflection of the most remarkable skills and hallmarks of the Geneva-based House. Combining the playful freedom of Happy Diamonds with the modern nature of the Happy Sport Joaillerie model, the Happy Sport Tourbillon embodies the skilled perfection of the Haute Joaillerie workshops with the technical virtuosity of Haute Horlogerie. Now making a noteworthy stage entrance, the Happy Sport Tourbillon Joaillerie beats to the pulse of innovation, creativity and artistic crafts

### **3 – Chaumet: Chaumet Hortensia Tourbillon Watch**



Precious watches are inspired by nature; a nature that is stylised, touching and bucolic, expressing a different dimension of time, of movement, of emotion and celebrating the savoir-faire of jewellers, engravers, stone setters, sculptors, miniature painters and watchmakers who perpetuate and enrich the Maison's watch collections. Each timepiece embodies the extraordinary dreams, creativity, technical ingenuity and jewellery expertise of Chaumet. The Hortensia collection blossoms with wondrous bouquets of gold and precious stones in creations that are an ode to eternal beauty. The dial of this diamond-set white gold watch reveals a tourbillon mechanism. The tourbillon is situated at 6 o'clock on a background of grand feu enamel decorated with a corolla of hydrangeas; each applied flower has been sculpted and hand-engraved, then enamelled with silver foil in its centre. A sapphire glass back unveils the hand-winding mechanical movement – a CP 12V-X caliber – featuring the hydrangea flower design on the upper disc and main plate. The alligator leather strap and its jaw pin buckle adorned with white gold and diamond-set hydrangea flowers is the perfect finishing touch for these subtly refined Haute Horlogerie timepieces.



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


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

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Aurel Bacs will require little introduction to those invested in the watch industry. For ten years he served as the outgoing International Head of Watches at Christie's, growing revenues from \$8 million in 2003 to \$126 million in 2012, an increase of 1575% in just a decade. Prior to joining Christie's he served at both Sotheby's and Phillips.

He is credited with creating a veritable retail experience at Christie's, with a focus on bringing the end-consumer to the auction house. Bacs was able to grow the auction pool from "50 European and North American collectors" – on which the market depended – to roughly 1000 active bidders in each sale. One of his most memorable sales was that of a unique Patek Philippe reference 1527, which sold for \$57 million.

His departure from Christie's in 2013 sent waves of speculation through the watch industry as to his next move. As 2014 draws near to a close, little more is known about his next steps. But his presence can still be felt in the world of Swiss watchmaking, as president of the jury for the 2014 edition of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève.

Ahead of the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève, we sat down with Mr. Bacs to gauge how the Haute Horlogerie segment is performing.

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#### How would you describe the overall health of the Haute Horlogerie segment?

The philosophical question of what constitutes Haute Horlogerie aside, I think the overall health of the high-end watchmaking market continues to exude strength. We have witnessed an explosion in terms of interest and awareness on five continents, when 150 to 200 years ago the buyers for high-quality watches only came from Europe.

It's another good year for luxury in Interbrand's Best Global Brands ranking, where 14 of 100 brands that placed were

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In the 19th century America became the second continent for valuable timekeepers. In the 20th century, we had Asia becoming the third, then South America. We grew and grew and grew, and awareness for fine watches has grown beyond our wildest expectations.

There are some challenges, of course. If China is slowing it has an impact, the same can be said of Russia. I believe we should be very cautious. Brands cannot assume that every year the market can grow 5% to 10% as a given, but I would say we're possibly complaining today at a very high level.

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**As the interest in watches has grown, so to have the number of offerings.  
Therefore, what do you personally define as a piece of true Haute Horlogerie?**

Haute Horlogerie is in no way linked to a price tag or to diamonds or the advertising you see in the press for a specific watch. Haute Horlogerie, in my view, is a discipline, a state of mind. A state of mind where the people who produce the watch stick to values surrounding the making of a watch. That deserves to be called Haute Horlogerie.

We have Haute Couture as another haute domain. There, I think things are much clearer in terms of who can call themselves Haute Couture and who cannot. It's defined. There are rules. There is a board in Paris who decides which brands have the right to use this description and which do not.

I believe that in watches, it's not just about how expensive, or how many hands or third wheels a watch has. To me, it's about the authenticity of the piece. I'm not talking about authenticity in terms of whether it is made in Switzerland or in China. I'm begging the question; is it an original?

Is the product handmade or is it mass-produced by machines? How does the company – the watch manufacturer – treat its customers? Are they there 5 or 10 or 20 or 50 years later to help the client to service the piece? How transparent is their manufacturing process? How do they talk to their markets?

And how do the manufacturers treat their heritage? Are they respectful towards that history or are they ignoring it? Or worse, are they even in denial? Are they preserving knowledge and savoir-faire? Are they instilling the values of the watchmakers who started their brand into the next generation? Or just forcing turnover and profits?

At the end of the day I can liken it to fine food. For me Haute Cuisine is as well handmade ravioli prepared by an Italian grandmother with love, who spent hours and hours in the kitchen on one dish, even though it is 'just' pasta. Haute Cuisine is not frozen foie gras served for €100 in an expensive restaurant, despite the 'haute' associations.

Basically its not just what we see, it is everything that surrounds the end product.

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**Are there any trends that you have identified overseeing the 2014 Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève?**

We're in such a globalized world today, with so many different aesthetics, tastes, budgets and consumer needs that every brand can really create its own industry for each market according to their history and DNA. But globally, in terms of size, I am noticing that watches are slightly and gradually coming back from over-sized or super-sized watch designs.

I have noticed a lot of retro. Many brands have, without abandoning innovation, taken a moment to reflect and revisited the drawing board, thinking about their values and what originally made their brands strong. Innovation is also a trend in itself, but in terms of design we are seeing clearer proposals, more experienced design language, less confusing designs, which I think is healthy.

If I may compare this again to food, after the explosion of Haute Cuisine and molecular gastronomy, we are now shifting back to more organic food, with a focus on sourcing the most outstanding produce, often on a local scale.

To this effect I believe that the watch industry as a whole is no longer just thinking "I need to sell a watch for \$2 million because there is an oligarch or a new billionaire who will buy it". It's not necessarily about buying the 'caviar' of watches.

When you read the news today you realise there are important and difficult things happening in the world , it is not necessarily socially acceptable to feign ignorance and spend exorbitant amounts of money on frivolous things, which have explicitly been designed to be 'expensive'. So I think this 'overkill' approach of 'more is more' is coming to a slowdown, which is a welcome trend.

There are also a lot of innovations in terms of materials and of course technology. Selection is one of the key words these days, selecting materials that come from specific industries and applying them to watches. I think overall, all of these trends are positive for the consumers.

### **Which nationalities are driving the most significant growth in haute horlogerie?**

There are several ways of seeing 'nationality' as a growth driver. It goes without saying that a nationality that has a population of 200, 300, 500 million or even a billion, will easily outweigh a region of the size of Switzerland with 7 million, simply in terms of sheer size.

At the same time, we have, today, amazingly different economic indicators to consider. For example, how is the country performing? What about GDP growth? Is wealth increasing or decreasing? What are the key socio-political trends? These are all very important, as a watch, per se, is not something you need in life, like fuel, bread or water. Haute Horlogerie is something you consider purchasing for yourself if you are doing well and feeling positive.

The third element relates to the level of understanding and education regarding watches, either Haute Horlogerie or otherwise. There needs to be a baseline appreciation and a certain level of knowledge to appreciate haute horlogerie, regardless of the economic situation. This knowledge is sometimes stronger in struggling economies, yet in flourishing economies, it is sometimes less present.

So it is these three elements combined that make a market an important player, not one sole driver; the size of the country, the economic performance of the country and it is the affinity towards high-end watches. The combination can give us sometimes very, very unusual results.

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Hong Kong is a great example, and one that is still absolutely leading in terms of sales. Hong Kong is nowhere near the size of Germany or Brazil or India, but the market has a very high-level of understanding and a very strong economic backup, which gives Hong Kong all the ingredients to be a top market for valuable objects.

At the same time, just to give you another example, over the last decade I've witnessed countries like Indonesia become one of the greatest and the most positive surprise supporters of this domain. The economy has consistently outperformed European countries in the past decade, supported by over 300 million inhabitants with an incredible appetite for fine watches.

Then there are countries where the market will shift depending on what the president says one day and what the banks decide on another day, making the market a challenging but interesting moving target. China, of course, has had its ups and downs with the crackdown on corruption and gifting. But overall, as long as one market is slowing by 10% and another market is up by 10% – provided that they are of the same volume or size – then for the Swiss watch industry, it's neutral news.

**Beyond nationalities, how significant do you believe the opportunity is for complicated women's watches?**

Complications for women are undoubtedly the most challenging and interesting segment. Women, as we naturally understand, constitute 50% of the planet's population, so technically speaking we can tap into this market. We are seeing women's wealth increase, which is great news, obviously not only for the watch market. But there are many, many parameters to be considered in realising this opportunity.

Whether it is that – and I say regrettably – decision-makers in the household are still by a vast majority, male. There is also a question as to the level of interest that women may have towards a mechanical chronograph and mechanical perpetual calendar and a mechanical repeater, versus nice, stylish, practical watches that maybe even have a quantum mix.

I believe when you think of women and their past in the 20th century, how women have started to become CEOs, Prime Ministers, smoking cigars, driving SUVs, drinking scotch or joining the army, society is indeed changing. And the interests of women are changing, which I conclude will certainly be reflected in the years to come in their interest in mechanical, complicated watches.

One of the trends I have noticed is that women are looking for bigger watches. It was an absolute faux pas twenty or thirty years ago for a woman to wear a watch that was more than 25 millimetres in size. In fact, watchmakers would compete to be able to produce the smallest mechanical watch, which was also beautiful. Today women are wearing diver's watches, pilot watches, men's watches, as much as they drive Range Rovers and Harley Davidson motorbikes.

I think that the woman's watch as a concept is possibly going to be revived. Of course, nature will continue to suggest women's watches need to be smaller due to its own definition, a lady's wrist is smaller, but women also like SUVs for practical reasons, for status, for security. In watches, many women say, "Well, on the watch I inherited from my grandmother I couldn't even read the time. It's too small."

Sometimes maybe it's just that we need, as an example, an Oprah Winfrey to tell the world in her TV show that she's fascinated by wearing a mechanical split-second chronograph, and we may see that next week that women buy such a watch. Sometimes you just need that trigger. But eventually it will happen. I'm absolutely sure.

**And what about millennials? How can Haute Horlogerie engage the next generation of luxury consumers?**

I agree that Haute Horlogerie is a baby boomer market. There have been no world wars in some years, growth has continued despite a few bumps and hiccups, but overall the world population has been allowed to discover and enjoy the beautiful things in life. Travel is one of them. Art is another. 200 years ago, it was only the elite who could even consider such luxuries.

Today, art is something that has become much more democratic and accessible. You don't need to be a professor in art history to afford or enjoy art, nor a billionaire. Watches are no exception. Even though in hindsight we call it Haute Horlogerie, a wristwatch 50 years ago was not a collector's item.

For the moment, the baby boomers will support this market. But what is the next generation going to do? The next generation may not even want a mechanical wristwatch. They may want an Apple watch. They may want no watch at all and say, "My mobile phone in my pocket is actually doing everything that the grand complication of my grandfather is doing."

This is a challenge. This is a real challenge. I think the watch industry will survive despite the challenges and attacks from new gadgets and new time-telling devices. When you look at wine it is a unique beverage in the sense it does not address thirst, not like water or sports drinks do. Wines from Bordeaux and Tuscany don't quench thirst yet still they are here today, at the heights of their production because wine is considered culture.

Watches are culture too because it's no longer about time measurement. We all read the time on our dashboard in the car or a clock on the oven or on our smartphones. Instead Haute Horlogerie is an expression of culture and a level of sophistication within society. It is a celebration of beautiful things and an expression of education and savoir-faire..

**Overall, what do you feel are the most pressing challenges the industry is facing?**

First of all I think that Swiss or European high-end watchmaking should look much closer and listen more carefully to the needs of its clients, not just in the short term but also in the long term. An industry driven by immediate goals risks losing sight of the bigger picture., when the immediate goals are market share, sales, shareholder value and growth.

A lot of houses are not sufficiently thinking about what do they need to do in order to be well-positioned vis-à-vis the market in five or ten years from now. They are thinking about how to increase revenue and to perpetuate the stellar performance of the industry over the past decade.

But I believe the industry needs to refocus on sustainability, on sustainable growth, to think beyond the next Baselworld launch or watchmaking competition, Perhaps brands should consider limiting growth, just as has been the strategy of some AAA car manufacturers or famous workshops producing maroquinerie. I know this is not the goal of any businessman, but we need to ensure the longstanding desirability of this non-necessity object, which no-one actually needs, especially not to tell the time.

The industry also needs to understand that year after year, consumers are much better informed and there is almost a demand or need for transparency. Watch manufacturers must realise that the times where you could just cut corners are definitely over in today's world.

That means that they can only adhere to the purest, most diligent, most sincere business practices if they want to create long-term loyalty and cultivate respect from their clients. Once you have decided to spend thousands, tens of thousands, or even hundreds of thousands on a timepiece, it's not just about the product. It's the manufacture, the knowledge, the retail experience and the after sale service.

**In terms of protecting the positioning of a luxury timepiece brand, at what point should growth be officially limited?**

It's an extraordinarily interesting question in my view. Personally, I don't think there should be a limitation to growth even though some brands have, in my view, pushed the limits too far. Volume can endanger the status of a brand but mustn't necessarily. And I say that because in many industries we see very successful examples of managing this balance. If you are a brand and you take your customer very seriously, you can grow without either ruining your image or ruining the idea of being a luxury to your consumer.

Take Rolex as an example, where it is believed that over one-million pieces are manufactured each year. There are official reports that can be found in the industry that confirm the number of chronometers that they have tested each year and the quantity of gold they are consuming for their production. And Rolex, in my view, is taking their client very seriously.

They offer an excellent product. And when consumers purchase their product they understand that they are not just one of a select few. They take their customer very seriously and offer an excellent product, thus they continue to be a luxury brand in my view.

Porsche is another good example in the car industry. It is a brand that remains a 'gold standard' in the industry in terms of quality and performance, despite the fact you will see many of their cars throughout the world. Porsche has really done their homework in terms of managing quality and pricing, alongside innovation and tradition, to show that 'luxury' can be done at numbers that Ferrari or Lamborghini couldn't even consider. So I think it can be achieved.

**Finally, what do you feel are the biggest opportunities facing Haute Horlogerie?**

The ever growing and opening markets in Asia, in South America and in Africa. Africa has not even been tapped in on the surface, in my view. There are an inordinate number of people who have not yet had the pleasure to discovering and explore Haute Horlogerie.

There are many people on the planet and there are many priorities, understandably. But with the markets coming together and communication now being so much easier thanks to the tools we have, I think that the watch industry can expect that the world-wide community will continue to grow, over the coming decade.


And this will be I think, enough growth. The industry must be careful to manage both the old loyal client and the new, and not lose sight of just chasing new markets or generations in the quest for growth. Just like a shepherd must keep together his herd, the watch industry must look after every soul interested in timepieces. By giving them what they deserve and what they rightly can expect.

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#### EDITOR'S PICKS

The Breguet Classique Chronométrie has so much going for it, and in such an understated package. First, Breguet's master watchmaker patented the concept of magnetic pivots on November 9, 2010. The magnetic pivots of this watch not only remove any concerns about magnetism in this movement, but also by incorporating a powerful micro-magnet in each of the two end stones supporting the balance pivots, Breguet has designed a dynamically stable system that re-centers or self-adjusts after a disturbance. The magnetic pivot consists of a carbon-steel balance staff and a "rare-earth" magnet behind each end stone. One of the magnets is stronger than the other so that the balance staff is in permanent contact with the end stone on the dial side and thus appears to be suspended. This allows the watch to be incredibly shock resistant, and precise as well, because the balance is essentially suspended in a magnetic field, thus meaning there is no difference in rate by position of the watch. The 7277 offers a variance of -1 to +3 seconds per day.



On top of the Breguet's incredible magnetic properties, this watch uses experimental silicon components that allow the watch to weigh less, be even more immune to magnetism, be longer lasting, and more flexible. These silicon parts, including silicon balance spring, pallet-levers, and escape wheels, allow Breguet to push the watch to 10 Hz. To put that into perspective, that is double the oscillation rate of the famously high-beat Zenith El Primero. This allows the Breguet to measure a 20th of a second. Further, this Classique Chronometrie contains twin 180° symmetrically deploying balance springs, offering incredible balance on the oscillator and improving precision.

Then, you add all that creative watchmaking into a gorgeous traditional 41 mm x 9.7 mm Breguet case, add a dial with six (yes six!) different patterns of hand guilloché work, throw on a 40,000 CHF price and there you have it folks, the watch that the jury of the 2014 Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève chose as the winner of this year's most important accolade in watchmaking.

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



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## A Word with Aurel Bacs | iW International Watch Magazine



Aurel Bacs had a busy month in November. His firm Bacs & Russo SA was named by Phillips to oversee the formation of a new fine watch department at the London-based auction house's Geneva office. Phillips will now also take charge of the bi-annual Only Watch charity auction, which returns in November 2015 in Geneva. In addition, Bacs just completed his year-long role as head of the jury overseeing the 2014 Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG), which last month announced the year's award winners (see for results).

Prior to all this recent activity, Bacs was the head of the International Watch department at Christie's, where he made a significant impact by expanding the department's annual turnover from \$8 million to more than \$130 million.

iW's Nola Martin recently spoke with Bacs, a twenty-year veteran in the world of horology and armed with an insurmountable amount of knowledge as a watch specialist. He discussed the GPHG voting process and offered insights as to what happens behind closed doors.

### **How do you manage the jury for the GPHG?**

The jury is composed of twenty-four members from sixteen countries gathered in Geneva at the Cite du Temps. We lock the door, the phones have to be off and you cannot communicate with the outside world. Watches that are handed out and everyone is wearing white gloves and has a loupe. Then we, virtually, in a friendly way, argue about the differences so that everyone adds information.

I don't want to say I'm responsible for the jury because a democratic vote is a vote, so it is not my own opinion. But I am there to make sure that what the group really

---

wanted to express is afterward translated into the prizes.

### **What are key elements does the jury look for?**

Is the technical construction innovative, clever, new, better? From a manufacturing side, how well finished is it? Is it a cheap job done in a mass production approach or is it true to craftsmanship, the tradition of finishing a movement? Then you can also comment on the aesthetics of the movement, like a beautiful car engine. Is it a nice piece of engineering? Then you have the case design and the dial design. Then you have to bring the three together like a recipe. Then we also look at the price. We are not giving an award to the most valuable or the cheapest watch but we look at how much product the end consumer receives paying this price for this watch, whether it is a fair proposition or overpriced.



### **Has the GPHG evolved from last year?**

The goal of the GPHG ultimately is to bring everyone in the industry together, like a great sports event. It has to be a get-together. It is not about, in my view, how much

do I personally win if I participate it is about the whole world of watchmaking.

With that in mind, the organizers, the foundation, is in charge of the GPHG and is continuously making every considerable effort to improve and make it a better competition by notably changing the rule to adapt to the 2014 market.

The rules we had for ten years were adapted to the 2004 market, but the 2014 world is a different one. So this year it was probably the most radical change in the competition. Rules included new category prizes for the chronograph, tourbillon, calendar and repeater in order to have watches of the same type of watches compete.

Having said this, it's no surprise that in a perfect world you would have 50 categories. But you have to pool certain types of watches together. The jury is the panel that attributes the prizes, and the better the jury the better the prizes. Meaning the more knowledge they bring to the table and the broader their background, the better. Of course, during the year there is a lot for work behind the scenes to make the next edition better.



Suiza suma poco más de 8.4 millones de habitantes, de los cuales 23% son residentes extranjeros. Es un país que destaca por la cantidad de idiomas que se hablan en él: cuatro lenguas geográficamente distribuidas y una enorme diversidad de dialectos de acuerdo con la región.

**Swiss Made News:** Recientemente se anunció la edición número 14 del Grand Prix ¿qué ha cambiado con respecto a la edición del año pasado?



**Aurel Bacs:** Hicimos un cambio radical en los reglamentos, las categorías y los premios, ya que nuestro deber es mejorar y hacerle justicia al mercado que evoluciona constantemente, a fin de ser más justos, más profesionales y más respetados. El jurado, así como el reglamento, fueron reestructurados parcialmente, y ya se notan los resultados positivos de estos cambios, como por ejemplo el número de relojes participantes, pero sobre todo, de nuevas marcas, lo cual es muy alentador.

**SMN:** La opinión que se tiene con respecto al GPHG es siempre polémica, como en todos los galardones, ¿cómo hacer para evitar los comentarios negativos?

**AB:** Nada en esta vida es perfecto, pero lo peor es estar satisfecho del *status quo*... La solución es escuchar, reflexionar y mejorar, al escuchar, seguimos siendo humildes.

**SMN:** Respecto a la internacionalización de los premios ¿encuentra posibilidades reales de que L'Aiguille d'Or se destine a una marca que no sea suiza?

**AB:** Sí, absolutamente. Tenemos diferentes criterios, como el de la calidad del objeto, y los suizos no se salvan de la competencia.

**SMN:** ¿Cuáles son los criterios tomados en cuenta para evaluar la relojería?

**AB:** ¡La calidad! Ésta se refleja en todos los aspectos de la realización de un reloj, como por ejemplo: la producción, el diseño o su portabilidad.

**SMN:** ¿Cuáles han sido los principales retos que ha enfrentado a lo largo de su gestión en esta organización?

**AB:** Reunir al mejor jurado del mundo y tener su apoyo es un reto que se superó. Teníamos que reunir a un nuevo jurado y establecer otro reglamento, animado por un nuevo espíritu, haciendo cohabitar a personas de 30 a 80 años. ¡Lograr que todo esto se lleve a cabo en una sola noche!

**SMN:** El Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève cuenta con el mayor reconocimiento en su tipo a nivel internacional ¿cuál es la importancia de Suiza en el mundo de la relojería?

**AB:** No podemos negar que Suiza es el epicentro de la relojería. La ciudad de Ginebra soporta en gran medida nuestra infraestructura. Asimismo, podemos disfrutar de la proximidad de las manufacturas relojeras y de la facilidad para visitarlas. El GPHG resplandece en todos los sentidos.

**SMN:** Tanto el Cantón de Ginebra como el de Neuchâtel, son dos sitios privilegiados en la construcción de guardatiempos ¿qué diferencias y similitudes encuentra entre estas dos regiones?

**AB:** Son esencialmente las circunstancias históricas las que llevaron hasta Ginebra a los "hugonotes". París y Milán siguen siendo a la moda, lo que Ginebra es a la relojería.

**SMN:** Durante los últimos tres años se ha catalogado a la innovación por encima de la tradición relojera. Por ejemplo, el DB28 de De Bethune, el Mikrogirder de TAG Heuer o el Escape Constante de Girard-Perregaux ¿Considera usted que éste es el rumbo de las decisiones del jurado hacia futuro?

**SMN:** México es un lugar que alberga a un número considerable de colecciónistas de alta relojería ¿qué opinión tiene usted de este país y de su importancia para la relojería suiza?

**AB:** Tuve el privilegio de conocer a un gran número de colecciónistas apasionados de la relojería, y me sorprendió su amplio conocimiento y su atención al detalle.

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## GRANDE PRÊMIO DE RELOJOARIA DE GENEVRA 2014

Este é o 14º Grande Prêmio de Relojaria de Genebra. O evento, que ocorria sempre em meados do mês de novembro, desta vez foi antecipado para o dia 31 de outubro e o local continua sendo o Grande Teatro de Genebra.

Nos últimos anos, o número de categorias vêm sendo ampliado e modificado. Em 2012 eram sete, em 2013 foram acrescentadas mais três, totalizando dez, e em 2014 passaram a ser 12. Na realidade, foram suprimidas três categorias: grande complicações (grand complications), relógios masculinos com complicações

e inovação, mas foram acrescentadas cinco: cronógrafo, turbilhão, calendário, dispositivo de som (gongo, que é só obtido por meio mecânico e não por meio eletrônico) e mecânica de exceção. A categoria inovação passou a fazer parte das categorias especiais, que antes eram cinco e passaram a ser sete.

Essas alterações se devem à maior segmentação do mercado consumidor, com destaque para o público feminino, e também ao desenvolvimento tecnológico, o que permite o surgimento de novas marcas de relógios e maior foco em determinadas complicações feitas pelas marcas existentes. Por exemplo, relógio com cronógrafo, cujas funções estão entre as comuns de todos os relógios, passou a ser considerada uma categoria especial, relógio inovação (Innovation Watch). Um relógio que reinterpreta o relógio de pulso de forma inovadora (GPHG) e faz todo o sentido. Existe uma variedade muito grande de cronógrafos e a comparação com relógios esportivos não era muito apropriada. Assim, sendas as categorias passam a ser as seguintes: femininos, femininos com complexidades mecânicas, masculinos, turbilhão, cronógrafo, calendário, som de gongo (sonnerie), mecânico de exceção, religios-jóias (trabalho artístico (métiers d'art)), religios esportivos e pequeno ponteiro (petite aiguille).

O júri irá atribuir um total de 19 prêmios, sendo 12 para as categorias acima e mais sete destinados às categorias especiais: relógio inovação (Innovation Watch), um relógio que reinterpreta o relógio de pulso de forma inovadora (GPHG) e faz todo o sentido. Existe uma variedade muito grande de cronógrafos e a comparação com relógios esportivos não era muito apropriada. Assim, sendas as categorias passam a ser as seguintes: femininos, femininos com complexidades mecânicas, masculinos, turbilhão, cronógrafo, calendário, som de gongo (sonnerie), mecânico de exceção, religios-jóias (trabalho artístico (métiers d'art)), religios esportivos e pequeno ponteiro (petite aiguille).

O júri é multidisciplinar, composto por jornalistas do segmento, colecionadores, historiadores, militares, expositores e representantes comerciais das marcas. Todos os membros do júri têm relação direta ou indireta com a relojaria. Em 2013, o júri contou com 21 pessoas; este é mais do que em 2012, e agora, em 2014, são 25.

O prêmio máximo do evento é o Ponteiro de Ouro (Aiguille d'Or), que representa o relógio mais votado entre as 12 categorias. A marca que recebe essa distinção não pode participar do evento do ano seguinte, mas seu presidente é convidado para fazer parte do júri daquele ano.

Os relógios premiados são exibidos internacionalmente em uma turnê ao redor de vários países previamente escolhidos pelos organizadores do evento.

Especial

Em 2014 concorreram 228 relógios nas 12 categorias, dos quais foram pré-selecionados 72 modelos. Em cada uma das 12 categorias foram pré-selecionados apenas seis relógios. Na categoria relógios masculinos, por exemplo, havia 22 peças, que se submeteram à pré-seleção, e na categoria Sonnerie, apenas seis. Uma mesma marca pode concorrer em uma ou em todas as categorias.

As marcas com mais relógios concorrendo este ano foram Breguet, Chopard, Bulger e Bovet. Todas as seis peças submetidas pela Breguet, por exemplo, foram pré-selecionadas, o que confirma a alta qualidade e a expertise nas confecções dos relógios da marca.

Em minha opinião, o resultado do júri teve algumas surpresas, embora, na maioria dos casos, mercêdes.

No categoria cronógrafo, o modelo apresentado pela marca De Bethune foi o vencedor, não obstante a participação de dois concorrentes de peso, a Chopard e a Zenith, que são especialistas em relógios cronográficos. Contudo, veremos no decorrer do texto desta matéria que a De Bethune realmente surpreendeu positivamente o júri. Outra surpresa foi na categoria Turbilhão, cujo vencedor foi da Girard-Perregaux, uma pequena marca de relógios holandeses e focada em peças exclusivas. Entretanto, o modelo da Montblanc Villeret, Eco Tourbillon Retrograde, nos pareceu ser o mais original nessa categoria. Uma terceira surpresa foi na categoria Sonnerie, cujo vencedor foi um modelo da Hublot. Acreditemos que o modelo Sopra-no, da Christophe Claret, com quatro sons de catedral, turbilhão e repetição de minutos será imbatível.

A marca Breguet foi duplamente premiada. Dos seus seis modelos submetidos e pré-selecionados, um deles recebeu o prêmio maior, o Aiguille d'Or e outro recebeu o maior número de votos do público (Pulso Prize).

Também a marca Unewerk foi duplamente premiada, nas categorias Mecânica de Execução e Inovação, como o modelo BMC.



AIGUILLE D'OR.

O prêmio máximo, Aiguille d'Or, foi conferido ao modelo Classique Chronométrie, da Breguet.

O mecanismo do relógio é baseado em pivots magnéticos. Curiosamente, o magnetismo, uma das forças da natureza que causam distúrbios no movimento regular das peças metálicas mais sensíveis dos relógios mecânicos, torna-se um aliado nesta nova concepção da marca Breguet. Sóis dobrados equipados com micromagnetas que mantêm a roda do balanço extremamente centrada e continuamente autoajustada no seu eixo gravitacional. Dessa forma, a roda do balanço mantém-se praticamente insensível à atração ou força da gravidade, mas resistente a eventuais choques mecânicos de baixa intensidade, proporcionando uma marcha muito mais estável do relógio. A taxa de pre cisão do Classique Chronométrie 7777 está entre -1 e +3 segundos por dia, enquanto que o Controle Officiel Suisse de Chronométrie (COSC) exige entre -4 e +6 segundos/dia. O escapamento produz uma energia equivalente a 830 microvoltas, enquanto que os melhores relógios cronometrados estão entre 300 e 400 microvoltas. Todas essas inovações estão protegidas por seis patentes registradas pela Breguet.

A revista Pulso, em sua edição de número 88, publicou uma matéria exclusivamente sobre esse modelo de Breguet por ocasião de seu lançamento na Feira de Basileia 2013.

### FEMININOS

Breguet — Hora descentralizada

O ponto forte desse relógio de marca mais antiga do mundo é o mostrador em madrepérola na cor azul-clara, encrustado pavimentado com brilhantes e ponteiros de horas e de minutos delicados do centro. A escolha do ponteiro de segundos em formato retrograde não poderia ter sido melhor, proporcionando um visual mais leve do conjunto. A caixa com 36,8 mm de diâmetro pode ser em ouro rosa, ouro branco ou aço. Na versão com caixa de aço, o mostrador é branco e não de madrepérola. O aro é cravejado de brilhantes de forma muito original, sugerindo dois semicírculos. O fundo do relógio é protegido por cristal de safira e a massa oscilante do automático possui o formato de uma flor com cinco pétalas. O movimento mecânico automático tem reserva de marcha para até 72 horas.



FEMININOS COM COMPLEXIDADE MECÂNICA Christophe Claret — Margot

Christophe Claret é um dos relojeiros mais conhecidos. Há 25 anos sua empresa, localizada em Le Locle, um dos berços da relojaria suíça, vem criando e desenvolvendo mecanismos altamente complexos para diversas marcas. O modelo feminino Margot tem uma complicação especial. Ao pressionar o botão na posição das 2 horas, um som cristalino soa e em seguida uma ou duas pétalas de flor margarida desaparecem. As pétalas são de titânio com acabamento acetinado; em uma janela no mostrador, na posição das 4 horas, irá surgir uma resposta à seguinte questão: ele me amá? A resposta virá expressa no idioma francês. A resposta é imprevisível, pois existem cinco opções e uma delas é escolhida aleatoriamente pelo engenhoso mecanismo: "un peu" (um pouco), "beaucoup" (muito), "passionnément" (paixonidamente), "à la folie" (bucaneiro) e, finalmente, "pas du tout" (nem um pouco).

Essa complicação pode ser repetida pressionando o botão na posição das 4 horas, que faz o dispositivo interno voltar à sua posição inicial.

No mostrador em madrepérola azul-clara estão incertos ou gravados trechos de versos de Victor Hugo (1802-1885), o célebre escritor francês, conhecido por suas obras Os Misérables e Notre-Dame de Paris. A caixa do relógio, com 42,5 mm de diâmetro, pode ser de ouro branco ou rose. O aro é revestido com brilhantes ou diamantes tipo baguette ou redondos e menores. Sóis, portanto, quatro opções. O movimento é automático, com 72 horas de reserva de marcha e dois tumbos de corda. Série limitada a 20 exemplares em cada uma das quatro opções. Preço ao público: 278 mil francos suíços.

**MASCULINOS**

Urban Jørgensen &amp; Sonner – Central Second

A marca de origem dinamarquesa lançou este modelo com uma nova variação de seu calibre proprietário UJS-7B, que foi o primeiro relógio de pulso de batimento com trava (funcionamento por escamamento) ou ponteiro de segundos saltante. A UJS consegue superar o obstáculo de maior sensitividade a choques mecânicos nesse tipo de escamamento.

No Central Second, o ponteiro de segundos completa um segundo a cada três saltos, menos que nos relógios mecânicos convencionais, e é mais preciso, pois o órgão regulador recebe um único impulso em vez de dois, como no sistema com âncora.

O relógio possui as funções de horas, minutos, segundos e indicação de reserva de marcha para 72 horas na posição das 12 horas. O movimento é mecânico a corda manual. A caixa com 42 mm de diâmetro pode ser de ouro rosa ou platina e seu fundo é protegido por cristal de safira. O preço ao público é de 49 mil francos suíços.

**CRONÓGRAFO**

De Bethune – DB 29 Medichrono Tourbillon

O cronógrafo De Bethune é realmente muito interessante. Segundo a marca, localizada na pequena cidade de Sainte-Croix, no castelo de Vaud (Suíça), a concepção e o desenvolvimento do relógio exigiram seis anos de pesquisas.

O DB29 é uma peça com uma única coroa que serve para mover tanto o cronógrafo, carregar a corda e realizar o acerto das horas e minutos. A caixa redonda, em ouro rosa mede 46 mm de diâmetro e 11,7 mm de espessura.

O mostrador possui cinco ponteiros centrais, dois para horas e minutos e três para o cronógrafo, isto é, contagem para 60 segundos, 60 minutos e 24 horas, na verdade, 23 horas, 59 minutos e 59,9 segundos. O movimento mecânico, com preçado cronometria, tem carregamento de corda manual e trabalha com uma frequência de 36 mil oscilações/hora. A engenharia adotada para esse cronógrafo complexo exigiu três rodas de coluna.

O tourbillon, cuja rotação completa dura 30 segundos, é feito de titânio e aço, possui 63 componentes e pesa apenas 0,18 grama. O movimento e o tourbillon podem ser observados pelo fundo do relógio em titânio protegido por cristal de safira. Uma tampa de ouro rosa que se abre como nos antigos relógios de bolso protege o fundo do relógio. Edição limitada a 20 exemplares, com preço de 270 mil francos suíços.

**TURBILHÃO**

Grindfeld Parallel – Tourbillon

Os irmãos Bert e Tim Grindfeld, atual proprietários da marca, descendem de John Grindfeld, que iniciou sua atividade de relojoeiro em 1912 na antiga cidade de Oldenzaal, na Holanda, uma minúscula vila particularmente conhecida por suas fábricas de relógios. As duas irmãs criaram sua própria marca de relógios, em 2008, os irmãos trabalharam para algumas fábricas suíças e adquiriram a experiência necessária para construir peças mais completas.

O modelo Parallel Tourbillon possui as seguintes complicações: horas, minutos (círculo na posição das 1 horas), segundos (pontoiro contínuo), tourbillon (one minute flying tourbillon), indicador de reserva de marcha para até 72 horas em um semicírculo na posição das 11 horas e mais outro indicador na posição das 4 horas com um pontoiro menor. Nesse semicírculo existem duas letres W (winding) ou S (setting). Quando se deseja acertar as horas (setting), o círculo é pressionado, o pontoiro move-se em direção à letra S e o procedimento pode ser realizado. Pressionando-o novamente a coroa, o pontoiro muda sua direção para W e a coroa pode ser girada para o carregamento da corda, se necessário, observando-se a posição do pontoiro do indicador de reserva de marcha. A caixa em ouro rosa em aço mede 43,5 mm de diâmetro por 12,5 mm de espessura; o movimento é mecânico, com carregamento de corda manual. Na versão em ouro rosa, edição é limitada a 28 peças e o preço é de 167.250 francos suíços.

**CALENDÁRIO**

A. Lange &amp; Söhne – Richard Lange Perpetual Calendar "Terrestrial"

Com mostrador tipo Regulatimer, em que o ponteiro de horas e o de minutos não estão sobrepostos ou fixados no mesmo eixo, esse novo modelo reúne nove funções, das quais sete são consideradas complicações: horas, minutos, segundos, dia do mês, dia de semana, mês, ano, reserva de marcha, fases da lua e calendário perpétuo. As funções de calendário não são independentes.

O mecanismo é a complicações fases da lua são vistas inverso do relógio protegido por cristal de safira. Além das fases da lua, programadas diariamente, é mostrada a localização da lua em relação ao sol e em relação à terra através de três círculos sobrepostos formando um diagrama. O carregamento do relógio é feito pelo novo movimento de A. Lange & Söhne, é tão preciso que o consumo de um dia (o mês lunar sólido possui 29 dias, que é um dia a mais) é menor que o consumo de 12,68 anos!

Dois tambores de corda permitem 14 dias de reserva de marcha com dispositivo de energia constante (constânteforça). O movimento é mecânico com carregamento de corda manual a 21.600 oscilações/hora. Com caixa em titânio ou em ouro rosa (18K Gold), ligas de ouro rosa com 5% de platina) medindo 45 mm de diâmetro, o relógio possui o mecanismo a corda manual calibre HUB 8001 e reserva de marcha para cinco dias ou até 120 horas.

**RELÓGIOS-JÓIAS**

Bulgari – Diagono High Jewellery Emeralds

Este modelo é uma referência aos anéis dourados do cinema italiano, entre 1950 e 1960, a chamar de DolceVita, na qual o cinema com suas divas e a famosa casa joalheira situada na Via Condotti, em Roma, eram inseparáveis.

O relógio é de pequenas dimensões e com movimento movido a quartzo, possui somente as funções de horas e minutos. O mostrador está pavimentado com minidiamantes, a caixa e a pulseira são de ouro branco. Esmeraldas e diamantes em diferentes formatos compõem o conjunto da peça. Preço: 620 mil francos suíços.

**MECÂNICO DE EXCITAÇÃO**

Urwerk – EMC

EMC significa controle eletromedicina (Electro Mechanical Control).

Segundo a marca, é o primeiro relógio mecânico de alta precisão em que o tempo pode ser monitorado pelo usuário por meio de um toque no painel que substitui o mostrador convencional. Possui apenas as funções de horas, minutos e segundos. O mecanismo é a corda manual com reserva de marcha para aproximadamente 80 horas ou pouco mais de três dias. A caixa em aço e aço inoxidável mede 43 mm de largura por 15,8 mm de comprimento e tem espessura de 11,8 mm. O preço para o consumidor é de 118 mil francos suíços.

**RELÓGIO TRABALHO ARTÍSTICO**

Voutilainen – High

Karl Voutilainen é um relojoeiro finlandês que migrou para a Suíça em 1987 para especializar-se na restauração de relógios antigos com complicações. Na famosa VWOtter – Watchmakers of Switzerland Training and Education Program.

High em japonês significa: alta, a conhecida pedra emeraldina de coloração verde. O trabalho artístico no mostrador e na parte do movimento mecânico foi realizado por um dos maiores estúdios de arte com leia do Japão, o Urayan. A arte usada leva 4 mil artista a remonta ao período Edo ou Tokugawa, quando o Japão era governado pelos sengens ou comandantes de exercícios, entre 1603 e 1868. Requer centenas de horas de trabalho a paciência, como foi o caso deste, encomendado pelo mestre-relojoeiro. A caixa do relógio é de platina e mede 29 mm de diâmetro e 11,55 mm de espessura. O movimento é mecânico com carregamento de corda manual e reserva de marcha para até 65 horas, insinuadamente fabricado nas oficinas de Karl Voutilainen. Foi produzida apenas uma única peça com preço de 225 mil francos suíços.





**RELOJOS ESPORTIVOS**  
Zarath – El Primero Lightweight

Esta é uma versão moderna da linha de cronógrafos El Primero lançada em junho de 1969. Na época, o calibre tinha o código 3019 PHC. É considerado um dos cronógrafos automáticos mais confiáveis e precisos. Durante alguns anos foi utilizado pelo Relógio seu famoso Daytona, até que a marca desmobilizou seu próprio calibre para substituí-lo, o 4130.

A caixa, com 45 mm de diâmetro, é feita de carbono, com alta resistência e leveza. Alguns dos componentes do movimento são de silício e titânio, o que reduz em 25% o peso total do calibre 4009 em comparação ao calibre usado em outros modelos da coleção El Primero. O calibre 4009 é o mais leve na sua categoria, com apenas 15,9 g.

A pulseira é de borracha especial com revestimento de um tecido sintético desenvolvido pela DuPont.

#### PEQUENO PONTEIRO Seiko – Grand Seiko Hi-Beat 36.000 GHT

A linha Grand Seiko foi lançada no Japão em dezembro de 1960 com linhas clássicas e movimentos mecânicos de boa qualidade. Com o advento dos relógios a quartzo, a própria Seiko foi uma das empresas que deu maior ênfase à produção desse tipo de relógio. Por 26 anos, de 1972 a 1997, a produção da coleção da Grand Seiko ficou relegada aos movimentos a quartzo e somente em 1998 os movimentos mecânicos voltaram com os calibres 955.

De lá para cá, a linha Grand Seiko com movimentos automáticos foi evoluindo a ponto de os calibres 95 serem reconhecidos como alguns dos melhores existentes. Entre esses calibres, destaca-se o 9986, com 36.000 oscilações/hora (5 Hz), utilizado no modelo vencedor na categoria Pequeno Ponteiro (Petit Aiguille), atribuído ao melhor relógio com preço inferior a 8 mil francos suíços. A Seiko afirma que a variação é entre -3 e +5 segundos/dia, a qual pode ser considerada boa.

O Grand Seiko Hi-Beat 36.000 GHT, referência SBGJ005, possui além das horas, minutos, segundos e dia do mês a função GHT (pontoiro menor na cor amarela). Caixa em aço com 40 mm de diâmetro, coroa ressequida, resistente a até 100 metros. O mostrador é na cor verde com visor de cristal de safira e pulseira de aço com fecho de segurança. Este também é fundido com mostrador na cor preta e ponteiro da função GHT na cor vermelha.

##### INovação Urwerk – EMC (é apresentado na categoria Mecânica de Exceção)



##### PÚBLICO Breguet – Classique Dame 9068

O modelo tem caixa em ouro branco com aro e hastas ornados com brilhantes. É bastante discreto e elegante, com funções de horas, minutos, segundos (ponteiros analógicos tipo Breguet central) e dia do mês. O mostrador é tratado com índices em algarismos românicos e o movimento é mecânico automático, com reserva de marcha para até 38 horas. Preço: 25,9 mil francos suíços.



##### ESPECIAL DO JÓU

Walter Lange, hoje com 86 anos, talvez seja um dos últimos renomados da dinastia Lange. Fundada por Ferdinand Adolf Lange em 1845 e que deu origem à mais prestigiada marca de relógios alemã, a A. Lange & Söhne, que hoje pertence ao grupo suíço Richemont. Walter Lange é herdeiro do fundador e teve uma participação relevante na recomeçada da marca — cuja sede fica em Glashütte, na Sächsia —, logo após a queda do muro de Berlim.



##### RESIDÊNCIA Omega – Speedmaster Dark Side of the Moon

Caixa inteiramente de cerâmica negra com 44,25 mm de diâmetro e mostrador feito de óxido de zircônio, o modelo é uma homenagem ao relógio criado a pedido da Nasa e usado pelos astronautas que fizeram parte do programa Apollo entre 1968 e 1972. Sobre o aro de cerâmica da caixa foi adicionada a incomum escala taquímetrica da coleção Speedmaster, feita de óxido de cromo e níquel (Cr-Ni), formando um material extremamente duro e resistente à corrosão. O movimento mecânico é o 9300 Co-Axial com roda de coluna (column wheel).

##### MELHOR ESTUDANTE NA ESCOLA DE RELOJOARIA DE GENEbra

O prêmio, uma bolsa de estudos, é concedido ao melhor estudante no primeiro ano de estudos na Escola de Relojaria de Genebra pelo patrocinador do evento.

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

# Breguet Classique Chronometrie wins watchmaking's top prize

The top prize at the [Grand Prix d'Horlogerie d'Genève \(GPHG\)](#), watchmaking's highest awards, has been awarded to the Breguet Classique Chronométrie.

If right now you're thinking "Oh, like the Oscars of watchmaking?" - stop! But yes, sort of. There are prizes for everything from diamond-studded ladies watches to no-nonsense sport watches to high complications.

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But the Aiguille d'Or (or "Golden Hand") is reserved for the most impressive watch across all categories.

The GPHG was established in 2001 as a way to promote watchmaking worldwide. While it is based in Geneva, Switzerland, and in fact the City of Geneva and the Canton of Geneva are both founding members of the supporting foundation, the

competition is not limited to Swiss watches, and an exhibition of each year's competitors travels the world as a touring exhibition before the winners are announced.

These winners are chosen by a diverse 25-person jury that consists of auction veterans, working watchmakers, journalists, designers, watch collectors, retailers, and even the odd watch-loving celebrity such as John Mayer.

The Classique Chronométrie looks every bit the part of a classic Breguet watch. It has the fluted caseband, the guilloché dial, and the open-tipped hands that are even named for the French watchmaker.

But under the hood is where things get really interesting: A magnetic pivot system replaces the typical bearings for the balance, creating a nearly frictionless environment. To make this possible, the double balance spring and escape wheel must be made from silicon, a non-magnetic material. That this whole thing beats at 10 Hz - more than twice the speed of most watches - is absolutely insane.

Truly answering the question "What's the best watch?" is impossible. But no one could fault you for answering "the Breguet Classique Chronométrie".

Congratulations to Breguet, who, on Friday October the 31st took out watchmaking's top prize, the 'Aiguille d'Or' ('golden hand' in French) at the 14th Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève (GPHG) for the Classique Chronométrie. Champagne!



The Breguet Classique Chronométrie: "It is absolutely insane," says Forbes.

This 14th edition of the GPHG had record levels of participation with representation from all the major watchmaking groups as well as a number of independents. There are multiple categories, but the hand of the king, sorry (too much Game of Thrones) the golden hand, is reserved for the what is judged to be the best watch across all categories. The Federal Councillor Johann Schneider-Ammann officially presented this prize on-stage, taking the moment to praise "the vitality of the Swiss watch industry."



You can tell this guy was excited. The GPHG was Jointly hosted by Mélanie Winiger and Frédéric Beigbeder, the ceremony was attended by around 1,500 guests.

The GPHG was established in 2001 as a way to showcase the best of the luxury watch industry. While it is based in Geneva, the competition is open to watches made all over the world. 

The Classique Chronométrie was not a controversial choice; to quote Forbes, “it is absolutely insane.” From the outside it’s vintage Breguet, with many hallmarks including a guilloché dial and open-tipped ‘Breguet hands’ that are actually named for the French watchmaker. The hint that there is a modern twist lies in the racy italicized ‘10 Hz’ under the nameplate and in the patent declaration visible through the clear case back.



Classically handsome looks on the outside but some serious technological watchmaking brawn under the dial where magnets are used in the endstones of the balance staff keeping it in place and pulling it back upright when it is displaced by shocks. The balance staff actually 'floats' at the bottom, as you can see in this pic.



The watch beats at an astonishing 10 Hz – more than twice the speed of most watches.

Breguet's ongoing tradition of innovation is clearly alive and well!

## NEWS: The GPHG 2014 winners, explained

For the last 14 years, the watch industry has congregated in Geneva to celebrate the most innovative, most beautiful and generally the best watches of the year, across a number of categories. This event is called the [Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève](#), and the awards are decided by a jury of 25 experts including luminaries from watchmaking, retail, history, journalism and even [the odd celebrity](#). They are flown to Geneva some time late in October to assess the 72 best watches of the year. It's an event where the industry celebrates the hard work of watchmakers all over the world and spots up-and-coming trends.

It's kind of big deal.

If you're wondering why each piece won their category, a quick read of this **GPHG EXPLAINER** should fix it. If there's one take home lesson you should take from this years GPHG it is just how much breadth and diversity there is in the watch industry – and this is very much a good thing.



**“Aiguille d’Or” Grand Prix: Breguet, Classique Chronométrie**

This classically looking piece from Breguet, the masters of traditional watchmaking holds a high tech secret (check out here for the full story), and this watch winning the top prize (the Golden Hand) confirms their place at the top of the horology food chain.



**Ladies' Watch Prize: Blancpain, Women Off-centred Hour**

The Ladies watch selections represented a very broad field, and this beautiful Blancpain represents a balanced winner – with just the right combination of beauty, technique and mechanical know how. A solid winner in a tough pack.



**Men's Watch Prize: Urban Jürgensen & Sonner, Central Second**

Urban Jürgensen and Sonner are perhaps one of the finest watchmakers you've never heard of, and it beat tough competition from the likes of industry favourites MB&F and crowd favourites Tudor. It's very much a mens' watch of yesteryear with beautiful teardrop lugs and elegant guilloche dial. A well deserved winner.



**Ladies' High-Mech Watch Prize: Christophe Claret, Margot**

Christophe Claret have proven that women don't just want diamonds and quartz convenience with their timepieces. Claret designed the watch and it's unique melodic striking complication explicitly for women, rather than just rebranding a mens' watch. A clear winner.



**Chronograph Watch Prize: De Bethune, DB29 Maxichrono Tourbillon**

The De Bethune was a popular pick to win this year, it's a classically styled mono pusher that eschews traditional subdials and is packed with technical virtuosity and, furthermore, made by a brand beloved by horological cognoscenti. Plus it looks gorgeous.



Tourbillon Watch Prize: Grönefeld, Parallax Tourbillon

It was great to see the Dutch Grönefeld brothers get a win in this prestigious category with their technically and aesthetically masterful Parallax – and we suspect that the high-end independent's name will only continue to rise.



Calendar Watch Prize: A. Lange & Söhne, Richard Lange Perpetual Calendar "Terraluna"

The A. Lange & Söhne Terraluna is a bloody beautiful beast of a watch. It was another tough category with excellent watches including the much talked about Moenblanc perpetual calendar – but there was no resisting the power of the big German. (By the way, pardon the not at all #humblebrag, but we totally called it first.)

With more than 1,500 guests in attendance and hosted by former Miss Switzerland winner Melaine Winiger and French writer, literary critic, and TV presenter Frédéric Beigbeder, this year's international jury awarded 16 prizes to watchmakers demonstrating supreme excellence and expertise in the field of watchmaking. Presented on-stage by the Federal Councillor Johann Schneider-Ammann, Breguet was given the "Aiguille d'Or" award for the Classic Chronométrique model. The Ladies' Watch Prize went to Blancpain's Women Off-centred Hour, while the men's watch prize was awarded to Urban Jürgensen & Sonner for its Central Second model.
